

# **State of Alaska FY2019 Governor's Operating Budget**

## **Department of Health and Social Services Emergency Programs Component Budget Summary**

## Component: Emergency Programs

### Contribution to Department's Mission

Sustain the emergency medical services system and trauma systems and ensure that public health and medical entities prepare for disasters.

### Core Services

- Ensure adequate and competent infrastructure for the emergency medical services (EMS) system.
- Reduce preventable death and disability from trauma.
- Mobilize and support public health and medical entities to prepare for natural disasters, mass casualty events, pandemic illness, and terrorist acts.
- Monitor, research, and evaluate service effectiveness, accessibility, and quality of the emergency medical services, trauma system, and disaster preparedness.

### Major Component Accomplishments in 2017

- Provided 183 trainings to approximately 2,274 individuals to respond to public health and medical disasters and active shooter events. The Trauma Unit provided bleeding control training to 1,500 first responders and other individuals. Law enforcement has credited bleeding control training with nine lives saved.
- Health Emergency Response Operations activated and staffed the Department of Health and Social Services emergency operations center for the *Frozen Contagion* full scale exercise testing and validating the ability to transport a highly infectious disease patient from a remote community to Anchorage for higher level of care.
- Renewed 2,087 prehospital providers, instructors and dispatchers and 56 of 102 licensed ground and air ambulance services.
- Coordinated 508 training courses that supported 3,629 licensed prehospital emergency medical responders.
- The Trauma program re-designated and verified 15 Level IV and 2 Level II trauma centers.
- The section began Project HOPE, funded by a Behavioral Health Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA) grant, to distribute the life-saving opioid reversal agent, naloxone. In FY2017, Project HOPE distributed 5,319 naloxone kits which individuals were trained to administer. The program also distributed 19,370 drug disposal bags, providing individuals with a means to safely dispose of opioids and other unused prescription medications.
- Alaska Trauma Registry responded to and completed 14 standing and 42 ad hoc data analysis requests to state, federal, and external agencies to expedite business processes, aid in reporting, and support program development.
- One hundred percent of small hospitals have pledged to participate in the Medicare Beneficiary Quality Improvement Project to improve the quality of care provided in critical access hospitals by increasing quality data reporting by critical access hospitals and then driving quality improvement activities based on the data.
- The Office of Healthcare Access administers a federal grant to fund 13 critical access hospitals for small hospital improvement activities centered on value-based purchasing investment activities, accountable care organization or shared savings investment activities, payment bundling or prospective payment system investment activities.
- The Office of Healthcare Access coordinates with stakeholders and critical access hospitals to promote quality reporting data for healthcare system improvement, operational and financial improvement, addressing community health needs and integrating emergency medical services, improving processes and efficiencies, and integration of innovative healthcare models.
- Alaska's SHARP Program has provided loan repayment and direct incentive payments for 254 healthcare practitioners to date. During SY2017 there were 145 clinicians under contract during at least part of the year.

### Key Component Challenges

- Local, state, and federal gaps identified in preparedness exercises will take years to fully address, and while the partnerships and commitment required to enhance emergency preparedness continue to strengthen, progress requires continued work with critical partners at local, state, federal, and non-governmental levels.

- Children require specialized medical equipment and treatment in emergencies and disasters. Health emergency response operations, trauma, and emergency medical services (EMS) continue efforts to leverage resources across systems to increase rural pediatric and trauma care, as well as Alaska's ability to meet the needs of children and other vulnerable populations in disasters.
- Coordinated and consistent trauma care is essential to improved patient outcomes. Support for Alaska's trauma infrastructure and hospital quality improvement programs, including integrating the emergency medical services system and prehospital providers into existing quality improvement programs, is essential to improve patient outcomes and the quality of care.
- Alaska's emergency medical services system must address the evolving and increasingly complex emergency medical services system, including sustainable funding for paid and volunteer services, enhanced training reflective of today's clinical advancements, implementation of national emergency medical services standards, and recruitment and retention through regulations, policies, procedures, and technology.

### **Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2019**

- Progress Report: The Sections of Emergency Programs and Health Planning and Systems Development merged in FY2017, linking functions that address overall healthcare capacity with the capacity to respond to disasters and providing seamless support across the continuum of care. Health Planning and Systems Development functions are now located in the Office of Healthcare Access within the integrated Section.
- Progress Report: The section began Project HOPE, distributed 5,319 naloxone kits which individuals were trained to administer to reverse the effects of opioids. The program also distributed 19,370 drug disposal bags, providing individuals with a means to safely dispose of opioids and other unused prescription medications.
- In FY2019, opioid response efforts will be under the Division of Public Health Director/Division of Health and Social Services Chief Medical Officer in the Office of Substance Misuse and Addiction Prevention.

Administrative Order 283, issued on February 16, 2017, directs all state agencies to initiate steps to combat Alaska's heroin and opioid epidemic. Transfer the following positions from multiple components within the Division of Public Health to Public Health Administrative Services to support Administrative Order 283 and establish the Office of Substance Misuse and Addiction Prevention (OSMAP), under the Chief Medical Officer in the Division of Public Health. These positions will coordinate and ensure collaboration among agencies and stakeholders, including tribal and non-governmental organizations, in addressing substance misuse.

This position will serve as a subject matter expert on opioids, marijuana, and alcohol for internal and external entities, with roles in grant-seeking and management.

06-1941 - A full-time, range 22, Anchorage Emergency Program Manager II (06-1941) is being transferred from Emergency Programs to become a full-time, range 22, Anchorage Emergency Program Manager II (06-1941) in Public Health Administrative Services. This position will serve as the Director of the Office of Substance Misuse and Addiction Prevention (OSMAP).

06-1999 - A full-time, range 14, Anchorage Administrative Assistant II (06-1999) is being transferred from Emergency Programs to become a full-time, range 14, Anchorage Administrative Assistant II (06-1999) in Public Health Administrative Services. This position will provide clerical support for the Office of Substance Misuse and Addiction Prevention (OSMAP).

Transfer uncollectable interagency receipt authority from Emergency Programs to Public Health Administrative Services to support reimbursable services agreements for opioid response.
