Project Description/Justification:

Through legislation, the Pubic Building Fund program was developed identifying the Department of Administration (DOA) as the responsible entity for the care and custody of the stated Buildings. Formerly, the buildings located in Juneau were managed and operated by the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT/PF).

Currently, DOT/PF continues to receive 100% of the allocated state Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) funds annually, and identifies how and where the funds will be distributed. DOA is requesting ADA capital funds similarly be appropriated directly to its budget.
