Detailed Project Description and Justification:

The scope of the Project KWT.U59 included aerial photography and planning mapping but not to a level that would be useful for flood plain planning. It is proposed that this funding combined with additional State funding could provide a product that would be useful to a wide range of construction planning and the regulatory agencies information.

This project will provide a detailed flood plain map of the Kwethluk community with elevations plotted in 1' contours. A detailed map with elevations shown in 1' contours will help agencies planning for construction and the regulatory agencies interested in flood plain management. The current map is based on photography taken in 2007 and does not show the new 12.7 ac sewage lagoon, recent housing construction or the present river bank.

In general the erosion along the south bank of the Kwethluk River at Kwethluk has been about 15' since the 2007 photography/ 2008 map was developed. However, the erosion has not occurring at a uniform rate. The river along lots 1, 2, &3 block 14 and along lots 2, 5, & 6 block 13 has eroded nearly 40' from the bank.

A new high school is in the planning phase and a community wide water and sewer system is under construction. It seems
