Component: Industry Preparedness and Pipeline Operations

Contribution to Department's Mission

Protect public safety, public health and the environment and ensure that producers, transporters and distributors of crude oil and refined oil products prevent oil spills, and are fully prepared materially and financially to clean up spills.

Core Services

- Review and approve oil discharge prevention and contingency plans.
- · Conduct and participate in spill drills to verify by demonstration that regulated operators are in compliance with state response planning requirements.
- Inspect regulated facilities and vessels to provide assistance and to ensure compliance with state spill prevention and Best Available Technology (BAT) requirements.
- Review and approve applications for proof of financial responsibility to ensure that regulated operators have the financial resources to respond to an oil spill and mitigate environmental damage.
- Register oil spill primary response action contractors identified in oil discharge prevention and contingency plans.
- Regulate and provide technical assistance and training to underground storage tank operators and owners to ensure proper tank operation and maintenance and basic spill prevention.
- Certify third party underground storage tank inspectors.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2012

- Reviewed and approved three new exploration contingency plans. Renewed 11 exploration contingency plans, eight new non-crude vessel contingency plans, and three new oil terminal contingency plans, as well as 18 oil terminal contingency plans.
- Reviewed and approved a total of 132 contingency plan amendments.
- Reviewed and approved nontank vessel contingency plan actions, including 117 new plans, 22 renewals, 73 amendments, 45 reinstatements, 61 terminations, and 146 suspensions.
- Reviewed and provided comments regarding proposed revisions to Shell's oil spill response plans in federal waters within the outer continental shelf of the Beaufort Sea and Chukchi Sea.
- Participated in two tabletop exercises sponsored by Shell to address a well blowout in the Chukchi Sea.
- Participated in the Bureau of Safety and Environmental Enforcement's response equipment inspection and deployment verification and attended Shell's response equipment demonstration.
- Conducted inspections of 12 oil terminals and tank farms, 25 oil exploration and production facilities, eight crude oil transmission pipelines, 29 tankers, nine nontank vessels over 400 gross tons, and five tank barges.
- Evaluated 38 oil spill exercises conducted throughout the state involving oil terminals and tank farms, oil exploration and production facilities, crude oil transmission pipelines such as the Trans-Alaska Pipeline System, crude and non-crude tankers, tank barges, nontank vessels, and the Alaska Railroad.
- Reduced the number of underground storage tanks without registration tags to 75 out of 1,080 active tanks and reviewed inspection reports for 254 tanks; of those tanks, 241 received registration tags.
- Ensured repair of 68 underground storage tanks not in Significant Operational Compliance resulting in inspection of 254 tanks and placing 41 tanks on Leak Detection Probation.
- Developed a new data collection template to capture pertinent spill data to be integrated into a new database structure.

- Initiated a project to update the North Slope Spill Analysis to include two additional years of data.
- Reviewed historic spill information to identify indicators of past events to evaluate the integrity of the oil
 infrastructure in the future.
- Continued to participate in industry testing of a new prototype skimmer system.
- Sponsored a widely attended Pipeline Leak Detection Technology Conference in September 2011 and issued final report in March 2012.
- Conducted oversight of corrosion monitoring programs for North Slope oil fields under the State's charter agreements with North Slope operators.
- Conducted engineering reviews and visual inspections of 78 North Slope flow lines with a total of approximately 158 miles.
- Initiated engineering reviews of 25 buried flow lines, covering approximately 15 miles, on the Kenai Peninsula.
- Issued certifications for seven primary response action contractors.
- Issued financial responsibility certificates to 514 nontank vessels, 351 underground storage tanks, and 275 tank vessels, tank barges, oil exploration and production facilities, oil terminals, and crude oil transmission pipelines.
- Issued ten Notices of Violation.
- Monitored federal rulemakings that could potentially affect state regulatory activities, including the United States Department of Transportation's proposal to expand their regulatory boundary of low stress pipelines in rural areas and the United States Coast Guard nontank vessel response plan regulations.

Key Component Challenges

The Industry Preparedness and Pipeline Operations Program will continue to review the Department's regulations to identify areas where the contingency planning process may be improved. The Program will implement proposed actions resulting from the North Slope Spills Analysis, Phase I of the Alaska Risk Assessment of the state oil and gas infrastructure, and continue to implement and evaluate the effectiveness of Alaska's flow line regulations to reduce spills from Alaska's aging oil infrastructure.
