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Component: State System of Support

Contribution to Department's Mission

The mission of the State System of Support (SSoS) is to support school districts as they build their capacity to implement sustainable school improvement strategies with fidelity.

Core Services

• State system of support to increase school effectiveness.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2016

- Continued implementation of the framework, C3G (College, Career and Culturally Ready Graduates) for Alaska's English Language Arts and Mathematics standards, moving all schools from awareness and transition to the standards to full implementation;
- Sustained school and district designations for Priority, Focus, and Reward schools and tiered districts based upon Alaska School Performance Index (ASPI) school ranking system data from previous year as no new data was available to reset ASPI scores;
- Continued a Department of Education and Early Development (DEED) Liaison program to provide school improvement plan support to 84 1- and 2-star schools, including 16 priority schools and 28 focus schools; and,
- Teaching and Learning Support Institute (TSLI) provided support and collected input on moving forward with a state plan for implementation of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

Key Component Challenges

- Academic growth and proficiency for all students in reading, writing and math, and improving the graduation rate;
- Refine state assessments;
- Responding to ESSA through development of a state plan that includes school support measures;
- Maintain departmental structures, capacity, and resource base to support schools and districts in full implementation of all Alaska standards, staff evaluation systems, research-based instructional practices, positive behavioral instructional support systems, and community-based schooling;
- Providing adequate support for Priority and Focus schools;
- Providing dependable and established support to school and district improvement efforts;
- Maintaining support for implementation of all Alaska standards, including alignment and implementation of curriculum, instructional best practices, and formative and summative assessments;
- Continuing to sponsor professional development for the implementation of the content standards;
- The development of policies and procedures to incorporate sustainable school and district improvement is a complex undertaking. Districts will continue to seek assistance from the department for technical assistance; as well as, training and support for their educators on school improvement strategies; and,
- Districts and schools will seek assistance and support from the department in implementing aspects of ESSA, including asserting local control over issues most pertinent to their locale.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2018

- Implement the efficiency and effectiveness initiative which will encourage school districts to strengthen and expand innovative student learning opportunities through effective district-level partnerships;
- Continue phased implementation of high school curriculum changes to best prepare students for Alaska Performance Scholarship eligibility;
- Support school districts as they implement new teacher and principal evaluation systems to provide for a stronger teacher and leader workforce;
- Provide focused district and school improvement support services, and increasing concentration on effective

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reading and math programs; and,

Provide support for schools and districts in implementing ESSA requirements detailed in an upcoming state plan for ESSA.
