**Project Description/Justification:**

The Department is taking steps to lower life cycle costs and improve pavement management by taking a more active role in pavement management and strategically addressing transportation assets. The pavement at the Bethel airport has low Pavement Condition Index (PCI) scores that are within the "rehabilitate" range. These operational surfaces need to be addressed at this critical airport.
