Project Description/Justification:

Agencies providing services to Mental Health Trust beneficiaries have a great need for equipment to improve the effectiveness, efficiency and quality of their service delivery.

Program equipment needs may include therapeutic equipment, computers (to allow programs to meet management information system operation, evaluation and client outcome requirements), fax

machines, copiers, furnishings and general office equipment, security systems for homeless shelters serving beneficiaries and telepsychiatry equipment or systems for community mental health grantees.

Proposals will be solicited from service providers statewide for all four beneficiary groups. This very successful grant program has provided agencies with equipment (limited to \$25,000 per agency) that has significantly improved their operational efficiencies.

The ongoing need for this project has been well documented by the Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority, the beneficiary boards and the Comprehensive Integrated Mental Health Plan, *Moving Forward*.
