- 1. Has this project been previously approved? No
- 2. What is the purpose of the project? 1) (a) \$750,000 Upgrade server room to a standard that will accommodate our current and 3-5 year requirements including upgrading our current cabling plant in the server room, installing and relocating electrical circuits and lights, wiring for and installing a server room UPS and installing an air conditioning system. (b) Continue ProLaw deployment integrating document management functionality of the ProLaw case management system to improve work process and information flow; and (c) obtain a Security Audit; 2) \$300,000 Identify and deploy an e-discovery solution for civil litigation and Public Records Act matters involving a few pages to hundreds of thousands of pages of non-electronic and electronic records. The e-discovery solution would be used for all or some of the following discovery-related tasks: (a) identification, (b) preservation and collection, (c) processing, review, and analysis, (d)

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production, and (e) presentation. Deploying an e-discovery solution will involve purchasing hardware (including servers, desktop computers with substantial processing and memory capabilities, and large-volume scanners) and software licenses to collect, process, review, organize, redact, and produce records; 3) \$200,000 - To improve the accuracy, performance and accessibility of the State of Alaska Statute and Regulations database.

Upgrade or enhancement to existing department capabilities? Yes - Will continue deployment of our case management system and increase the Department's technology capacity.

- 4. Specifically, what hardware, software, consulting services, or other items will be purchased with this expenditure? (Include a line item breakdown.)
 - 1. Upgrade to environmentals (i.e. power and cooling) \$150.0
 - 2. Consulting services to provide assistance with the deployment of document management \$500.0
 - 3. Consulting services to develop a security audit and continuity of operations plan \$100.0
 - 4. Enhancements to the search engine used on BASIS. \$200.0
 - 5. Software and equipment to deploy an electronic discovery tool. 300.0
- **5.** How will service to the public measurably improve if this project is funded? Improve accessibility and simplify the use of the State of Alaska Statue and Regulations database.
- 6. Does project affect the way in which other public agencies will conduct their business? It should improve the current processes for completing public records requests and legal discovery and when conducting investigations.

Improve the performance and accessibility of the State of Alaska Statue and Regulations database.

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7. What are the potential out-year cost implications if this project is approved? (Bandwidth requirements, etc.) E-Discovery solution should benefit all departments as the state continues its efforts to comply with Public Records Act requests, legal discovery and investigations by making these processes more efficient. These projects will utilize some bandwidth mainly between Juneau and Anchorage.

8. What will happen if the project is not approved? Law will continue to fall further behind the technology curve. Without an e-discovery solution the State could be penalized for failing to properly respond to public records requests and in litigation.

Without the requested server room improvements the department will be unable to meet the requirements of projects already planned.
