Component: Program Administration & Operations

Contribution to Department's Mission

Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education's mission is to promote access to and success in education and career training beyond high school.

Core Services

- Provide Alaska students with low-cost supplemental education loans
- Increase public awareness and use of ACPE's services as Alaska's higher education assistance agency
- Efficiently deliver state financial aid programs, information, and materials to Alaska students and parents
- Ensure Alaska's authorized institutions operate within academic, administrative and financial standards

Major Component Accomplishments in 2016

- Completed conversion from mainframe-based loan servicing system to server-based system, resulting in efficiencies in excess of \$300.000:
- Developed and implemented the Alaska Education Loan Refinancing Program (Refi), offering Alaska
 residents the opportunity to refinance all their education loan debt at reduced cost, with the long-term goal of
 achieving servicing savings sufficient to reduce costs for new student borrowers;
- Designed and deployed an updated, mobile-friendly agency Web site, using content management options to reduce maintenance costs;
- Designed and implemented an updated online loan application, streamlining the application process;
 providing real-time authentication and credit checks, and increasing application processing efficiencies;
- Implemented LEAN continuous improvement agency-wide, resulting in incremental line staff-level efficiencies with an estimated value of \$150,000:
- Deployed new financial literacy training videos for students, to assist them with planning for postsecondary education costs;
- Through the Alaska Student Aid Portal (ASAP), a web-based financial aid management system, the Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education (ACPE) provided eligible Alaskans with information about their individual Alaska Performance Scholarship (APS) and/or Alaska Education Grant (AEG) accounts, and with the ability to provide online updates;
- ASAP, functioning as the financial aid management tool for participating postsecondary institutions for online certification of student enrollment and continuing eligibility, enabled paperless aid disbursement through schools to participating students, and was used to deliver approximately \$11 million to just over 3,300 APS recipients and \$5.2 million to just over 2,700 AEG recipients;
- Conducted APS outreach and public awareness through: 178 events, reaching a total of 7,644 individuals statewide; the APS alaska.gov website; informational webinars for the public; and, self-serve resources and tools such as the APS Eligibility Progress and Initial Award/Continuing Eligibility Checklists;
- Transitioned APS and AEG electronic award disbursements from vendor to IRIS, resulting in savings of \$90,000;
- Produced the 2016 APS Outcomes Report on the first five high school graduate cohorts, documenting significant positive program impacts;
- Delivered Alaska Career Information System (AKCIS) support and training to teachers/counselors statewide.
 AKCIS has 73,467 student portfolios, including 14,017 new portfolios, and user activity at approximately 130,000 logins in 2016 relating to Personal Learning and Career Plans;
- Extended the successful Alaska College and Career Advising Corps program and transitioning to a funding model independent of federal College Access Challenge Grant. The Corps currently includes 8 Guides serving predominantly rural schools in 16 districts;
- Provided postsecondary planning information to 13,273 educators, students, and families at 395 events in 585 communities across all regions of the state, both in-person and via distance delivery. An additional 4,995 students received services at Alaska College & Career Advising Corps schools;
- Through the creation of the Alaska Postsecondary Access & Completion Network a cross-sector and statewide group of Alaska leaders facilitated partnership, communication and advocacy to expand a culture

- valuing Alaskans' postsecondary attainment. The Network set a postsecondary attainment goal of 65% of working-age Alaskans with postsecondary credentials by 2025; and hosted the second "Alaska Can!" conference attended by over 160 postsecondary access and success professionals;
- Completed development of ANSWERS (Alaska Navigator—Statewide Workforce and Education-Related Statistics), a project to provide policymakers, educators and the public with needed information about program outcomes across Alaska's public education and workforce systems;
- Offered Alaska students access to a very low-cost supplemental education loan, with a fixed interest rate of 6.25% and no origination fee:
- Further reduced borrower costs by offering borrower benefits on the 2016 Alaska Supplemental Education Loan to lower interest costs to 5.5% after credits for repaying as Alaska residents and enrolling in automated
- Originated \$5 million in loans to 489 borrowers:
- Serviced a \$334 million education loan portfolio;
- Supported online education loan accounts for over 40,000 borrowers:
- Enabled 1.101 Alaska students and their families to save ~\$9.6 million (an average savings of over \$8.755 per student) in tuition and fees through Alaska's membership in the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE) and participation in the Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE);
- Through WUE, facilitated attendance of 533 nonresident, undergraduate students at the University of Alaska;
- Reduced operating costs by transitioning to electronic communications with over ~7,100 borrowers electing to go paperless, and by providing AEG and APS students with email communications rather than letters, saving in excess of \$31,000 in postage alone; and,
- Serving as Alaska's State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (SARA) portal agency, thereby; 1) providing Alaska's higher education institutions with a low-cost option to deliver their distance education programs in any other SARA participant state without the need to meet onerous state-by-state authorization requirements; and, 2) increasing Alaskans opportunity to more readily access distance education programs originating from out-of-state institutions located in other SARA participating states.

Key Component Challenges

- Lack of low-cost methods of direct communication to Alaska high school students and families, to ensure receipt of Alaska Performance Scholarship and the Alaska Education Grant information:
- Ensuring Alaskans' current and informed perceptions about career/workforce readiness to result in increased high school graduation rates—particularly among low-income residents;
- Longstanding pattern of Alaska's students' low engagement levels with their postsecondary education programs which results in high attrition and low educational attainment rates; and,
- Ability to produce cross-sector outcomes reports to identify which programs are most successful at resulting in postsecondary access and completion, and in increased ability to participate successfully in the Alaska workforce.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2018

- Expanded and streamlined on-demand, mobile-friendly online account access for borrowers;
- Expanded use of email and other electronic communications to reduce costs of communicating with customers:
- Streamlined institutional authorization processes, and associated regulations changes;
- APAC Network successfully transitioned to a stand-alone non-profit organization; and,
- Continued downsizing of outreach and early awareness staffing and services relative to associated budget reductions.
