## **Project Description/Justification:**

The Anvil Mountain Correction Center (AMCC) was constructed in 1984 and contains 35,000 square feet of space. This project provides telephone system replacement at the AMCC.

This project is a compilation of essential capital maintenance requirements at this institution. The list is fluid between the time the Governor's budget is submitted and the time the appropriation is authorized. During this time period, other critical projects may be identified while several projects already on the list have reached completion. Funds are then allocated to the most urgent of the remaining projects. The projects not completed become the basis of the next fiscal year capital appropriation request. Adjustments to the deferred maintenance project allocations may be necessary between all 24-hour institutional facilities to meet emergency needs as they arise.
