Project Description/Justification:

Commercial carpet life expectancy is 8 years. Carpet in Concourse C and upper mezzanine, which includes the third floor hallway and Native art display, was installed in 2004 and is already showing significant signs of wear. Worn/frayed carpeting not only presents an unappealing look, but creates trip hazards for employees and the public.

The costs to keep the carpet clean and maintained will increase over time as the carpet wears. The current carpet is more susceptible to stains and material failure, which will increase labor and material costs. Replacing the project will improve the aesthetics of the terminal.
