This project is anticipated to provide support for the following on the Alaska Highway:

Alaska Highway - Milepost 1354 to 1364 Rehabilitation

This project will provide rehabilitation, resurfacing and wayside improvement of the Alaska Highway from Jan Lake Road to Dot Lake. This section of the Alaska Highway is in poor condition and requires rehabilitation. Work includes drainage, guardrail, signs, leveling, surfacing, and selective wayside improvements. Two failing culverts will be replaced, located at MP 1362 and 1364.5.
