At the Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport (ANC), the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) recognizes the need to address the poor pavement conditions of runway 15/33 and maintain the safety and efficiency of airport operations. The project will rehabilitate runway 15/33 (the north/south runway), widen the runway, and update taxiway geometry to meet FAA standards. In addition, runway 15/33's aging pavement will be repaired. All improvements will occur on airport property. In order to complete this work, the 15/33 runway will need to be closed to operations for 1 or 2 construction seasons, starting in 2018. Air traffic will be shifted to the east-west runways during construction.
