Project Description/Justification:

The Association of Village Council Presidents has proposed to build a road to connect the Yukon and Kuskokwim Rivers at their closest point. The project is located near Kalskag and lower Kalskag, approximately 90 miles northeast of Bethel on the Kuskokwim River.

The proposed road would include barge fuel and freight hub developments at both terminals, including a fuel hub on the Yukon River that would serve as an all-season Kuskokwim River ice road system in the winter months.

The goal of constructing a Yukon-Kuskokwim transportation corridor is to enhance commerce between the interior or "railbelt" region transport systems and the villages along the Kuskokwim River, including a distribution hub in the City of Bethel.
