Major Component Accomplishments in 2016

Reports and Data Completed

In FY2016 (the latest year for which information is available), division staff completed 19 technical papers and special reports. In addition, the division completed updates from 46 communities to the statewide subsistence harvest information system.

The division's research program continued to be a key component of the department's efforts to understand declining Chinook salmon runs and the implications to subsistence users and uses of this resource. The division also provided critical subsistence harvest assessment and local and traditional knowledge for understanding special stock of seals that live in Illiamna Lake, and subsistence fish and/or wildlife harvests in Nunapitchuk, Point Lay, Wainwright, and Bering Sea communities. The division's information also contributed to recognizing customary and traditional subsistence uses of cormorants and snowy owls.

Research Efficiencies with Other Agencies

The division partnered with the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Trustee Council in three Prince William Sound communities (Chenega Bay, Tatitlek, and Cordova) to evaluate the status of the impact of the spill on natural resources. The division also completed comprehensive research in four Cook Inlet communities (Nikiski, which is inside a state nonsubsistence area, Seldovia, Nanwalek, and Port Graham) near the proposed terminus of a natural gas pipeline. Partnerships such as these increase efficiency in state government and stretch state dollars by providing research services to other departments without hiring third parties, while at the same time providing the division an opportunity to update its research data used by the boards of fisheries and game to meet their statutory obligations.

Fish and Game Boards Support

The Board of Fisheries and Board of Game continued to consider information provided by the Division of Subsistence as they deliberated on proposals for changes in hunting and fishing regulations. The division reviewed 387 proposals and agenda change requests, and provided information to the boards on customary and traditional uses. The division also provides information for consideration in determinations of amounts of fish and wildlife reasonably necessary for subsistence uses in several areas of the state. The Board of Fisheries acted on subsistence proposals primarily for the Southcentral and Southwest management areas as well as on statewide basis. The Board of Game addressed subsistence harvests and uses and Tier II hunts, primarily in the Southcentral and Southwest areas, but also in the Interior, Western and Arctic areas.

Special Assignments

The division provided information and analysis of subsistence information as follows:

- To the Federal Subsistence Board in providing the State of Alaska analysis and recommendations for proposals affecting subsistence uses of wildlife on federal public lands.
- To the North Pacific Fishery Management Council and the International Pacific Halibut Commission on uses
 of halibut for subsistence as part of their review and consideration of changes to subsistence halibut fishing
 regulations.
- To the Alaska Migratory Bird Co-Management Council on subsistence bird hunting and harvest estimation as part of their consideration of hunting regulations and harvest monitoring programs in different regions of the state. The U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service transferred the coordination of the council's harvest assessment program to the Division of Subsistence, including final harvest reports.
- To the Yukon River Panel. The division director serves as alternate co-chair of the U.S.-Canada Yukon River Panel, which is charged with implementing provisions and obligations of the Pacific Salmon Treaty with Canada. Other division staff participate as members of the scientific Joint Technical Committee of the Yukon Panel. The division also has a lead role with the Arctic-Yukon-Kuskokwim Sustainable Salmon Initiative, both on the Steering Committee and the Scientific Technical Committee.

Key Component Challenges

Acquisition of Customary and Traditional Harvest and Use Information

- The division will continue annual harvest monitoring for state subsistence salmon fisheries in key areas where harvest information is essential for management and regulatory decisions.
- The division will prioritize declining fiscal resources to ensure that essential scientific information is provided to the Board of Fisheries, Board of Game, fish and game managers, local fish and game advisory committees, Federal Subsistence Board, inter-tribal fish commissions, and the public for regulation and management of fish and wildlife for subsistence uses, consistent with state law and the sustained yield principle.
- The division will continue to serve the public from field office locations, although in a reduced capacity in

Interior and Arctic regions through seasonal relocation rather than permanent location, in order to facilitate acquisition of local ecological knowledge and traditional knowledge, both of which are key to better informed management.

Information Management, Analysis, and Dissemination

- The division will continue analyzing customary and traditional harvest and use information as it is acquired. Adequate funding is important to address subsistence concerns voiced by the public at Board of Fisheries and Board of Game meetings, as well as at other venues. Harvest data are maintained in separate databases by several divisions; however, subsistence harvest and use data are not compiled and analyzed in a comprehensive fashion to present to regulatory boards, policymakers, and the public. Due to budget reductions, on-demand analyses and presentations of comprehensive subsistence harvest information are not part of annual operations, and require reprogramming staff and funding from other core services to address issues as requested by boards and policymaking bodies.
- The division will, as resources allow, continue to analyze the impacts of, and provide information for, subsistence resource issues that may require regulatory actions due to climate change and food security, and continue to coordinate efforts with other departments and agencies to assist in potential regulatory responses in their arenas as necessary.
- The division will continue to assist the Board of Game and Board of Fisheries in reviewing customary and traditional uses and amounts reasonably necessary for subsistence (ANS) findings for fish stocks and game populations subject to subsistence uses, especially for species with management concerns or allocation issues.
- The division will continue to assist the department, other departments, and policymakers with the review and analysis of proposed lawsuits, legislation, legal challenges, Endangered Species Act proposed listings, and Environmental Impact Statements affecting customary and traditional uses of fish and wildlife resources by all Alaskans. This is an essential service, and, due to reduced resources, requires reprogramming staff and funding from core services in order to provide a rapid response to requests by the Department of Law, the Alaska State Legislature, and the Office of the Governor.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2018

The division anticipates the delivery of significant updates to subsistence research results from partnership projects with other state and federal agencies, including important updates to findings in communities along the proposed route of a natural gas pipeline, regional hub communities such as Bethel, and updates to local and traditional knowledge of Chinook salmon in statewide indicator stocks.
