Project Description/Justification:

This project funds the replacement and new equipment for Village Public Safety Officers (VPSO).

The Department of Public Safety funds 86 existing VPSO through grants to non-profit organizations and local governments. Until now, state funding only provided for the cost of the positions. Law enforcement equipment was paid for using federal earmark funds. These federal funds are no longer available, and the department is beginning an annual request for state funding to cover VPSO equipment needs. Annual funding is needed to provide the VPSO with basic law enforcement equipment necessary for them to provide service to their communities. Equipment regularly needs replacement because of constant use and normal wear and tear.

The VPSO are first responders in the rural Alaska and this equipment is mission critical.
