## **Brief Summary and Statement of Need:**

This amendment to the FY2013 Governor's budget deletes the \$1.9 million of authorization for this project. Authorization was added to the FY2012 supplemental budget in order to get the project out to bid and take advantage of the 2012 summer construction season. This project will resurface the existing Glenn Highway trail between Muldoon Road and North Birchwood Loop, construct a wayside at milepost (MP) 8.6, and pave existing parking area at the westbound weigh station, as well as replace the existing pedestrian bridge over Ship Creek (bridge #1402), construct minor realignment of the pathway at the Muldoon Interchange to reduce the pathway grade, and upgrade any curb ramps not meeting current ADA guidelines.
