**Project Description/Justification:**

In the past this program has been used for special soils drilling analysis requested by the Forest Service in support of the Forest Highway Program, road maintenance for federal-owned roads and paving a state park road for the U.S. Park Service while the department's contractor was paving a state-owned road. This source has been used to construct projects for the Denali Commission, including Pile Bay Road Rehabilitation and Rural Dust Control Demonstration Project.

The majority of this request is for utility-related or non-federal activities. Utility facilities such as sewer and water lines, telephone lines, and natural gas pipelines are placed within the department's right-of-

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way under a permit process. A utility company may request that upgrades to their facilities be incorporated into a state construction project to take advantage of the economies of scale, and to preclude the need to dig up the roadway soon after project completion. The cooperative reimbursable authority is required to allow the department to bill entities for non-federal and non-state participating work.
