## **Project Description/Justification:**

The Dalton Highway Corridor from Fairbanks to Prudhoe Bay is vital to North Slope oil and gas development. This highway is a statewide priority and provides the sole ground transportation link to Alaska's major revenue source. Overland access to these resources is critical to their continued development, to Alyeska Pipeline operation and maintenance and to future gas pipeline construction. Truck traffic is expected to continue to grow as continued oil and gas development requires increasing amounts of drill pipe, materials for production facilities and other supplies. Traffic growth is expected to accelerate significantly with construction of the planned gas pipeline.

Additional authority is being requested per the latest project cost estimate.

The annual GF appropriations are for heavy deferred maintenance (calcium chloride, repair slopes, guardrail replacement, etc) along the entire Dalton route.
