Detailed Project Description and Justification:

The Moose Pass Sportsman's Club (MPSC) will continue to maintain and operate the Community Hall and provide support to the Moose Pass Volunteer Fire Company (MPVFC) by supporting its utility obligations. The MPVFC will maintain the headquarters with community support. As part of the 2011 State of Alaska funding the community is undergoing a planning process to evaluate securing operational funds including exploring the options of increased dues, creating a service area or becoming a second class city.

The community has under taken two related projects. Continuing on efforts in 2011 the MPVFC is renovating the old DOT highway maintenance property into a headquarters. The community secured State funds and used other community funds to do an exterior renovation in 2011 with a new roof, windows and overhead doors, painting and a start on the interior mechanical. These funds would be used to complete that renovation. Once the building is serviceable the MPFVD will vacate the space presently being occupied in the Moose Pass Community Hall. This space will need to be renovated to allow for the library to expand and create additional space for community functions.

How did the Community select this project as a funding priority?

A Kenai Peninsula Borough Community meeting was held on October 1, 2011 . This project was identified as the communities number one priority. The MPSC approved the request at its October 20, 2011 general meeting. The community has selected renovation of the state building for MPVFC headquarters as its highest priority. It has committed community funds to assist with the completion.

What steps have been taken to date to get this project going?

Land for the Moose Pass Fire Volunteer Company is owned by the State of Alaska and is managed by DNR. In 2011 the Moose Pass Sportsman’s Club submitted an application to DNR for transfer of the property.

If a Community Meeting was conducted, how was it advertised? When and where was it held? Who attended?

Notice of the KPB Community meeting was published in the Peninsula Clarion and the Seward Journal on September 22, and 29, 2011. Notices were posted in various places throughout the community. The meeting was attended by members of the Moose Pass community.

All MPSC meetings are publicly noticed and members notified. These notices are provided by posting at the post office, local store and by mass email. The meeting was held on October 20, 2011 with over 40 people in attendance.

The land for the MPFVC is owned by the State of Alaska and is managed by DNR.
