1. Assessment of Pacific walrus haul-outs in the face of ice retreat, \$250,000.

- 2. Assessment of wolves in Southeast Alaska, \$250,000.
- 3. Assessment of flying squirrels in Southeast Alaska, \$200,000.
- 4. Assessment of Steller sea lions in the western Aleutians, \$400,000.
- 5. Population structure of Steller sea lions, \$150,000.
- 6. Assess movement of and habitat use by beluga whales in Cook Inlet, \$300,000.

Research toward specific candidate species contributes to the mission of the department to protect, maintain, and improve fish and game resources and manage their use and development in the best interest of the economy and the well-being of the people. Listing of the noted species under the federal ESA has potential impacts to the local harvest of fish, predator and prey species, and/or development activities on adjacent land and waterways. This action will assist the Division of Wildlife Conservation to achieve its performance target of no increase in the number of state-listed threatened or endangered species.

The project would fund existing department staff to complete field work as well as contracting some of the work.
