Brief Summary and Statement of Need:

The rideshare project funds the operations of the Municipal Share-A-Ride Program which promotes, coordinates, and operates an area-wide commuter matching service, a van pool program, and a comprehensive transportation marketing program. The program includes commuters from the Matanuska-Susitna Valley into Anchorage. The Transit Marketing program encourages transit ridership, marketing new bus routes and new headway times, and advertising to promote ridership to specific target groups.

Project Description/Justification:

Anchorage has problems with traffic congestion and, in the past, meeting air-quality conformity. Encouraging and assisting the public in finding alternative transportation rather than using a single-occupant vehicle is desirable in lessening congestion and improving air quality. Both of these programs are included in the State Air Quality Control Plan as control measures for maintaining air quality.
