Major Component Accomplishments in 2017

- Operations and management of 255 information technology systems, and management and tracking of 74 projects and 9 project requests.
- Met year to date requirements of the Office of Civil Rights (OCR) Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) Corrective Action Plan. Overall DHSS was able to reduce 81 percent of the security risks identified in the OCR risk assessment performed in January 2013.
- Updated IT Governance processes for project initiation, project handoff, decommission of legacy systems. Governance has moved to identify department and division priorities to address resource mapping challenges
- Roll out of Team Foundation Server, a demand and task tracking management system for Business Applications and the Project Management Office, Continued Team Foundation Server Enhancements which will generate more accurate accounting of staff time.
- Inventory of Applications/Systems, Project, and Services data updated for current support information and effort
- Operational improvements to tools and systems we already own to enhance and prepare our desktop deployment of Windows 10 which will occur with increased automation to reduce costs.
- Refreshed 25 percent of the Department of Health and Social Services desktop computers (1041)
- Investigated all reports of potential electronic protected health information compromises with a workload of about 45 incidents

- Working with the newly formed OIT to map out the new statewide IT organization and service delivery strategy

- Modifications to Public Assistance systems for determining eligibility for public assistance
- Identification of a significant number of systems for potential decommission based on division priorities.

Key Component Challenges

- With significant organizational changes within the State of Alaska in Information Technology Organization, maintaining critical service delivery, project management, application delivery, security and compliance will be a major challenge.
- Assure smooth transition from the current Alaska's Resource for Integrated Eligibility Services (ARIES) system contractor, Deloitte, to the department's internal Information Technology Services section for operations.
- Network Connectivity: Enhanced rural wide area network connectivity including increased bandwidth and wide area network acceleration technologies is needed to provide acceptable network performance for business users. The state has adopted bandwidth as a top five priority for the Department of Administration.
- Staffing: Recruitment and retention of professional staff continues to be a challenge. Providing a career path to retain staff with the existing state job classification system is problematic. Public sector compensation of information technology professionals has and will likely continue to lag private sector compensation well into the future. Supporting innovative and creative ideas will be the likely path to success. Flexibility in working schedule, professional development training, and stressing quality of life are highlighted in recruiting efforts to attract and retain information technology professionals.
- Security infrastructure is not keeping pace for adopting new technology. Additional resources (physical and capital) are needed to support customization of new technology for devices that have not yet been vetted for security.
- Effectively and efficiently delivering business outcomes.
- Expected increase in security and privacy incidents that will be reported and investigated under the new expanded Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) rules.
- Removing support of services and systems that are no longer considered Department of Health and Social Services priorities.
- Migration of end-of-life software and systems.
- Transition support of the new eligibility system from contractor to state staff.
- Telemedicine: Developing technology to assist with delivering health care to rural and remote locations that do not have, or have limited local health services.

- Division of Public Assistance (DPA) Integrate Childcare Information System (ICCIS) and case management system DPA Works – both systems are pointed at the Eligibility Information System (EIS) database. Modernizing these systems utilize a Microsoft SQL Database will be a challenge.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2019

- Major upgrade to State Medical Examiner’s Office (SMEO) Case Management system to eliminate security risks of unsupported technology was completed.
- Division of Public Health Epidemiology section sexually transmitted disease/human immunodeficiency virus (STD/HIV) case management and outreach program system (PRISM) integration with the Alaska e-Health Network (AeHN) Health Information Exchange to reduce overhead in lab results entry into PRISM.
- Division of Public Health enterprise registries solution to reduce cost of managing statutorily required registries and eliminate security risks of unsupported and insecure technology.
- Division of Senior and Disabilities Services Infant Learning Program (ILP) – Support transition of program from Office of Children’s Services to Senior and Disabilities Services.
- Division of Finance and Management Services “Grants Electronic Management System” (GEMS) – enhanced, results-based budgeting and accountability features.
- Division of Public Assistance Integrated Voice Response converted from old Tier Technology to new Enterprise Technology Services World Wide Technology standards. Anticipated implementation 11/30/2016.
- Maximize use of department Health Information Technology (HIT) expenditures through reuse of shared technology and business services.
- Alignment of business needs and business processes across divisions.
- Migration to a department enterprise, consumer-centric focus, moving away from siloed, program-specific perspectives.
- Migration toward an enterprise, Service Oriented Architecture (SOA), consistent with Medicaid Information Technology Architecture (MITA) and Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) Seven Conditions and Standards.
- Implementation of the Enterprise Roadmap Vision will provide the following benefits for the State of Alaska:
 - Strong oversight and governance of Information Technology acquisition projects
 - Improved Information Technology service model
 - Strengthened security oversight and measures
 - Standardized business services, available and accessible through cloud services
 - Consolidation of systems
 - Elimination of duplicate storage and unnecessary collection of data
