Component Budget Summary

Component: Labor and State Affairs

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Labor and State Affairs section provides advice and representation concerning the management of state government, education, workforce, community and economic development and other government functions.

Core Services

- The section provides legal assistance needed for governmental management, including budget, public finance, employment, labor relations, civil rights, procurement, retirement and benefits programs, Medicaid rate disputes, investment of treasury and Permanent Fund Corporation funds, and homeland security.
- The section provides legal assistance for problems associated with institutional relationships within state government, including the separation of powers between the three branches of government and interaction between the state and local governments.
- The section provides legal assistance on issues associated with voter initiatives and the conduct of elections and election campaigns, as well as education, child care licensing, workers' compensation and employment security, occupational safety, employment programs, municipal grants, and revocation of driver licenses.
- Primary recipients of the section's legal services include the Departments of Administration, Education and Early Development, Health and Social Services, Labor and Workforce Development, Commerce, Community and Economic Development, Military and Veteran's Affairs; Offices of the Governor and Lieutenant Governor; Alaska Court System; and quasi-government entities such as: Alaska Permanent Fund Corporation, Alaska Energy Authority, and the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2012

- The Labor and State Affairs section has provided Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) with enhanced legal services this last year as the AEA seeks to license and develop the proposed Susitna-Watana Hydroelectric Project. The project is to include a large dam with a 20,000-acre, 39 mile-long reservoir and expected to produce approximately 50% of the Railbelt's current electric energy demand. Section attorneys assisted the Alaska Energy Authority on all aspects of licensing the project with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), including filing the Pre-Application Document (PAD) with FERC, beginning the formal licensing process. The PAD provides detailed descriptions of the currently envisioned project facilities and operations, and sets in motion a series of deadlines and milestones for the project and begins an estimated six-year licensing and design process. Section counsel provided advice to AEA through a series of formal and informal meetings with FERC, state and federal resource agencies, Railbelt utilities, Alaska Native entities, and other interested members of the public. These discussions have ranged from the types of environmental and socioeconomic studies that will be required to complete the FERC licensing process, to utility interest in purchasing power from the project. AEA prepared and circulated proposed study plans, and proposed final plans will be submitted to FERC in November 2012. Formal FERC studies will be conducted in 2013 and 2014 (AEA conducted informal studies in 2012). AEA intends to file a license application with FERC in 2015, which if approved on schedule would allow project construction to begin in 2017.
- Section attorneys continued to work closely with the Alaska Energy Authority in developing criteria and regulations for the solicitation of applications for grants and for the issuance of over \$100 million in grants for renewable energy projects in FY2011 and FY2012 under AS 42.45.045.
- The Department of Law successfully defended the state's parental notification law from constitutional challenge. The law, which was passed by voter initiative in August 2010, requires a physician in most cases to notify a minor's parent or guardian 48 hours before performing an abortion on the minor. A family planning non-profit organization and two physicians filed suit to enjoin the law, arguing that it violated minors' constitutional rights to privacy, equal protection, and due process. The Anchorage Superior Court held a three-week trial to weigh the law's justifications effects. Both sides presented numerous expert and lay witnesses to testify on all aspects of the law. After trial, the court ruled largely in favor of the state, holding

that the bulk of the law is constitutional and modifying only a few of the implementing details. The department will continue to vigorously defend the law if the superior court's ruling is appealed.

- The section provided day to day advice and represented the state in court and administrative proceedings involving disputes over the procurement of services, lease space, and equipment (typically, in bid protests and in breach of contract actions), obtaining just results.
- The section successfully filed actions to obtain judgments for fines imposed by the Workers Compensation Appeals Board against employers and for fines imposed by the Alaska Public Offices Commission against persons and groups who violated campaign finance laws. The section set up a mechanism to perfect the judgments so that fines could be collected.
- The section provides representation to the Division of Personnel and the individual departments in state employment discrimination, dispute and termination matters. These cases are often complicated, both factually and legally resulting in extensive trial preparation and trial work. For example, section attorneys handled a lengthy hearing before the federal Equal Employment Opportunity Commission involving a high-level appointee of the Governor's Office who had been terminated in 1994 and alleged that her termination was discriminatory and retaliatory. The case, *Ward v. State*, which originated 18 years ago, involved thousands of pages of documents and numerous witnesses located throughout the state and the nation. In a 48-page decision, the judge ruled in favor of the state and dismissed the original complaint in its entirety.
- The section represented the Department of Education and Early Development in court and administrative proceedings regarding the educational services being provided to special needs children and obtained just results. It also continued to represent the department in *Moore v. State*, in which a number of school districts and individuals challenged the adequacy of educational services under the state constitution. The state reached settlement in this case this year. The Legislature provided a one-time appropriation of \$18 million to be distributed by the Commissioner, working with a committee of educators appointed by each side, to the 40 lowest-performing schools in the state. The \$18 million will be used to fund programs for educational improvement, including \$6 million reserved for pre-literacy. The committee will determine how the money is allocated so that the funding lasts for at least three years.
- Section attorneys also were successful representing the state in *Kasayulie v. State (rural school construction and Public School Trust)*. This longstanding education case regarding school facilities and public school trust lands has been settled and dismissed by the court. However, the court retains jurisdiction until July 2015, when the last two of the five rural schools provided for in the settlement are to be funded by the legislature. If a school is not funded as provided for under the agreement, the plaintiffs can reopen the litigation, except that if the Legislature refuses to fund the Kivalina project because of concerns about erosion, it will not trigger the reopener clause. While the case has been dismissed, the Department of Law continues to assist in completing a valuation of school trust lands.
- The section responded to increased demand for legal services from the Alaska Public Offices Commission as the number of complaints filed with the commission has grown and the level of public scrutiny of the agency has intensified.
- The section worked with the Office of Rate Review of Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS) to
 resolve numerous disputes with providers of home and community based services regarding Medicaid waiver
 rates; and worked closely with DHSS on new regulations governing how the rates will be set.
- The section represented the administrator of the retirement and benefits trusts in administrative hearings over denials of claims for retirement, disability, and medical benefits. Section attorneys also represented the state in a complex retirement contribution case, United Academics v. State, Univ. of Alaska (optional retirement program). This was a class action brought by university employees who participated in the Optional Retirement System (ORP) claiming the state and the university unconstitutionally impaired their ORP benefits. After mediation, the parties reached a settlement that provided for \$25 million in present value, \$20 million to be paid as a lump sum, subject to appropriation, and the remainder to be paid over time by the University. The settlement de-coupled the ORP employer contribution rate from TRS and stabilized the employer contribution rate for the ORP at 14%. In February 2012, the court approved the class action settlement and the Legislature appropriated funding for the settlement in FY2012.

Key Component Challenges

- The Labor and State Affairs section continues to face increasing demands for services by the Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) related to electric energy issues and the development of the Susitna Watana Hydrodam. AEA requires assistance reviewing loans, grants, and related contracts, and reviewing financing documents, as the state responds to the need for more, alternative, and less expensive electric energy resources. AEA also requires support for efforts to encourage the Railbelt utilities to coordinate planning for development of new generation and transmission projects, negotiating a new or extended agreement for the Alaska Intertie, and for administrative support for AEA-owned assets. Additionally, the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA) is increasing its involvement in numerous development projects statewide, and AIDEA will need assistance from section attorneys in reviewing financing transactions and related contracts associated with AIDEA's investments and projects, including the Healy Clean Coal Project litigation and final settlement.
- The section will need to continue to represent the Office of the Lieutenant Governor in challenges to initiative proposals and in election contests during the 2012 election cycle. The section will also provide advice on the implementation of the interim redistricting plan adopted by the Alaska Supreme Court and pre-cleared by the Department of Justice on June 27, 2012, which includes extensive and detailed precinct maps and regulations to accommodate the 2012 elections. And, because the approved redistricting plan is only an interim plan, section attorneys will represent the state in litigation that is expected to continue over the next few years by persons and entities that filed challenges to the interim plan.
- Additionally, section attorneys will continue to represent the state in a suit filed by the state against United States Attorney General, Eric Holder, challenging the constitutionality of Sections 4(b) and 5 of the Voting Rights Act. Section 4(b) contains a formula for determining which jurisdictions must comply with the requirements of section 5, which provides that covered jurisdictions may not implement any changes to their election laws or practices without the prior approval—or "preclearance"—of the Department of Justice in Washington, D.C. The state's complaint alleges that section 5's preclearance requirement exceeded Congress's authority under the 14th and 15th Amendments, because Congress lacked evidence of a sufficiently severe and pervasive record of voting discrimination in the jurisdictions targeted by Section 4(b) to justify the intrusion on state sovereignty. In particular, the complaint notes the paucity of evidence regarding voting discrimination in Alaska before Congress in 2006 when the Voting Rights Act was reauthorized and the preclearance requirement was extended for 25 years.
- The section continues to experience a significant increase in the legal work related to procurement protests
 and contract claims for professional services, supplies and leasing, particularly in the areas of leasing and
 computer related contracts. Section attorneys advise and represent all departments' procurement officials in
 these procurement protest and contract claims, and represent the Commissioner of Administration in appeals
 filed in superior court.
- The section has also experienced an increase in legal work related to advising the Department of
 Administration on the state's health care plans as well as legal work related to assessing the financial impact
 to the state resulting from the administration of the retirement and benefit programs.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2014

The section expects to deliver the same high quality results in FY2014 as in previous years.
