This project is for corrective and preventative maintenance and improvements at state-owned facilities in locations throughout Alaska. Facilities include both Alaska State Trooper and Alaska Wildlife Trooper posts and aircraft hangars, housing facilities, and evidence storage areas.

Many of the department's facilities are becoming more maintenance-intensive as they age; some facilities are more than 30 years old. Funding for regularly scheduled preventative maintenance, as well for emergency repairs, is essential to keep these facilities useful or even habitable.

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Priorities and cost estimates may need to be changed to accommodate emergency maintenance project not listed, actual project costs, and other considerations.
