Brief Summary and Statement of Need:

This is a new FY2013 capital project due to the submission and approval of the new 2012 - 2015 Statewide Transportation Improvements Program (STIP), which occurred after the December 15th release of the Governor's budget. This project will repair, resurface and raise the grade between mileposts (MP) 4-16. The project will include slope flattening at MP 10 and MP 12, realignments at MP 6 and MP 8, grade raise between MP 15-16, and other snow control features.
