*Funding Details:**Funding request is for \$4,500 to replace the internal equipment of the walk in freezer at Kodiak Senior Center. Original purchase of this freezer was in 1996.***Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

The walk in freezer at the Kodiak Senior Center was purchased in 1996. It is used to store food items for use in the delivery of congregate meals 5 days a week; home delivered meals 7 days a week; and 3 meals a week to each of the island villages. The freezer needs internal repairs in order to keep it another 15 years as this the average length of working internal parts. The outside of the freezer is still in very good shape, so only the internal parts of: condensing unit, unit cooler, sight glass, drier, solenoid and clock are needed. Estimated part costs are \$3,900 with labor costs which include removing old equipment, replacing with and testing new equipment at \$600. The Project would begin with ordering the internal parts after July 1, 2012 with the replacement of new equipment being completed by September 30, 2012.
