Major Component Accomplishments in 2015

- Issued 84 new licenses, 165 transfers, 1800 renewals and 1,901 permits during this fiscal year. Maintained
 written order database for local option communities. Conducted inspections of liquor licensed establishments
 throughout the state.
- Staff attended and contributed during multiple meetings related to reform of Title 4 alcohol statutes and
 regulations, including steering committee meetings of the stakeholders group. The stakeholders group is
 responsible for the creation of Senate Bill 99, which seeks major revisions of Title 4 in this legislative session.
 Agency staff provided research, data and valuable experience which contributed to the reform effort. Staff has
 given multiple presentations regarding the changes proposed in SB 99 to a variety of groups, including the Alaska
 Wellness Coalition, Department of Health and Social Services Division of Behavioral Health grantees, and Alaska
 Municipal League.
- Identified multiple liquor licensed establishments with statutory and regulatory challenges and provided information which led to board action assuring resolution of license issues. Provided information which led to board holding liquor licensed establishments accountable for public safety violations of Title 4 statutes.
- Worked with a contract regulations attorney to draft Marijuana Control Board regulations for policy work by the board. The final product of nine articles of regulations is a 133 page document that is expected to be submitted to the Department of Law and Lt. Governor for enactment by February 24, 2016.
- Staff traveled to Washington and Colorado, where marijuana is legalized and commerce is occurring, to learn
 about practical challenges of implementing legalized marijuana. Agency investigators attended training sessions
 with other states' enforcement staff, enabling hands-on enforcement experience in commercial establishments
 that do not yet exist in Alaska.
- Staff posted multiple public notices related to the marijuana regulations project, and received and tracked written comments through five separate rounds of public input related to the nine articles of regulations. Thousands of comments were received from nearly five hundred individual commenters; these comments were tracked and posted to the website. The comments were also compiled section-by-section to facilitate board review.
- Conducted eight full-day meetings and three half-day meetings of the Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) board between July 1, 2015 and June 30, 2016. This represents a total of four additional full day meetings to address the added duties created by the passage of Ballot Measure 2. In past years the ABC board has met for five full days throughout the year. The ABC board promulgated one permanent regulation defining a term in the ballot measure, and reviewed draft regulations relating to Article 2, Local Option, of the marijuana regulations. The ABC board took public testimony at its April, 2015 meeting and posted draft regulations for public comment beginning in May, 2015.

Key Component Challenges

Remote liquor license holders manufacturing or serving alcohol cannot be regularly checked for compliance or violations because of prohibitive travel expenses. Partnering with other departments would increase consistent enforcement of statutes and regulations by allowing Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office (AMCO) investigators to

accompany other employees who are already traveling to remote areas of the state, particularly by boat, car or private plane.

Technical improvements in record keeping and public interaction are needed. The agency's systems and records are paper-based and need updating. Storage and copying costs are incurred each year to maintain these paper-based systems as well as a significant amount of staff time. Applications are not available online and applicants must physically come in or mail applications, resulting in significant staff time in getting missing information or corrections to incomplete documents.

Accepting and processing an unknown number of marijuana license applications will pose a significant challenge in FY2016 and FY2017. In FY2016, staff must prepare to accept applications electronically; however, the database application cannot be developed and finalized until regulations are finalized. Staff will be particularly challenged by the need to implement an electronic licensing database in a narrow window of time (December, 2015-February, 2016 Training on the new regulations and preparation of a Request For Proposal for "seed to sale" software must all occur in the same short time span.

Educating the public, law enforcement stakeholders and local government officials regarding the regulations adopted by the board for the regulation of marijuana will be a significant challenge. If Senate Bill 99 (revisions to Title 4) passes this session, the changes will need to be disseminated to the public through an educational effort. Regulations in 3 AAC 304 must be promulgated to bring regulations in line with statutory changes.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2017

The passage of Ballot Measure 2, allowing the possession, sale and use of marijuana, adds new responsibilities to the Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office. The new Marijuana Control Board (MCB), which is responsible for regulating the cultivation, manufacture, and sale of marijuana in the state, shares the same director and staff as the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (ABC). Regulations for marijuana must be adopted by November 24, 2015 per the ballot measure. The volume of applications for licensure is unknown; a high volume of applications and licensees may stretch the agency's current resources.

The ABC and MCB are responsible for safely regulating alcohol and marijuana in the state; educational efforts are a key component of fulfilling that responsibility. The agency will add a Local Government Specialist IV in FY2017 to provide education and outreach support to local governments, licensees, municipal organizations, and other interested parties to ensure that the proposed changes to Title 4 under Senate Bill 99 and the new marijuana regulations are effectively communicated and appropriately implemented.

The Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office (AMCO, previously titled the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board) is charged with safely and responsibly regulating alcohol and marijuana in the state. In order to achieve this charge, the agency must focus on education and outreach to ensure Alaska's communities, local organizations, and other stakeholders are aware of the rules and regulations related to alcohol and marijuana, and that accurate information is consistently disseminated to interested parties.

The Local Government Specialist (LGS) IV position will create, conduct, and manage an educational outreach program regarding local option, local governing body control procedures, zoning, licensing, and compliance with Alaska's alcohol regulations, laws, and statutes. The LGS IV will provide assistance to local governments, interpret and apply departmental policy and state, federal, and local laws and regulations, develop work plans, make public appearances to represent departmental programs, and attend and participate in hearings, meetings, forums, conferences, and seminars concerning local government involvement in alcohol licensing and enforcement. Through education, outreach, and relationship building, this position will support licensing and enforcement actions of the Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office and the boards' relationships with local governments that weigh in on alcohol licenses, as well as with those communities who wish to opt out.

By working directly with local governing bodies, planning commissions, local police and fire departments, non-profits, and public health agencies, this position will enable the agency to be responsive to issues that do not directly involve enforcement or licensing but which are crucial to the entire state board/local control paradigm of alcohol control. This person will serve as the point of contact for the high volume of alcohol questions the agency currently receives from local governments, mayors, assembly and city council members, city and borough attorneys, legislative staffers, and non-profit entities inquiring on behalf of their local constituents. The AMCO currently receives many questions related to existing regulations and proposed revisions to Title 04, the Alcoholic Beverage statutes, and an overwhelming number of questions related to proposed marijuana regulations and policies. This position will help avoid potential confusion and frustration among our local government partners by providing accurate, consistent responses to the numerous questions posed by local governments. Having a designated employee to answer these questions is the best way to ensure that questions are answered and interpretations are provided consistently. By proactively educating and building strong working relationships with all stakeholders, this position will serve a crucial role in successfully regulating alcohol in the state.

In the first year, this position will focus on the existing liquor licensing statutes and regulations and revisions proposed in the Title 04 reform effort, and will be funded by alcohol license fees collected from regulated entities. As receipts from license fees related to marijuana are available and as marijuana regulations and statute changes are adopted, this position will also work on marijuana outreach and compliance.

The Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office (AMCO, previously titled the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board) serves as staff to the Marijuana Control Board created in HB 123, and is charged with safely and responsibly regulating alcohol and marijuana in the state. This includes controlling the cultivation, manufacture and sale of marijuana. The Marijuana Control Board must adopt regulations within nine months of the effective date of Ballot Measure 2, and accept license applications within twelve months. The initiative took effect on February 24, 2015, ninety days after the election was certified. If the Marijuana Control Board does not adopt
