Detailed Project Description and Justification:

The power lines were first installed 25 years ago and the grid needs to be updated. The winter months in Chignik Lake are harsh and have degraded the power grid over the years. Marsh Creek LLC has recently done an assessment of the power-grid along with the installation of pre-pay ampy meters throughout the community. The state generously provided a \$50,000 grant to secure Marsh Creek LLC services. All the power lines need to be re tensioned and/or replaced along with new transformers. The cost of these improvements are estimated at \$100,000. The village will be paying 25% of this cost and requests assistance for the remaining cost.

Project Timeline:

Due to weather constraints, this project would have to occur during the spring and because funding cannot be expected until July of 2012, the project would be completed in late spring 2013.
