Department of Law Labor and State Affairs Component Budget Summary

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Component: Labor and State Affairs

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Labor and State Affairs section provides advice and representation concerning the management of state government, government finance, education, personnel, retirement and benefits, workforce, community and economic development, elections, and other government functions. Primary recipients of the section's legal services include the Offices of the Governor and Lieutenant Governor; Departments of Administration, Education and Early Development, Health and Social Services, Labor and Workforce Development, Commerce, Community and Economic Development, Military and Veteran's Affairs; the Alaska Court System; and quasi-government entities such as the Alaska Permanent Fund Corporation, Alaska Energy Authority, the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority, the Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute, and many boards and commissions.

Core Services

- Provides legal assistance needed for governmental management, including budget, public finance, personnel and labor relations, civil rights, procurement and contract claims, retirement and benefits programs, investment of treasury and Permanent Fund Corporation funds, and homeland security.
- Provides legal assistance for problems associated with institutional relationships within state government, separation of powers issues between the three branches of government, and interaction between the state and local governments and the state and federal government.
- Provides legal advice and representation on issues associated with voter initiatives, the conduct of elections, campaign finance laws, education matters, workers' compensation and employment security, occupational safety, wage and hour, employment programs, municipal grants, local boundary issues, and revocation of driver licenses.
- Provides legal advice to public corporations such as the Alaska Permanent Fund Corporation, Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority, Alaska Energy Authority, and the Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute.
- Represents the state, state officials and state agencies in administrative, state and federal litigation on all of the above issues.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2017

• Advised the Office of the Lieutenant Governor regarding the certification of four ballot measures:

(1) "An Act providing for protection of wild salmon and fish and wildlife habitat" (17FSHB2): provided legal review and written recommendation to decline certification of a ballot measure on the grounds that it made an unlawful appropriation and usurped legislature's authority, and represented the Lieutenant Governor in subsequent litigation challenging the denial of certification in *Stand for Salmon v. Mallot*, Case No. 3AN-17-9183CI;

(2) "Healthcare for Alaskans Act of 2018" or "An Act relating to Alaska's Medicaid and Denali KidCare (17CHAK): provided comprehensive legal review and written recommendation to certify measure that purports to keep Medicaid and Denali KidCare eligibility levels as they are today and ensure that hospitals and doctors continue to receive adequate reimbursement;

(3) "Quality Health Insurance for Alaskans Act of 2018" or "An Act relating to health insurance" (17QHIA): provided comprehensive legal review and recommended certification of health care-related initiative, which purports to ensure that quality, comprehensive health insurance coverage continues to be made available on a non-discriminatory basis to all Alaskans by preserving these protections in state law; and,

(4) "An Act relating to government accountability to the People of the State of Alaska" (17AKGA): provided legal review and recommended certification of an initiative that would prevent legislators from collecting a per diem if they don't pass a budget, enact conflicts of interest provisions in legislative voting, and enact campaign finance reform measures.

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- Assisted the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA) with modifying the terms of a \$30 million loan to BlueCrest Energy, Inc. which was used to finance the purchase and transport of a high horsepower drilling rig now in place and drilling near Anchor Point, Alaska. Advised AIDEA regarding its investment in the development of an oil processing facility for the Mustang oil field and helped AIDEA and Brooks Range Petroleum Corporation, the field operator, put a "bridge" financing plan in place to re-work an existing well on the field and get it into immediate production. The "bridge" financing plan also involved AIDEA getting control over the Mustang road and pad on the North Slope as a means of making it available to others working to develop oil and gas prospects in the area. Represented AIDEA in transactional matters involving the potential sale of Pentex Alaska Natural Gas Company, LLC, which is the parent company of the natural gas utility in Fairbanks. AIDEA previously acquired Pentex in furtherance of the Interior Energy Project, a transaction that enabled AIDEA to immediately lower the gas rates charged to Fairbanks homeowners by 13%. Represented AIDEA in negotiating and drafting a long-term financing agreement with the Interior Gas Utility that, once finalized, will the utility to expand natural gas supplies for Interior Alaska. Also provided ongoing advice to AIDEA on issues regarding development of the Ambler Mining District access road.
- Provided extensive legal advice and representation to the Department of Administration (DOA), Division of Retirement and Benefits, in numerous health and benefits appeals and coverage issues under the state's health care plans.
- Representing the Department of Transportation, Alaska Marine Highway System (AMHS) in a federal lawsuit challenging AMHS's alleged failure to appropriately credit AMHS employees with rotating week on/week off schedules for Family Medical Leave Act leave.
- Provided legal advice and representation to numerous state agencies on contracts, leasing and procurement, including complex IT software development contracts.
- Representing the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development in a case filed by Fairbanks North Star Borough challenging the Department's 2016 determination of the full and true value of the taxable property within the borough.
- Provided legal advice and representation to the state in various administrative, trial and appellate matters regarding personnel matters, employment disputes, and labor law.

Key Component Challenges

- The loss of six attorneys and one paralegal since 2015 has put strains on the section's ability to meet its ongoing advisory and advocacy duties.
- A significant amount of time is devoted to providing legal advice associated with budget and appropriation issues; due to the current budget crisis, this work is expected to continue and possibly increase.
- A significant amount of time will continue to be devoted to assisting DOA with defending appeals filed against the state's active and retiree health and benefit plans and assisting the Division of Retirement and Benefits with responses to questions about the various health and pension plans.
- The section will continue to advise the Office of the Lieutenant Governor and the Division of Elections in elections matters, and litigate elections-related challenges in both state and federal court.
- AIDEA remains involved in numerous development projects statewide, including the Interior Energy Project, which is intended to bring additional sources of natural gas to interior Alaska and to expand the natural gas distribution system located there. Substantial legal assistance will be required as AIDEA completes negotiations to secure increased supplies of natural gas for interior Alaska and to build out the supply chain to deliver the gas to consumers. The Interior Energy Project will continue to require significant work with AIDEA in seeking to create a single combined natural gas utility for the entire Fairbanks and North Pole service areas. AIDEA will also need assistance in handling its investment in the Mustang oil field, an independent oil and gas development on the North Slope that is expected to put additional oil into the Trans Alaska Pipeline System.

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- The section continues to handle a large volume of legal work related to procurement protests and contract claims for professional services, supplies and leasing.
- The section continues to experience an increase in cases filed against the Workers' Compensation Benefits Guaranty Fund and cases brought by the Alaska Occupation Safety & Health section, as well as an increase in the overall cases in which the section represents various divisions in the Department of Labor and Workforce Development (DOLWD).
- The section devotes significant time to assisting agencies with increasing requests for new regulations projects and legislative issues.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2019

The state's current fiscal climate and the ensuing pressure to reduce government operational costs continue to create a host of legal issues. Specifically, state agencies need ongoing legal advice on drafting budget legislation, implementing the operating budget and other appropriations bills, and addressing appropriations, funding, and labor and employment issues. The section provides legal advice on these and other issues, including matters related to a potential government shutdown, to the Office of Management and Budget, Office of the Governor, Department of Revenue and the Department of Administration. Given the current economic outlook, client needs in these areas are expected to increase significantly in FY2019.

The section also expects a continuing spike in retirement and benefits appeals and DOLWD-related casework, particularly in the area of the Workers' Compensation Benefits Guaranty Fund cases and Alaska Occupational Safety & Health actions.
