**Major Department Accomplishments in 2014**

- Results-Based Accountability:** After three years of steady progress on a department-wide results based accountability (RBA) framework, the department now has full programmatic and budgetary alignment down through each of its eight divisions. All divisions have articulated core services and key activities which align to the department core services and every dollar in FY2015 is accounted for and aligned to the RBA framework. Performance measures are integrated into an online performance management system and performance measure score cards roll up to performance dashboards that show how well the department is doing at fulfilling its objectives.
- Medicaid Gap Study:** Released report that included an overview of safety net services available in Alaska and identified gaps existing for Alaskans who fall between the eligibility lines of Medicaid and subsidized insurance on the Federal Healthcare Marketplace.

- **Medicaid Reform Advisory Group:** Group charged with proposing meaningful reforms to the state's Medicaid program met monthly and provided a report to the Governor outlining recommendations for: stability and predictability in budgeting; increasing ease and efficacy of navigating the system by providers; and providing whole care for the patient by uniting physical and behavioral health treatment.
- **Medicaid regulations:** Changes to the regulations governing coverage and payment for prescription medications were implemented in May of 2014 and are anticipated to generate an annual savings of \$1,000.0. Some of the notable changes were elimination of coverage for some non-prescription medications, revision of payment for medications, and increasing the dispensing fees paid to pharmacies. The changes were necessary to ensure program resources were being spent in a manner that maximizes the services received by recipients.
- **Bonus:** Health Care Services applied and qualified for its fifth Children's Health Insurance Program Reauthorization Act (CHIPRA) performance bonus payment for the department in the amount of \$2,531.0, bringing the cumulative bonus since 2009 to \$18,022.0.
- **Collections:** Health Care Services renewed the Third Party Liability contract with Health Management Services (HMS), which ensures continued robust collections from commercial insurance, Tricare, and Medicare. New initiatives include expansion of Tricare and commercial insurance collections to include a greater universe of services. Also under this contract, the Health Insurance Premium Payment program enrollment grew by 13 percent in FY2014, realizing a calculated savings increase of \$1,000.0 from FY2013.
- **Fraud:** Collaborated with other state agencies during Medicaid fraud investigations, resulting in close to 60 charged.
- **Personal Care Assistance:** Right sized the Personal Care Assistance program through \$17,000.0 in reductions

## Key Department Challenges

The Department of Health and Social Services continues to make progress towards the following overall objectives:

- Integrate and coordinate services.
- Strategically leverage technology.
- Implement sound policy.
- Practice fiscal responsibility.
- Measure and improve performance.

Some of the Department's challenges include:

- Assuring intra-departmental and inter-departmental activities are planned and executed in a manner that considers both short and long-term results and will maximize the generation of federal and other non-state revenues.
- Serving seniors. The Alaska Commission on Aging predicts that the senior population in Alaska will increase from 55,237 in 2010 to 76,502 by the year 2015. Some fraction of this population requires significant assistance from the state, and will grow proportionately to the overall senior population. The current service provider capacity is insufficient to meet their care needs.
- Managing services for an aging population with increasingly complicated and difficult health care needs and behaviors.
- Sustaining the Health Information Exchange since the end of the Health Information Exchange Cooperative Agreement Grant in FY2014. There is an increased need for the State and other stakeholders to fund the ongoing operations of the Health Information Exchange established under AS 18.23.300.
- Addressing obesity, the dominant public health problem today. About three of every 10 Alaska kids are overweight. Each year, obesity-related medical expenses cost an estimated \$459 million in Alaska. About 25 percent of that cost is paid with funds through Medicare and Medicaid programs.
- Developing quality local Psychiatric Emergency Services throughout the state, as well as alternatives to hospitalization (such as crisis respite beds), to minimize admissions to Alaska Psychiatric Institute, which is the only state-owned psychiatric hospital. The Alaska Psychiatric Institute, which has very limited capacity (80 total beds, with only 50 acute adult beds), has experienced a significant census increase in recent years. This admission pressure has forced the hospital to adopt an "acute care model" that does not allow for

complete patient stabilization before the majority of its patients must be discharged in order to provide a bed for another patient. This has led to a higher than desired rate of readmissions to the Alaska Psychiatric Institute within 30 days, ending with the alarming statistic that over 30 percent of Alaska Psychiatric Institute discharges are now readmitted within 180 days of their discharge.

- Retaining staff, the number one challenge facing the Office of Children's Services. Without the necessary positions filled in so many offices statewide, we know that our ability to meet state and federal requirements for family contact, worker visits with children, and worker visits with parents will and does greatly suffer. Those three requirements alone directly correlate to the likelihood of a family being successful or a child being reunified or achieving permanency in a timely fashion.
- Expending considerable staff time and effort to resolve a significant increase in the number of rejected Medicaid claims that could not be processed by the Medicaid Management Information System, from 300 – 600 per month in FY2013 to 2,500 – 3,000 per month in FY2014.

### **Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2016**

- In line with the Governor's stated priority of investing in health coverage for Alaskans, resources to implement Medicaid expansion are included in DHSS's proposed budget. By offering health coverage to Alaskans, we will be one step closer to achieving better population health in general and specifically, a better quality of life for individuals. The overall benefit to the State will be a more productive work force, realization of long-term savings for the State, and economic growth through job creation. Medicaid expansion is also our State's path to meaningful Medicaid reform.
- In FY2016, the Alaska Medicaid program will implement the mandate for International Classification of Diseases, 10th edition. The increase from several thousand to more than 68,000 diagnosis codes and to 87,000 inpatient procedure codes is expected to improve health care quality, research, and public health reporting. It is also expected to promote accurate reimbursement. The planned implementation date for the International Classification of Diseases, 10th edition changes is October 1, 2015.
- The reduction to the Medicaid Disproportionate Share Hospital funds will have an impact on services in FY2016. An inability to fully support the Designated Evaluation and Treatment program will have immediate and serious impacts on the Alaska Psychiatric Institute's admissions capacity, overwhelming its ability to serve Alaskans court-ordered to a psychiatric hospital for evaluation and/or treatment.

### **Impacts of Key Proposed FY2016 DHSS Operating Budget Reductions**

- Making decisions that affect our most vulnerable populations is very difficult. However, since the bulk of DHSS funding is for grants/benefits, reductions will affect services and benefits to vulnerable Alaskans.
- **Alaska Pioneers' Homes** – delete 19 positions and associated funding. This will directly impact the care provided to residents within the six Homes, resulting in longer waiting periods for prospective residents to move off the active waitlist and enter the Homes; a reduction in the number of highest-level care residents the Homes are able to serve; a reduction in the total number of licensed beds; and longer response times from staff, possibly compromising resident safety. To help offset these impacts, the division proposes an 8.5% residents' rate increase. The rate increase could result in a greater proportion of residents who require financial assistance to pay the Homes' fees.
- **Juvenile Justice** – repurpose the Ketchikan Regional Youth Facility from a locked detention facility to a residential facility offering treatment to dually diagnosed (mental health, substance abuse) youth from across the state; and delete 10 positions and associated funding.
- By changing the purpose of the facility, the division would apply to become a Medicaid services provider and be reimbursed for behavioral health services provided to youth. The Johnson Youth Center in Juneau would absorb the detention youth. This change of facility use would increase youth treatment beds by up to ten, potentially reducing the number of dually diagnosed youth who must leave the state for treatment. Travel



costs for youth and division staff would increase somewhat, and Ketchikan youth housed at the Juneau-based center would have fewer face-to-face visits with their families, while detained.

- Deletion of probation staff will increase the caseload for remaining staff and reduce level of service provided, particularly staff involvement in schools and the community. The Homer probation office will be closed, and Kenai probation staff will travel periodically, to provide Homer service.
- **Public Assistance** – reduce multiple public assistance formula programs. Reductions to Alaska Temporary Assistance (ATAP), Adult Public Assistance, Tribal Assistance (TAP) and Energy Assistance are currently projected to be feasible due to a downward turn in caseloads and expenditure projections. However, if the State were to slip into an economic recession, there is a possibility that Public Assistance will receive more requests for help increasing program costs.
- State expenditures within ATAP and TAP are used primarily to satisfy the Maintenance of Effort (MOE) requirement for the receipt of the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families block grant. A reduction may impact the state's ability to satisfy the MOE requirement, triggering a loss of federal funds.
- **Public Health** – close Seward Public Health Center, reduce public health nursing grants and emergency services grants, reduce viral immunology testing, and delete 12 positions and associated funding. Reductions could lead to a decrease in response/timeliness to an infectious disease outbreak, including increased public health concerns in Seward during the tourist season, and may result in a reduction of several thousand appointments for well child exams, sexually transmitted infection, reproductive health, tuberculosis, immunization, etc. Viral immunology testing is of significant medical consequence and thus must continue, and would be shifted to the private sector. The majority of testing would need to be performed at an out-of-state lab, introducing potentially risky time delays.
- **Senior and Disabilities Services** – reduce individual benefits under the General Relief program, and reduce grants across the division. General Relief currently serves 565 and both subsidizes the immediate, basic needs of Alaskans facing extreme financial crisis, and temporarily funds assisted living placements. Grant fund reductions will reduce the amount of assistance an individual receives, and may limit the number of people served and result in provider staff layoffs.
