Component: Community Developmental Disabilities Grants

Contribution to Department's Mission

Improve and enhance the quality of life for Alaskans impacted by developmental disabilities.

Core Services

- Provide grants to a statewide network of local agencies that provide a range of community based services to
 eligible Alaskans with a developmental disability, as defined in AS 47.80.900. Community Developmental
 disabilities grants provide basic supports and services based on an individual's specific needs so they can live
 independently in their homes and communities.
- Support short-term assistance and referral services (for 90 days or less) to avert a crisis or to allow the recipient to establish eligibility for generic public assistance benefit programs.
- Provide mini-grants (one-time awards) to individuals to meet unfilled health and safety needs.
- Provide various direct services intended to allow an individual to meet their habilitation needs in their homes and communities.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2016

- Through Community Developmental Disabilities Grants, addressed the needs of individuals with developmental disabilities for habilitation to enable the acquisition or maintenance of skills to live with independence and improved capacity.
- Provided Home and Community Based grant services to developmental disabilities beneficiaries who
 are not receiving services through one of our Medicaid waiver programs. Services were delivered in
 more than 902 individuals through the Community Developmental Disabilities grants and 909 individuals
 through the Short Term Assistance and Referral grants through 29 nonprofit grantee agencies.
- The division provided training to short-term assistance and referral programs and developmental
 disabilities providers so that individuals who are not seeking additional services do not add their names
 to the Developmental Disabilities Registry.

Key Component Challenges

- Availability of trained workforce for providing all home and community based services.
- Limitations in the Developmental Disabilities Registry impact the division's ability to plan, track, and monitor services delivered to recipients, as well as to examine client and provider activity from the initial application through services delivered.
- Reduced grant awards to providers have decreased the number of services hours available to recipients. In addition, the Short Term Assistance and Referral Grant no longer offer discretionary funds to individuals to assist with crisis needs.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2018

• The division will create 1915(c) Supports Waiver for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and will begin transitioning eligible grant recipients effective January 1, 2018.

Fiscal Note 53 - SB 74

In part, SB74 authorizes Department of Health and Social Services to apply for federal waivers and options to reform the Medicaid program and to assess the most cost-effective method for revising expansion coverage.

Section 36 charges the department with "reducing the cost of... senior and disabilities services provided to recipients of medical assistance under the state's home and community-based services waiver."

Section 38(d) (1) of the bill directs the Department to apply for the 1915(i) option under Medicaid.

Making use of the 1915(i) option offers the Department the opportunity to shift eligible recipients from 100% general funded grant programs to the 50% federal/50% general fund funded 1915(i) Medicaid option. Individuals receiving home and community-based services through the Community Developmental Disabilities Grant (CDDG) program must meet the definition of a person with a developmental disability presented in AS 47.80.900. The CDDG program provides home and community-based services to support individuals' desire to live as independently as they are able.

The department will use the 1915(i) funding option to refinance services provided through the Community Developmental Disabilities Grant program. 969
