Brief Summary and Statement of Need:

This project will implement an electronic data sharing system to interface with other criminal justice entities within the State of Alaska. This system will allow for the efficient transfer of criminal justice data between multiple agencies, including the Department of Law, the Alaska Court System, the Department of Public Safety, the Department of Revenue, the Department of Health & Social Services and the Department of Administration. Project Description/Justification:

This project will develop a plan to interface with the Alaska Court System's case management system in order to expedite the transfer of criminal justice electronic information to the Department of Law as well as several other State of Alaska departments and police departments. This will assist the department's employees in successfully prosecuting both civil and criminal offenses more expediently by removing several steps of the data transfer between departments that currently exists.

What is the purpose of the project?

To ensure that criminal justice information is shared between criminal justice entities as efficiently and quickly as possible in order to prosecute civil and criminal offenses.

This is a new systems development project that will increase efficiency and remove several manual steps that the data must now go through in order to be shared between departments. Once completed, information will be entered one time.

To be determined based on a requirements definition and full evaluation of the systems in which the data will be procured from. Estimated cost is \$400.0 for the implementation of the data sharing system.

Yes, this system will share data electronically between Law and numerous other justice agencies across the State of Alaska.

What will happen if the project is not approved?

Law will not be able to prosecute criminal offenses quickly or use data that is ensured to be accurate across all justice agencies involved.
