Department of Fish and Game Boards of Fisheries and Game Component Budget Summary

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Component: Boards of Fisheries and Game

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Boards Support Section facilitates an effective board and public process for the state's fish and wildlife regulatory system.

Core Services

- Ensure citizens participating in the fish and game regulatory process have clear and helpful information in advance to engage effectively.
- Provide and support an environment for board members to make effective decisions.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2019

The Board of Fisheries held regulatory meetings in 2018/2019 for finfish regulations in Bristol Bay, Alaska Peninsula, Chignik, Aleutian Islands, and Arctic/Yukon/Kuskokwim areas; Pacific cod in Bering Sea-Aleutian Islands, Chignik, and Alaska Peninsula; and statewide finfish regulations. In addition to the regularly scheduled meetings, the Board of Fisheries held a two-day work session, three committee meetings and one emergency meeting to consider six petitions. Board of Fisheries members met for 24 days and addressed over 180 regulatory proposals.

The Board of Game held two regulatory meetings in the 2018/2019 cycle, addressing over 150 proposals concerning changes to hunting and trapping regulations for the southeast and southcentral regions. The board held a one-day work session in conjunction with its first regulatory meeting, and one non-regulatory teleconference meeting to consider agenda change requests. There were no other meetings this cycle to address petitions or other business, or to hold committee meetings.

The Joint Board of Fisheries and Game (Joint Board) held a three-day meeting to review regulations for local fish and game advisory committees and the boards' process for adopting regulations. The Joint Board adopted 22 of 40 proposals, making improvements and clarifications to these regulations. The Joint Board also agreed Joint Board regulatory meetings should occur approximately every five years to consider the above-mentioned regulations, and every ten years to address regulations concerning subsistence uses. In addition to the regulatory meeting, the Joint Board met via teleconference in January 2019 for the commissioner nomination process in accordance with the responsibilities under AS 44.39.030.

Key Component Challenges

Alaska's Boards of Fisheries and Game and Advisory Committees are established to ensure the public has a voice in the utilization and management of Alaska's fish and game resources. The structure utilizes local Advisory Committees, there are 84 across the state, to meet and discuss proposals submitted to the Boards and facilitating their presence at board meetings to communicate their opinions. The meetings are public meetings that allow Alaskans the opportunity to voice their opinions, concerns and suggestions. However, this structure does have a financial cost. The department's ability to bring citizens to the table, in order to guarantee their ability to be heard, can be a challenge as budgets are reduced. This said, ensuring Alaskans continue to have a voice at the table remains to be a department priority.

During the 2019/2020 board meeting cycle, the Boards of Fisheries and Game will hold nine meetings for a total of 45 days. The number of proposals to be addressed by both boards is over 400.

Board of Fisheries members will consider over 275 regulatory proposals during this meeting cycle, which include fisheries in Kodiak, Upper and Lower Cook Inlet areas, and statewide king and tanner crab (excluding southeast/Yakutat). The board will hold four regulatory meetings along with its annual work session. Meeting locations are Anchorage, Seward, and Kodiak.

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Component — Boards of Fisheries and Game

Major challenges for the Board of Fisheries include issues related to the Upper Cook Inlet finfish meeting. The region is home to several mixed stock fisheries that impact Alaska's largest population base, creating many of the most contentious allocation battles in the state. The 14-day meeting generates several major reports and hundreds of public comments related to over 170 proposals. The Kodiak finfish meeting is expected to reignite controversy over past management measures designed to minimize Kodiak fleet interception of Cook Inlet bound sockeye salmon. The board also faces challenges related to changing ocean conditions and its impact on fishery stock abundance.

The Board of Game will hold a one-day work session and two regulatory meetings this fiscal year to review over 160 regulatory proposals concerning changes to hunting and trapping regulations for the western, Arctic, and interior regions of Alaska. The board will also meet via teleconference to address annual out of cycle requests. Locations for the board meetings are Nome and Fairbanks.

Ongoing challenges the board faces include addressing concerns related to overcrowding and user conflicts, permit allocation for residents and nonresidents, and actions by the Federal Subsistence Board such as closing areas to nonqualified hunters and enacting regulations that do not align state regulations. Both the board and department are challenged with addressing the introduction and spread of disease by non-native species to indigenous species, especially Alaska's wild sheep and goats. The Board of Game also anticipates the completion of a Legislative Audit that was requested in April of 2015. The audit evaluated whether the board followed the established procedures and whether the board complied with state laws.

The boards' ability to travel and meet in person for committee and other meetings, which help inform board members of issues that arise, continues to be a key component challenge given cost constraints.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2021

In the 2020/2021 meeting cycle, the Board of Fisheries will address finfish and shellfish fisheries in Prince William Sound, southeast, and Yakutat, along with all other shellfish statewide. The total number of projected meeting days is 28. The number of proposals is determined after the proposal deadline in April 2020.

The Board of Game will hold two regulatory meetings in 2020/2021 to address hunting and trapping regulations for the central/southwest region and statewide provisions. The board will hold a one-day work session in conjunction with the first regulatory meeting and will meet in the fall via teleconference to consider agenda change requests. The total number of meeting days is expected to be 18. The number of proposals will be determined after the May 1, 2020 proposal deadline.
