Prior Funding History / Additional Information:

Prior to SLA2008, the annual law enforcement equipment replacement projects included both the Alaska Wildlife Troopers and the Alaska State Troopers. They began receiving separate projects in SLA2008.

Project Description/Justification:

This project provides new and replacement law enforcement equipment for use by the Alaska State Troopers. Equipment replacement is due to normal wear and tear. This project will provide funding for the below types of equipment; however, other types of equipment may be purchased if deemed more mission critical.

New and replacement electronic and office equipment: \$200,000

This category of equipment includes printers, scanners, digital recorders, digital cameras, digital video, computer software, and office equipment for use in crime scene documentation and evidence gathering. This category also includes the replacement of antiquated and irreparable office furniture.

Law enforcement equipment: \$200,000

This includes radar units for vehicle speed enforcement, total station (instruments used for accident and crime scene documentation and mapping), all-terrain vehicles, snow machines, and specialized emergency response team equipment.
