Provide passing lanes, widening and realignment as needed to address safety and capacity concerns, and resurface pavement between Anchor Point (milepost 157) and the top of Homer Hill (MP 169). Requested funding is for the Right-of-Way phase of the project.

**Project Description/Justification:**

To maintain the integrity of this roadway, the structural section must be rehabilitated and significant pavement deficiencies must be addressed. Some curve angles will need to be adjusted to improve safety. This is the singular roadway to the lower Kenai Peninsula for all freight and passenger traffic. There is no alternate route so the existing pavement problems and safety issues should be improved as soon as possible.
