Department of Labor and Workforce Development Special Projects Component Budget Summary

Component: Special Projects

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Special Projects component contributes to the department's mission by seeking out new and innovative programs that will enhance and support providing services to individuals with disabilities to obtain and maintain employment.

Core Services

- Seek federal funding for innovative projects that address individual needs in support of their employment goals.
- Provide supported employment services to individuals with the most significant disabilities to enter or retain competitive employment.
- Issue grants to non-profit organizations to administer the referral of sign language interpreters for deaf and hard-of-hearing individuals.
- Provide a comprehensive statewide program of technology related assistance for individuals with disabilities.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2017

During FY2017, the Special Projects component:

- Helped the Regulatory Commission of Alaska make legislative changes so that telecommunication relay service surcharges could be used to provide modern assistive technology to Alaskans who are deaf, hard-of-hearing, or speech-disabled. Previously, only older outdated equipment was allowed.
- Leveraged matching funds for Matsu-Health Foundation to start a new program that coordinates funding
 opportunities to acquire Assistive Technology (AT) for Alaskans. The new program has helped 33 Alaskans
 with disabilities find funding for AT.
- Provided specialized services to 197 blind and visually impaired individuals in rural and remote communities.
 Specialized services and training included low vision assessments, blindness sensitivity training, independent living skills, and orientation and mobility instruction.
- Provided Supported Employment services to 86 individuals with a most significant disability, with 28 of those being youth. The number of individuals served decreased in the last year due to stricter federal requirements on use of Supported Employment funds.
- Served 24 youth through Project SEARCH at four hospitals (Mat-Su Regional Medical Center, Central Peninsula Hospital, Providence Medical Center, and Fairbanks Memorial Hospital). Fourteen of those individuals are now working in competitive integrated employment.

Key Component Challenges

The Special Projects component is challenged with improving access to educational material for rural students with a learning, vision, or mobility impairment in order to decrease dropout rates due to costly travel and the need for adequate awareness and training.

Another challenge is helping state systems to incorporate or improve access to needed assistive technology devices and services for youth transitioning from school to post-secondary education/employment.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2019

No significant changes in results to be delivered are anticipated.
