Component Budget Summary

Component: Statewide Project Development, Alternative Energy and Efficiency

Contribution to Department's Mission

Assist in developing projects in Alaska that reduce and stabilize the cost of energy and decrease dependency on diesel and heating oil.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2016

Alternative Energy and Energy Efficiency: The Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) has increased statewide knowledge and capacity to install effective alternative energy systems by providing technical workshops and technical assistance through the alternative energy program. AEA facilitates collaborative working groups on renewable resources and energy efficiency. In FY2016 AEA worked with the Department of Energy, Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy (DOE EERE) to administer the Rural Alaska Community Energy Efficiency (RACEE) program, which provided technical assistance to 13 communities. The technical assistance provided by AEA gave each community a plan to reach their community energy efficiency goal including site specific technical and financial information.

Renewable Energy Grant Fund Program: The Renewable Energy Fund (REF) has funded 287 grants to assess or develop renewable energy projects state-wide. The 55 operating projects at the end of 2015 that received REF grants will save approximately 30 million gallons of diesel fuel equivalent in calendar year 2016. As of September 2016, there are now 69 operating projects built with Renewable Energy Fund dollars. The annual renewable energy generation grows each year as more REF funded projects progress through the construction phase and become operational.

Wind Energy: Since 2012, Alaska's wind energy installed capacity grew from 15.3 megawatts to 63.8 megawatts, exclusive of the wind generation installed on St. George Island in July of 2016. This development has been strongly supported through AEA's wind program and the Renewable Energy Fund.

Hydroelectric Energy: AEA's hydroelectric program monitors and manages 70 projects throughout the State. Projects range from concepts to operational hydroelectric facilities. AEA recognizes that hydroelectric power is critical to meeting Alaska's renewable energy standards and provides long term benefits and energy security to Alaska communities. The hydro program is currently focused on improving efficiency and quality in development, lowering the cost of construction, and coordinating with other State agencies, federal agencies, municipalities, tribal entities, and private investors in analyzing, planning, and generally assisting hydroelectric development.

Biomass program: The biomass program has provided funding for 20 operating woody biomass heating systems for schools and public buildings which reduces diesel fuel use and keeps the money for fuel (wood) within the community. Along with the U.S. Forest Service, the program has provided funding for over 150 pre-feasibility studies to evaluate a community's potential to heat with wood. The program also develops many innovative tools for more effective use of biomass energy such as a Greenhouse Handbook to use excess biomass heat to grow vegetables locally.

Emerging Energy Technology Fund: The Emerging Energy Technology fund has funded 21 emerging energy technologies since its inaugural year that are attempting to commercialize energy technologies that will help advance Alaska's systems. These range from flywheel testing, and River In-Stream Energy Conversion hydrokinetic device testing to cold climate heat pump demonstrations.

Power Project Fund Loan Program: In FY2016, AEA approved five Power Project Fund (PPF) loans: Arctic Village powerhouse improvements; King Cove Waterfall Creek hydroelectric; Newtok powerhouse improvements; Pilot Point powerhouse improvements; and Pelican hydroelectric project. Initial disbursements were also made in FY2016 to support the construction of the Hiilangaay hydroelectric project on Prince of Wales Island; this \$20 million loan was approved prior to FY2016 but began construction this year. A loan to Akhiok for the purchase of pre-pay electric meters to improve utility collections was approved just after the end of FY2016. The Power Project Loan Fund provides loans to local utilities, local governments or independent power producers for the development or upgrade of power facilities. Total committed funds are \$22,306,660, and at the end of July 2016 the fund had an uncommitted

cash balance of \$9.9 million. AEA staff have recently been in contact with seven communities currently considering PPF loans that would cumulatively exceed \$16 million, which is greater than the current available balance. Without grant funds to replace and repair powerhouse equipment or build new renewable and diesel energy systems, AEA expects demand for the loan program to continue to grow.

Key Component Challenges

Reduced capacity for alternative energy, energy efficiency, renewable energy, and energy technology projects will make it difficult, if not impossible, to reduce reliance on fossil fuels and meet the state energy policy of 15 percent energy efficiency by 2020 and 50 percent renewable energy by 2025.

Statewide Project Development, Alternative Energy and Efficiency has experienced a 70% reduction in capacity for program delivery which has resulted in a challenge to change priorities including: reduction in energy technology research, reduction of on-site technical assistance and community outreach, and narrowing focus on energy technologies that are mature in Alaska (efficiency, wind, biomass, heat recovery, hydro).

AEA's Power Project Fund (PPF) loan program is seeing increasing demand, though less than \$10M is currently available in the fund. Additional interest in the loan program is expected to as a result of reduced grants available through the Renewable Energy Fund (REF).

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2018

General fund dollars have supported critical AEA programs such as the administration of the emerging energy technology fund (EETF), technical assistance, and community assistance. Due to staff reductions, there is no longer a designated program manager for the EETF grant program. Instead, the administration and oversight function has been spread to other technical staff in additional to their existing workloads. The technical and community assistance activities have been reduced, and staff that performed these duties are now performing additional duties as a result of a reallocation of workloads and reduced staff. AEA is working to secure federal funding to supplant reduced general funds. Other operating costs such as management oversight, travel, and administrative support costs, have been reduced. AEA is committed to prioritizing critical functions, seeking new funding sources, and continuing to deliver critical services to Alaskans.
