Project Description/Justification: Replacement Equipment:

The expected life of each asset is determined by Statewide Equipment Fleet. It is based on age, usage, and maintenance cost. We will extend the life of an asset as long as it is practical to do so. This project will reduce the age of the fleet. The assets being replaced have a higher than acceptable maintenance cost, down time is increasing, and replacement parts are becoming difficult to procure.

Replacement equipment is required in order to meet the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Advisory Circular 150/5200-30C clearance times. 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are required to clear all Priority 1 surfaces within 30 minutes. We have increased the surface area of runway 7R/25L, a Priority 1 runway, by 52%. We are required to maintain this runway in the same amount of time requiring more equipment on the field during snow removal operations.

New Equipment:

Anchorage International Airport may use some of the funds allocated for this project to purchase new equipment, if priorities change and needs for new equipment outweigh the needs for replacement equipment in any given year.
