Component: Anchorage Airport Operations

Contribution to Department's Mission

Ensure a safe, well-constructed, well-coordinated, environmentally-sound operating environment for air carriers and other airport tenants, general aviation, the traveling public, and employees. This section ensures that the airport and its tenants are in compliance with federal, state and airport regulations.

Core Services

- Perform daily airport landside and airside inspections; disseminate Notices to Airmen to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), air carriers and the public.
- Management and daily oversight of the requirements in the Airport Security Program, the Airport Certification Manual, the Surface Movement Guidance Control Plan, the Tarmac Delay Contingency Plan, and the Wildlife Hazard Management Plan.
- Provide construction coordination for all airport construction projects to include design reviews, phasing, FAR Part 139 Compliance, air traffic control coordination, coordinate with airlines, construction compliance monitoring and safety risk management participation.
- Conduct criminal history records checks, monitor airside and landside conditions, security compliance for tenants and airport users; implement procedures as necessary to ensure compliance; provide credentialing and training for badge applicants.
- Draft the Airport Security Program manual and disseminate as appropriate.
- Monitor land lease activity and tie-down parking for compliance.
- Provide general operational support to air carriers and the general aviation community.
- Monitor all airport landside activities, to include the public parking contract and commercial vehicle activity implementing procedures as necessary to ensure efficient and effective landside operations.
- Develop operations plans, monitor air operations activities and recognize, report and resolve aircraft operating problems.
- Coordinate all Transportation Security Administration required security measures and mandates such as inspections at sterile area access points and other secured areas on Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport property, including gates and fencing.
- Manage the unarmed security guard function.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2016

- Taxiways (TWY) Y/K DGVI Safety Area upgrade.
- Runway (RWY) 7L/25R Phase 2A/B reconstruction.
- Taxiway (TWY) T Phase T1 reconstruction.
- Runway (RWY) 7R/25L concrete mock up testing.
- Initial implementation of Gate Management System.
- Achieved compliance with FAA Order 5200.11, related to Safety Risk Management/Safety Management Systems.
- Accomplished Annual 139 Airport Certification Inspection with FAA.
- Conducted the annual Aviation Security Review with multiple government agencies and stakeholders.
- Conducted the annual Aviation Disaster Tabletop Exercise with multiple government agencies and stakeholders.
- · Participated in the first phase of designing and procuring a Statewide Identity Management System to consolidate, expedite and reduce the cost of badging employees at Alaska airports.
- Began first phase of designing and implementing a Remote Management System used for gate management of aircraft to include reserving, tracking and billing aircraft parking.

Key Component Challenges

 Design Group VI tarmac parking will become more challenging as airlines upgrade their fleets. New aircraft have significantly larger wingspan which will complicate the task of scheduling and parking these aircraft at gates that were originally designed for smaller aircraft.

- Planning/phasing of Runway 15/33 construction (2018). Major considerations are noise mitigation and impact to airport customers.
- Continued development and deployment of a statewide badge system. This will require significant effort and resources from local security coordinators and information technology staff.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2018

- Results Based Alignment will be used to fine tune performance measures that quantify outcomes (not activities), drive decision making, and determine program and service priorities.
- Participate in department-wide organizational review and implement organizational changes.

The Anchorage International Airport (AIA) Operations component requests increased authority to support the airport's Wildlife Hazard Management program and the unarmed security services contracts.

AIA has a contract with the United States Department of Fish and Wildlife for animal control on airport property. This service assists AIA in minimizing wildlife strike hazards to aircraft by providing wildlife hazard management. The contract provides the AIA with a wildlife biologist for 40 hours per week. The biologist implements wildlife deterrent techniques and methodologies and keeps a daily record of wildlife hazard management. Wildlife strikes to aircraft have increased over the past 20 years due to a combination of expanding populations of many wildlife species that are hazardous to aviation and an increasing number of aircraft movements. Airport operators are legally obligated to exercise "due diligence" in managing these wildlife hazards. Additional authority needed for the wildlife hazard management contract is \$130.0.

With the implementation of new Transportation Security Administration (TSA) requirements, the airport is now required to conduct some level of employee screening at sterile area access points in addition to TSA passenger screening checkpoints. It was determined to be more cost beneficial to contract these duties out rather than add them to the job duties of Airport Operations Officers or Airport Police and Fire personnel. These additional duties translate into an increase in labor hours for the contractor and an increase in expenditures to the airport to comply with the regulations, ensuring the safety of the traveling public. AIA requires \$370.0 of additional authority for the unarmed security services contract.
