To provide resources to school districts to ensure that special populations of students meet the state's high academic standards, to improve performance through professional development, school accountability, standards, and assessments, and to provide school districts and stakeholders with high quality information to aid in data driven decision-making processes and reporting.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2016

- Continued implementing the Alaska Performance Scholarship (APS) in collaboration with the Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education, the Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development, and Alaska school districts:
- Continued successful federal grant reviews, allocation awards, and required monitoring of over 600 federal grant programs;
- Implementation of Alaska's English Language Arts and Mathematics standards, moving all schools to a more complete implementation of the standards;
- Facilitated the Spring Leadership Conference for 175 educators from across Alaska to begin work on Alaska's State Plan for the new Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA); and,
- Successfully awarded and completed over 3,000 federal grant awards, grant payments, and Child Nutrition program reimbursements.

Key Component Challenges

- Academic growth for all students, including closing the achievement gap in English Language Arts and Mathematics to prepare each graduate for successful post-secondary college and career training;
- Continuing to refine the state assessment system, and to prepare to assess all students on higher standards with increased expectations:
- Promoting the continuous growth, through effective educator evaluation, of professionals and paraprofessionals to provide effective standards-based instruction;
- Improving the graduation rate and promote postsecondary options;
- Implementation of changes, based on the reauthorization of Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) as ESSA to the school accountability system;
- The development of policies and procedures to incorporate new requirements under ESSA. Districts will continue to seek assistance from the department for technical assistance; as well as, training and support for their educators on the new ESSA requirements.
- Providing focused district and school improvement support services;
- Facilitating the implementation of high quality digital learning; and,
- Continuing support to increase the statewide graduation rate.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2018

- Continued implementation Alaska's English Language Arts and Mathematics standards, moving all schools to more complete implementation of the standards:
- Implementation of the state assessments in the content standards, English Language Arts and Mathematics;
- Support school districts as they implement new ESSA requirements; and,
- Continue implementation of high school curriculum changes to best prepare students for APS eligibility.
