## **Project Description/Justification:**

One primary focus of Fairbanks International Airport's (FAI) environmental program is to establish an environmental "baseline" on vacant lease lots to 1) mitigate/eliminate future expense associated with environmental restoration and 2) remediate existing environmental conditions to de-encumber vacant lease lots and generate additional revenue for airport operations. These monies are intended to apply only to those lands where the Airport is identified as the responsible party.

Compliance with the Clean Water, Clean Air and Hazardous Waste Management Acts is required by federal law. Contamination and waste from historical activities and tenant operations must be remediated and/or disposed of properly, in addition to standard ongoing environmental compliance operations. Steps are being taken to reduce future pollution while past contamination is required to be treated. This project contributes to the Department's Mission by reducing injuries, fatalities and property damage and by improving the mobility of people and goods.
