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Brief Summary and Statement of Need:

Upgrading the State’s Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system is a critical necessity. Support for the current version ends in December 2019. The State has funding to begin the upgrade to 4.X now, but needs the remaining funding to complete the upgrade. The Department of Administration currently has approximately \$4.5M for this project and a \$7.1M increment is needed to successfully implement this project.

Project Description/Justification:

Upgrading the State's ERP software is of critical importance. Support for the current version ends 12/31/2019. Funding is available to start the upgrade. However, the remaining amount is needed to complete the upgrade. Department of Administration, Division of Finance, has \$4.5M to begin the project, the remaining \$7.1M is needed to finish it.

An upgrade to the software will provide increased functionality in the following areas:

1. A modernized user experience provides the ability to tailor the application based on a user's role.
2. Extensibility allows Division of Finance to more easily tailor IRIS to Alaska's unique business requirements. This, combined with the enhanced user experience, together are expected to increase efficiency and reduce error rates with simple screens, streamlined data entry and marking key fields as required.

3. Robotic Process Automation will allow repeatable tasks to be executed without human intervention.
