**Brief Summary and Statement of Need:**

This amendment to the Governor's FY12 capital budget adds \$3,500,000 federal funds for a new requested total of \$6,000,000 due to project cost estimate increases. This project will replace the Phelan Creek Bridge #0579 at MP 201 of the Richardson Hwy. The annual bridge inspection concluded the bridge has a low sufficiency rating and is in need of replacement.
