Boys & Girls Clubs is a private non-profit corporation in its 45th year of service to Alaskan youth. Boys & Girls Clubs is affiliated with the national organization Boys & Girls Clubs of America and share their commitment to help youth of all backgrounds develop the qualities needed to become responsible citizens and leaders. Boys & Girls Clubs' mission is to empower and inspire the diverse youth of Alaska to realize their full potential by offering them hope, opportunity, and a safe environment in which to grow.

Forty-two Clubs serve over 12,000 young Alaskans each year, and Clubs welcome thousands of visiting families and youth at our community events and Clubhouse activities. Each day, Boys & Girls Clubs help our state's youth by:

- oMentoring children during the peak juvenile crime hours of 3:00 to 6:00 p.m.;
- oUtilizing over 200 professionally-trained youth development staff and enriching our programs with 450 community-minded volunteers;
- oProviding a safe, supervised environment for young people during vulnerable hours; and
- oAddressing key issues such as violence prevention, healthy lifestyles and school and work readiness through outcome-based curricula.
