Department of Health and Social Services Youth Courts Component Budget Summary

### **Component: Youth Courts**

### **Contribution to Department's Mission**

This component provides funding for statewide youth court grants and rural community diversion panels across the state. These youth courts and community diversion panels provide early intervention and serve as a community-based diversion for youth who have been referred to juvenile probation on misdemeanor charges, District Court for status offenses, or school suspensions. The mission of the Division of Juvenile Justice is to hold juvenile offenders accountable for their behavior, promote the safety and restoration of victims and communities, and assist offenders and their families in developing skills to prevent crime. Youth courts and community diversion panels assist the division in carrying out this mission.

### **Core Services**

• Youth Courts provide front-end accountability for first and second-time low-level juvenile offenders.

### Major Component Accomplishments in 2017

In FY2017, funding was provided for nine youth court programs around the state: Anchorage, Juneau, Kenai, Ketchikan, Kodiak, Mat-Su, Nome, Fairbanks, and Valdez. In FY2017, a total of 224 new referrals were received: 39 from district court, 18 referrals from schools/unknown/other, and 167 new referrals from the Division of Juvenile Justice. Youth courts received referrals from the Division of Juvenile Justice for first- and second-time non-violent misdemeanor cases.

A total of 3,448 hours of community work service were ordered in FY2017, with 2,610 completed to date.

In June 2017, the statewide Youth Court Conference was held in Fairbanks; the conference hosted over 110 participants. The conference was coordinated by the Fairbanks Youth Court Director and youth members. The Division of Juvenile Justice's program coordinator and juvenile probation field staff participated in and supported workshops at the conference.

The Division of Juvenile Justice continues to increase collaboration and improved communication with youth court directors through quarterly teleconferences and the annual in-person director's meeting.

In 2017, the DJJ Program Coordinator organized board training by the Foraker group for all nine Youth Court programs on the roles and functions of non-profit boards.

### Client Successes

The Kenai Peninsula Youth Court Director reported on creative approaches to engaging youth in the school district in the Youth Court process. The Director shared that the team of volunteers conduct mock trials, and frequently have youth conduct a mock trial of Dr. Seuss' the Grinch as a way to incorporate discussion on restorative justice.

A youth who was an offender participated in the Youth Court process for his initial offense. He then went on to participate as a volunteer for several years. Recently, that same youth re-offended and opted to again participate in the Youth Court and has been invested in the process.

### **Key Component Challenges**

The major challenge continues to be expanding upon the existing services; standardizing youth court program forms, developing and implementing community diversion programs; and building infrastructure while ensuring sustainable services.

Program Unit turnover has created a lack of consistency in program guidance for the Directors.

### Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2019

Youth courts are required to have a formal Board of Directors training for their supporting board members. Division staff continue to work with the communities to provide training, resources and support.
