Major Department Accomplishments in 2019

Statewide Salmon Harvest, Fishery Value, and Stock Status Improvements

The 2019 commercial salmon fishery's all-species harvest was approximately 206.9 million fish with an estimated preliminary ex-vessel value of approximately \$657.6 million, a 10 percent increase from 2018's value of \$595.2 million. This is a tremendous return on investment on less than \$20 million general funds used to manage Alaska's salmon fisheries.

Of this total, sockeye salmon accounted for approximately 64 percent of the total value at \$421.1 million and 27 percent of the harvest at 55.2 million fish. Chum salmon accounted for 10 percent of the value at \$63.8 million and 9 percent of the harvest at 18.5 million fish. Pink salmon accounted for approximately 20 percent of the value at \$128.6 million, and 62 percent of the harvest at 129.1 million fish. Coho salmon accounted for approximately 5 percent of the

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value at \$29.6 million and 2 percent of the harvest at 3.8 million fish. The Chinook salmon harvest was estimated to be just under 0.3 million fish with an estimated preliminary ex-vessel value of \$14.4 million. The estimates of value are based on preliminary ex-vessel prices and do not include any post season bonuses paid to fishermen.

The 2019 Prince William Sound pink salmon season (including hatchery contribution) contributed the most fish to the statewide total harvest with 49.3 million pink salmon harvested. The 2019 Bristol Bay sockeye salmon season contributed the most to the statewide total value with \$303.9 million (42.9 million sockeye salmon harvested). The department expends less than \$2 million general fund in managing this lucrative fishery. In terms of pounds of fish, the all species salmon harvest of 872.1 million pounds ranks 8th in the 1975-2018 time series.

In 2018, the Norton Sound Golovin and Elim chum salmon stock of yield concern designation was discontinued because of improved stock status in the past 5 years.

2019 was the fifth consecutive year the Bristol Bay sockeye salmon inshore run has exceeded 50 million fish, and 2020 is projected to approach this benchmark.

In Norton Sound, the coho salmon commercial harvest was the fourth highest in history, and the past three years' harvests have all been among the five best on record. The chum salmon commercial harvest was the third highest in the last 35 years. The sockeye salmon commercial harvest, although a small portion of the overall harvest, was the highest in history. The pink salmon run was one of the greatest runs recorded for an odd-numbered year and pink salmon escapements had records at several salmon counting projects. No commercial fishing targeting Chinook salmon was allowed, but the run was much better than expected and the harvest of nearly 1,400 fish was the highest in 20 years. In Kotzebue Sound, the chum salmon harvest was the seventh best on record and the fourth time the harvest has exceeded 400,000 fish in the past five years.

While many of Alaska's Chinook salmon stocks remain in poor health, 2019 saw improved returns for several key stocks including large returns to the Kuskokwim and Copper rivers that exceeded escapement objectives, North Alaska Peninsula Chinook salmon returns were double the most recent 10-year average, and the number of Chinook salmon escapement goals met in Upper Cook Inlet and Southeast Alaska increased compared to 2018.

New Fishery Development

Department staff have worked closely with stakeholders in southeast Alaska to develop a new fishery for hagfish. The fishery currently has a guideline harvest level of 120,000 pounds and all research, stock assessment, and management is undertaken collaboratively with stakeholders. This is the first new commercial fishery developed in Alaska in any years.

Implementation of the Pacific Salmon Treaty

2019 represented the first year implementing the newly renegotiated Pacific Salmon Treaty. Troll and gillnet fisheries were managed within established allocations. The seine fishery exceeded its allocation but because the overall fishery was within its allocation, there will not be a payback during the 2020 fishery. The fishery was also managed to reduce intercept of Chinook salmon stocks identified as stocks of concern. This strategy successfully reduced intercept of these stocks while focusing harvest on other treaty stocks.

Sustaining Fishing Opportunities

The department continued to conduct many quantitative stock assessment projects (weirs, counting towers, and aerial surveys) statewide to provide objective in-season data. This data is key for informed decision-making to provide fishing opportunities and to manage stocks for sustained yield.

Area Managers issued a total of 105 Emergency Orders and Advisory Announcements during 2019 that either restricted or liberalized fisheries, and 47 Advisory Announcements that informed the public of fishing opportunities during the season. Opportunities for sockeye salmon fishing were liberalized in the Redoubt Bay/Lake, Chilkoot River, Fish Creek, Resurrection Bay, Saltery Cove, Buskin, Wood, Nushagak-Mulchatna, Naknek, Alagnak, Togiak, Kenai, Kasilof, Russian, and Copper rivers. The Upper Cook Inlet personal use fishery for sockeye salmon was liberalized as well, providing a four-day opening at 24 hours per day whereas it would have been open 6:00 am – 11:00 pm. Chilkoot River coho salmon and Valdez area pink salmon were liberalized for much of the 2019 run.

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In the department's ongoing efforts to simplify complex regulations, 10 staff proposals were submitted to the Alaska Board of Fisheries, all were adopted. Division staff in interior and southcentral regions operated a booth at the Great Alaska Sportsman's Show and the Fairbanks Outdoor Show to answer questions on regulations, fisheries management, and fishing opportunities. Staff held meetings with various sport fishing groups in southeast Alaska to discuss conservative management actions needed to achieve Chinook salmon escapement goals in 2019.

Rockfish Management Initiative

Research projects conducted in collaboration with the Division of Sport Fish and Division of Commercial Fisheries have helped inform development of management strategies for black and yelloweye rockfish in the Gulf of Alaska. In FY2020, the divisions continued to host internal workshops regarding management issues and stock assessment needs for groundfish species, primarily yellow and black rockfish. Given growing concerns over stock status, the divisions continue to engage state and federal agency staff with rockfish management expertise, reviewing, and if appropriate, modifying management strategies and collaboratively exploring stock assessment needs.

Managing for Subsistence Harvest Priority

After ensuring sustainability, providing subsistence harvest opportunity is the department's highest priority. This is accomplished several ways. When fisheries must be restricted for conservation purposes, subsistence fisheries are the last to be restricted. While in times of abundance subsistence, fisheries operate with few restrictions, and other fisheries continue under close management based on abundance. For example, in 2019 subsistence salmon fisheries were liberalized on the Kuskokwim River in response to improved Chinook salmon abundance and strong returns of other salmon species. The department maintains open dialog with subsistence users to understand how best to meet subsistence needs.

Defending Against Federal Erosion of State Management Authority

The Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act (ANILCA) and Access Defense programs, and the Threatened, Endangered, and Diversity Program (TED) are cost effective approaches to address federal management issues. The ANILCA Program asserts and defends the authority of the department for management of fish and wildlife on all lands in Alaska and maintains public access and use of federal public lands. The TED program works to conserve wildlife species before they become threatened or endangered, to recover species already imperiled, and to keep common species common. The program administers the State's response to the Endangered Species Act (ESA) by providing resources, expertise, and coordination among agencies (e.g., Department of Law and Department of Natural Resources) with the goal of conserving wildlife and avoiding unwarranted regulations. Last year's major successes by these programs include:

- 1) Worked with Alaska Department of Law on briefs supporting the plaintiff in *Sturgeon v Frost.* The Supreme Court ruled unanimously in favor of Mr. Sturgeon, thereby ensuring that the state will continue to manage state owned navigable waterways within federal lands in Alaska.
- 2) Worked with the Alaska Department of Law, North Slope Borough, and others to petition the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to remove ringed seals from the ESA list.
- 3) Worked with the Alaska departments of Natural Resources and Law to ensure the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service had the appropriate information to appropriately determine that listing of yellow-cedar under the ESA was not warranted.

Continued Heightened Disease Surveillance

The Wildlife Health and Disease Surveillance program continued its elevated disease surveillance for all pathogens including the bacteria *Mycoplasma ovipneumoniae* in Alaska's wildlife. This has enabled the department to better understand the distribution of this pathogen, which was not previously known to occur in Alaska's wildlife. In the lower 48, the pathogen has been associated with large population declines in some bighorn sheep populations. The Division of Wildlife Conservation involved hunters in active surveillance that resulted in nearly 700 additional hunter-harvested Dall's sheep, mountain goats, moose and caribou sampled via nasal swabs for screening.

Facilities Maintenance

During FY2019, the Division of Administrative Services addressed deferred facility maintenance issues around the state and provided emergency response assistance as needed including the Anchorage Regional Compound earthquake. Projects included: major reconstruction and renovation of the Dutch Harbor and Yakutat bunkhouses,

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electrical renovations to the King Salmon compound, repair and maintenance of the Stikine cabin. Multiple projects in the Fairbanks Regional Office which include replacing a dated phone system, digital heating system controls, head bolt heaters, and security upgrades were all completed. Additionally, the Taku river cabin was repaired and the solar generation system was replaced.

Licensing

Most license vendors have transitioned from paper formatted license sales to utilizing the department's electronic vendor sales system, eVendor. eVendor provides hunting and fishing licenses in an efficient and cost-effective manner. This transition has significantly decreased manual data entry and allows the department to capture accurate data immediately, which is of considerable benefit to resource management and wildlife enforcement. It is a simple and user-friendly application that produces a license. eVendor has the capacity to provide/produce a wide variety of Fish and Game products for hunters and anglers. Existing paper products are continuously being added to the eVendor catalog.

The department will soon be introducing an electronic signature feature for hunters and anglers who would like to carry and display their licenses on an electronic device. The process for this feature is currently being enhanced to allow licensees to legally attest to their licenses online. Licensing is currently working with IT to improve the simplicity of this process and the display of licenses on electronic devices.

In FY2019, license and tag revenues increased by \$1.9M from FY2018. Approximately 730,000 licenses, stamps and tags were issued to hunters and anglers, of which 61 percent were issued electronically. The department anticipates the percentage of electronic sales to increase to roughly 80 percent in FY2021, considering that non electronic sales will continue to occur in remote areas and other instances of poor to no internet connectivity.

Key Department Challenges

Maintaining Return on Investment with Reduced Funding

Alaska's fish and wildlife resources are managed as a sustainable and renewable resource to provide current and future economic and social benefits for all Alaskans. Economic information has been gathered that shows the Department of Fish and Game turns a \$197 million dollar investment (the department's budget), into a return of over \$11 billion dollars annually. This illustrates the significant returns yielded from investments in the department's budget.

Well managed fish and wildlife resources produce more jobs and economic value than any other sector of the economy. Tens of thousands of jobs and hundreds of small businesses rely on activities and opportunities associated with Alaska's fish and wildlife resources. Alaska has the most valuable commercial fishing industry in the nation; is the foundation of Alaska's booming tourism industry; provides world class hunting, sport fishing, and wildlife viewing opportunities; and supports an unequaled subsistence culture and economy. Harvest opportunities are also provided for Alaskans, which is critical to feeding families and to passing on important traditions.

Reduced budgets challenge the department's ability to continue to provide this high rate of return. Since FY2015, the department has sustained a 35 percent reduction in unrestricted general funds. The impact of these reductions has been partially mitigated by additional revenue from federal funds, fish and game funds, test fish receipts, and other sources. Reduced funding impacts the department's ability to gather necessary data on fish and wildlife resources to manage for sustained yield, while maximizing the harvestable surplus of species important to Alaskans. Less precise information forces the department to err on the side of conservation which leads to more conservative species management, thereby reducing harvest opportunity and economic benefit to the state. The department is focusing on efficiencies across all divisions to minimize direct impacts on programs, but at these reduction levels, program impacts are unavoidable. Every effort is being made to prioritize the most critical programs and activities based on available funding.

Federal Funding

The department derives over a third of its budget from federal funds. Primary sources include:

• Sport Fish Restoration Program – Dingell/Johnson (DJ) funds in the Division of Sport Fish

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- Wildlife Restoration Program Pittman/Robertson (PR) funds in the Division of Wildlife Conservation, and
- Fisheries and marine mammal funding from the U.S. Department of Commerce, National Marine Fisheries Service in the Divisions of Commercial Fisheries and Wildlife Conservation.

Wildlife Restoration funding has been dramatically increasing, creating challenges to meet the required match, while other federal sources have been flat or declining, making it increasingly difficult to find replacement funds to cover reductions in general funds. In addition, stipulations on federal funds sometimes makes it difficult to address state specific issues.

Implementation of the Pacific Salmon Treaty

The recently renegotiated Pacific Salmon Treaty places new obligations on the state in terms of fishery monitoring and management. As part of the signatory of the Treaty, it was anticipated that the state would receive new funds to fulfill its commitments. Unfortunately, these new funds have yet to materialize, placing an unfunded mandate on the State of Alaska. The department are working to fulfill the promises made at the federal level and remain optimistic that the federal government will fulfill its promises in the future as well.

Federal Groundfish Fisheries

The North Pacific Fishery Management Council (NPFMC) has several initiatives underway that affect state managed fisheries and distribution of benefits from the harvest of federally managed fishery resources of Alaska. These include transitioning from fixed halibut bycatch limits in the Bering Sea to bycatch limits linked to halibut abundance; ongoing modifications to the federal groundfish observer program, including expanded use of electronic monitoring, to improve quality and utility of observer data; consideration of a cooperative style rationalization program for Bering Sea/Aleutian Islands Pacific cod trawl catcher vessels; and modifying the federal management plan for salmon to include discrete areas currently managed by the State of Alaska. State managers and researchers must work through the NPFMC process to develop programs that provide stability for fishery participants and communities, while meeting NPFMC objectives and complying with the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act.

Hatchery Production

Bonds to pay back the capital costs associated with the construction of the William Jack Hernandez and Ruth Burnett Sport Fish Hatcheries are expected to be paid off in 2021. Funds used to pay off the debt have come from a surcharge for hatchery bond payments on all sport fishing licenses. By statute, once the bonds are paid, the surcharge sunsets. An additional use of the surcharge has been to pay for releases of hatchery Chinook and coho salmon in southeast Alaska. These stocking programs will be directly impacted by the sunset of the hatchery surcharge. In addition, operation of the two sport fish hatcheries and necessary maintenance will be a challenge with the loss of the surcharge.

Defending Against Federal Erosion of State Management Authority

Various federal actions related to the Endangered Species Act and the Marine Mammal Protection Act are challenging state authority to manage and are impacting the state's ability to develop its resources. These include polar bear incidental take authorization, designations of vast expanses of critical habitat for humpback whales, killer whales, and ice seals, and petitions to list a wide range of species. The department will continue its efforts to provide information, challenge unwarranted actions, and conduct needed research.

Sustaining Fishing Opportunities

Timely reporting of charter logbook information for halibut and salmon are required to meet the state's international treaty obligations. This has become more challenging with the repeal of the saltwater charter license that provided funding for these needs. As a result, the Division of Sport Fish has had to re-prioritize work to ensure that these needs are being met. The department supports reinstitution of the saltwater charter license program as a means of providing funding to meet these needs. The department is also examining means to functionally move from a paper logbook to an electronic logbook, which would improve timeliness of reporting.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2021

The main areas of focus for the Department of Fish and Game in FY2021 will be:

• Restoring open communication and dialogue with Alaskans, increasing public trust

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- Protecting the state's right to manage
- Ensuring increased food security for Alaskan families
- Maximizing economic and social benefits
- Continuing to look for budget efficiencies

Fishery Disasters

In 2016, the pink salmon runs in the Gulf of Alaska were some of the smallest on record. A request for federal disaster assistance was approved in 2017 and funding was made available in 2019. Distribution of funds has been difficult due to reporting and administrative issues. The department hopes to have funds distributed in early 2020 to impacted entities. The department is employing a lessons-learned strategy as it develops implementation programs for Gulf of Alaska cod and Chignik sockeye salmon disasters, for which the department expects to receive federal funding next year.

Information Technology

The department continues to transition license vendors to the eVendor system, which enables the license vendors to sell licenses, tags, and permits electronically, reducing the use of paper licenses. New tools and workflow aimed at increasing adoption of the eVendor tool with existing paper-based vendor base will continue to be investigated. The department has also added several new products to the Online Store and eVendor including an array of fishing permits. Harvest reporting for these fishing permits has also been integrated. These reports are often required, and customers are now alerted when their reports are overdue. Draw Hunt applicants can now view and change their Draw applications, a new feature in 2019. The team also implemented a process for e-signing licenses that can then be legally presented to enforcement officials in the field. This feature will be available in 2020.

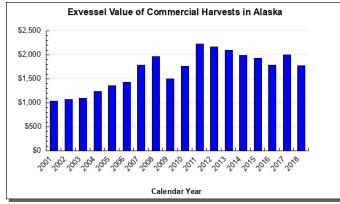

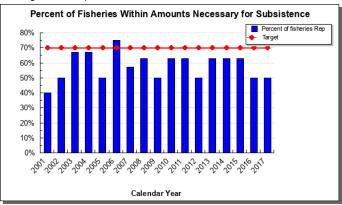

Major RDU Accomplishments in 2019

Managing for Subsistence Harvest Priority

After ensuring sustainability, providing subsistence harvest opportunity is the division's highest priority. This is accomplished several ways when fisheries must be restricted for conservation purposes, subsistence fisheries are

the last to be restricted. While in times of abundance, subsistence fisheries operate with few restrictions, and other fisheries continue under close management based on abundance. For example, in 2019 subsistence salmon fisheries were liberalized on the Kuskokwim River in response to improved Chinook salmon abundance and strong returns of other salmon species. The department maintains open dialog with subsistence users to understand how best to meet subsistence needs.

Statewide Salmon Harvest, Fishery Value, and Stock Status Improvements

The 2019 commercial salmon fishery all species harvest was approximately 206.9 million fish with an estimated preliminary ex-vessel value of approximately \$657.6 million, a 10 percent increase from 2018's value of \$595.2 million. This is a tremendous return on investment on the less than \$20 million in unrestricted general fund dollars used to manage Alaska's salmon fisheries. Of this total, sockeye salmon accounted for approximately 64 percent of the total value at \$421.1 million and 27 percent of the harvest at 55.2 million fish. Chum salmon accounted for 10 percent of the value at \$63.8 million and 9 percent of the harvest at 18.5 million fish. Pink salmon accounted for approximately 20 percent of the value at \$128.6 million, and 62 percent of the harvest at 129.1 million fish. Coho salmon accounted for approximately 5 percent of the value at \$29.6 million and 2 percent of the harvest at 3.8 million fish. The Chinook salmon harvest was estimated to be just under 0.3 million fish with an estimated preliminary ex-vessel value of \$14.4 million. The estimates of value are based on preliminary ex-vessel prices and do not include any post season bonuses paid to fishermen. The 2019 Prince William Sound (PWS) pink salmon season (including hatchery contribution) contributed the most fish to the statewide total harvest with 49.3 million pink salmon harvested. The 2019 Bristol Bay sockeye salmon season contributed the most to the statewide total value with \$303.9 million (42.9 million sockeye salmon harvested). The division expends less than \$2 million unrestricted general fund dollars in managing this lucrative fishery. In terms of pounds of fish, the all species salmon harvest of 872.1 million pounds ranks 8th in the 1975-2018 time series.

In 2018, the Norton Sound Golovin and Elim chum salmon stock of yield concern designation was discontinued because of improved stock status in the past five years.

2019 was the fifth consecutive year the Bristol Bay sockeye salmon inshore run has exceeded 50 million fish and 2020 is projected to approach this benchmark.

In Norton Sound, the coho salmon commercial harvest was the fourth highest in history, and harvests in the past three years have all been among the five best on record. The chum salmon commercial harvest was the third highest in the last 35 years. The sockeye salmon commercial harvest, although a small portion of the overall harvest, was the highest in history. The pink salmon run was one of the greatest runs recorded for an odd numbered year and pink salmon escapements were records at several salmon counting projects. No commercial fishing targeting Chinook salmon was allowed, but the run was much better than expected and the harvest of nearly 1,400 fish was the highest in 20 years. In Kotzebue Sound, chum salmon harvest was the seventh best on record and the fourth time harvest has exceeded 400,000 fish in the past five years.

While many of Alaska's Chinook salmon stocks remain in poor health, 2019 saw improved returns for several key stocks including large returns to the Kuskokwim and Copper rivers that exceeded escapement objectives, North Alaska Peninsula Chinook salmon returns were double the most recent 10-year average, and the number of Chinook salmon escapement goals met in Upper Cook Inlet and Southeast (SE) increased compared to 2018.

New Fishery Development

Division staff have worked closely with stakeholders in SE to develop a new fishery for hagfish. The fishery currently has a guideline harvest level of 120,000 pounds and all research, stock assessment, and management is undertaken collaboratively with stakeholders. This is the first new commercial fishery developed in Alaska in many years.

Implementation of the Pacific Salmon Treaty

2019 represented the first year implementing the newly renegotiated Pacific Salmon Treaty. Troll and gillnet fisheries were managed within established allocations. The seine fishery exceeded its allocation, but because the overall fishery was within its allocation, there will not be a payback during the 2020 fishery. The fishery was also managed to reduce intercept of chinook salmon stocks identified as stocks of concern. This strategy successfully reduced intercept of these stocks while focusing harvest on other treaty stocks.

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Rockfish Management Initiative

There is only a single fishery independent assessment of state-managed groundfish including lingcod and rockfish. These species have complex life histories that make research and stock assessment inherently difficult and presents a significant data gap. However, rockfish workshops continue to work toward prioritizing information needs and how to conduct those assessments.

Research projects conducted in collaboration with the Division of Sport Fish have helped inform development of management strategies for pelagic and demersal rockfish in the Gulf of Alaska. In FY2020, the divisions continued to host internal workshops regarding management issues and stock assessment needs for groundfish species, primarily yellow and black rockfish. Given growing concerns over stock status, the divisions continue to engage state and federal agency staff with rockfish management expertise, reviewing, and if appropriate, modifying management strategies and collaboratively exploring stock assessment needs. The department anticipates that management of demersal rockfish (e.g., yelloweye rockfish) will become more conservative given their life history characteristics (e.g., long-lived) and lack of stock assessment information.

Pathology Laboratory

A very warm spring and summer without much precipitation in at least seven northern watersheds caused low flows and increased water temperatures resulting in widespread pre-spawning mortality of returning Pacific salmon. The fish pathology labs provided consultation to department staff regarding these fish kills that were mostly caused by low dissolved oxygen during high fish densities.

Pathology program staff revised and distributed two popular field guides, <u>Common Diseases of Wild and Cultured</u> <u>Fishes in Alaska</u> and <u>Diseases of Wild and Cultured Shellfish in Alaska</u>. These hard copy and online pictorial references have been a useful resource for department staff, national resource agency partners, and the public.

Two additional investigations have included: 1) determining the cause of black external skin and gill lesions on subsistence caught saffron cod and other fish species in the Norton Sound area; 2) determining the cause of blackened eyestalks in snow and tanner crabs caught in the Bering Sea fisheries. Eight different fungal genera were characterized as causative agents of the skin and gill lesions in the Norton Sound cod. These fungi were sequenced for confirmation and the results were published in the journal, Diseases of Aquatic Organisms. Results from investigation of the black eye syndrome in snow and tanner crabs indicated that shell disease (produced by a complex of biofilm bacteria on the shell surface) was instrumental in causing the blackened eye condition but the factor(s) for initiating the shell disease are still under investigation.

eLandings

Data Resource Management continued to manage, develop, and expand the eLandings system. All groundfish and Western Alaska crab are reported within eLandings, and expansion to salmon continued statewide. ELandings remains a major success story for the division and its partners, National Marine Fisheries Services and the International Pacific Halibut Commission. At the completion of the 2018 salmon season, approximately 80 percent of all landings were submitted electronically. The eLandings Agency Desktop legacy program was completely replaced with an HTML5 browser-based application in 2018, and the Agency Desktop program was retired. Focus has now shifted to completing development of the HTML5 browser-based application for the processor side, with an anticipated delivery date of summer 2020 and a web-based Processor Tender Interface applications will reduce the significant amount of time the eLandings team spends assisting end users with installation support issues.

Application Development

Statewide application maintenance continued to support specialized fisheries management needs. Over one hundred applications and processes are being maintained by staff including mobile data collection, in-season management, surveys, logbooks, environmental data, geographic information system (GIS) data, observer data, and commercial harvest information. Many applications and processes are in active development status, which includes requirement gathering, design, implementation, or testing. Staff continue to support deliverables for both public and division use.

Business Intelligence and Data Warehouse (OceanAK)

Data Resource Management continues to migrate existing datasets into a single reporting and analysis system. This system eliminates multiple reporting technologies and enables department end users to produce complex analyses for fisheries management and various reporting needs without a programmer. The division successfully migrated

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systems from the department Oracle environment to the Office of Information Technology Oracle Cloud at Customer environment in May 2019. This entailed migrating 19 Oracle databases, and over one hundred subject areas and thousands of analyses and reports. This project continues to eliminate the need for multiple reporting technologies, provides a single authoritative data source, provides dynamic downloadable reports for the department website, and supports the major goal of historical data rescue and preservation of one of the most valuable and comprehensive datasets of commercial fisheries history.

Information Services

Data Resource Management Information Services provides current and historical fishery information to department staff and the public. Information Services staff continued to complete data requests for a variety of public and agency customers. Staff participated in several data rescue projects that will preserve, electronically capture, and make accessible important commercial fisheries data. Examples of these efforts include salmon age-sex-length data rescue in the Southcentral region and data rescue of historical commercial fisheries advisory announcements. Although these projects are completing near the end of 2019, several other data rescue efforts are anticipated in 2020. Information Services staff have also undergone efforts to update important webpages on the department website to provide better information about obtaining processing permits, reporting processing activities, and effectively using commercial fisheries data. Lastly, staff have updated the Commercial Operator's Annual Report (COAR) for 2019 to make reporting more efficient and to collect better processing and economic data from processors.

Key RDU Challenges

2018 Gulf of Alaska Pacific Cod and Chignik Sockeye Salmon Disasters

In 2018, the total allowable catch limit for Pacific cod in the Gulf of Alaska was reduced by 80 percent compared to the 2017 catch limit. Due to severely reduced catch limits, several directed Pacific cod fisheries were preemptively closed, and the remaining fisheries performed poorly, resulting in drastically reduced fishery revenues. Throughout the Gulf of Alaska, direct impacts were felt by harvesters, processors, and support industries which led to the Governor requesting a federal fishery disaster for the 2018 fishery. Likewise, in 2018, extremely low abundance of returning sockeye salmon to the Chignik area prompted a complete closure of the commercial fishery. Final estimated salmon escapement for the Chignik river sockeye run was 34 percent below the most recent five-year average, and the lowest since statehood. Due to the significant commercial fishery losses in the Chignik area and an estimated 100 percent decline in revenues and harvest compared to the recent five-year average, the Governor requested a federal fishery disaster requests were approved in 2019 though funding has not yet been made available. The department is working with stakeholders to develop a spending plan, which will include research monies to better understand the factors that led to the fisheries disasters.

These spending plans can be complex, involving thousands of stakeholders and the disbursement of millions of dollars, and thus, are controversial and challenging to implement. The department is striving for timely and fair distribution of allocated funds, but this is an additional workload on existing staff whose time is fully allocated.

Hatchery-Wild Salmon Interactions Research Project

The Alaska salmon fishery enhancement program produces large numbers of salmon for harvest, approximately 30 percent of the statewide commercial catch, especially in Prince William Sound (PWS) and Southeast Alaska (SE), and to a lesser degree in Kodiak and Cook Inlet. The scale of the program raised concerns that hatchery produced fish may detrimentally affect the productivity and sustainability of wild stocks of Alaska salmon. While the hatchery program has numerous safeguards built into it to protect wild stocks, the department and Alaska hatchery operators have partnered together to undertake research to address several priority questions:

- 1. What is the genetic stock structure of pink and chum salmon in each region?
- 2. What is the extent and annual variability in straying of hatchery pink salmon in PWS and chum salmon in PWS and SE?
- 3. What is the impact, if any, on fitness (productivity) of wild pink and chum salmon stocks due to straying of hatchery pinks and chum salmon?

Funding for this research has come from the State, salmon hatchery operators, salmon processors, and federal grants. Portions of the project directed at answering the first two questions have been completed. For question 1, the department Gene Conservation Laboratory has undertaken analyses of genetic structure of pink salmon in PWS and chum salmon in both PWS and SE. For question 2, mass marking of hatchery produced salmon allowed identification

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of hatchery strays in streams through the collecting of otoliths from salmon carcasses during the spawning season. By sampling the salmon escapements in a comprehensive and structured manner, the department was able to estimate the extent and variability of straying in both PWS and SE. For question 3, genetic samples were collected from both hatchery and wild spawners in select streams during one generation (parents) and wild spawners from the subsequent generation (offspring) which allowed for measuring the productivity of spawners of hatchery and wild ancestry by comparing the survival rates of offspring between these two groups. Otolith thermal mark analyses, genetic analyses, and estimations of productivity are being conducted by the department. The data collection contract with the Prince William Sound Science Center, originally started in 2012, has been extended through March of 2020. In 2017, the department awarded an additional contract to Sitka Sound Science Center to conduct these same data collection activities in SE chum salmon. Funds were expected to be exhausted by 2017, however, Alaska hatchery operators committed to annual funding increments along with salmon processors, to continue through 2023 and complete the study. Additional funding has also been received as federal grants to support the genetic research and sample processing, as well as data collection in SE.

Results of this work will be valuable to both fishery and hatchery managers, as well as others interested in Alaska salmon production, and have been instrumental in helping to secure and maintain third party sustainability certifications for marketing salmon. The results will also help inform regulatory decisions made by the department and the Board of Fisheries regarding hatchery production. In the interim, the department has announced that it will not permit new requests for increased hatchery releases of pink or chum salmon pending the outcome of these studies.

Bering Sea Crab Research Funding

The Bering Sea has experienced dramatic environmental changes in recent years, which amplify management challenges related to shifting spatial distributions, fluctuations in recruitment potential, and population declines. Current harvest for most Bering Sea stocks are significantly lower than historic levels. The division is working to develop reproductive indices that can be used to better inform the federal stock assessments and state harvest strategies (e.g., minimum thresholds for opening/closing fisheries). Other research efforts focus on spatial distribution and seasonal movement patterns relative to environmental variability and fishing. The department also performs surveys to bolster assessments. For example, Saint Matthew Island blue king crab are not adequately surveyed by the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) trawl survey because of gear limitations in nearshore rocky habitat. Additionally, NMFS no longer performs the Bering Sea slope bottom trawl survey, which is the only source of fishery independent data for Pribilof Island golden king crab, a stock that has garnered increased interest in recent years because of other stock declines. Thus, department pot surveys provide critical supplemental information to improve stock assessments. Improved population indices, spatial distribution, and stock assessments will allow the department to maximize harvests and avoid overfishing, which is especially important to industry during periods of low stock productivity. The division maintains and distributes the data collected by at-sea observers and dockside samplers, as is essential for fishery management.

Federal funding to the department for Bering Sea Crab Research (BSCR) has been reduced annually since FY2011, to the extent that federal funds received by the department for BSCR in FY2020 are 63 percent of what was received in FY2011. The reduction has limited the ability to perform at-sea surveys and associated research. For example, reduced federal funding has shortened the Saint Matthew Island pot survey and reduced the spatial extent of survey coverage. Further reductions in federal BSCR funds would continue to diminish the department's ability to perform at-sea research and stock assessment surveys on Bering Sea/Aleutian Islands crab stocks and would require a reduction in the seasonal staffing. Seasonal staff are critical for the Bering Sea/Aleutian Islands crab research and stock assessment programs and for the entry, maintenance, and distribution of data collected by the state's at-sea crab fishery observer and dockside sampling programs. Stable funding would benefit the research and data collection and distribution programs that are necessary for sustainable management of the highly valuable Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands crab fisheries.

Pathology Laboratory

During much of FY2019, the pathology program experienced a serious reduction in the overall capabilities of the fish health program, which administers the statewide caseload, oversight, and diagnostic responsibilities. With reduced staffing levels, it is a challenge to manage the division's responsibility to test, inspect, report, and review permits as required under Title 16. The affiliated regulations and policies control finfish and shellfish diseases in order to protect Alaska's wild and hatchery stocks.

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Genetic Information for Resource Management

The mission of the Gene Conservation Laboratory (GCL) is to protect genetic resources and provide genetic information and advice to department staff, policy makers, and the public to support management of resources consistent with the department's mission. For more than 30 years, staff at the GCL have been working closely with regional management staff to answer important questions such as: what salmon stocks are caught in different fisheries; how populations are related to each other; and what are the genetic interactions between hatchery and wild salmon. Notable projects include: Bristol Bay sockeye in-season management and stock specific total run estimation; mixed stock analysis of Chinook and sockeye fisheries necessary to meet U.S./Canada Treaty obligations in SE and on the Yukon River; and the Alaska Hatchery Research Program, a long term study funded by a public/private partnership that is investigating interactions between hatchery and wild origin fish in PWS and SE. Genetic information produced by the GCL is recognized as a vital tool for informing allocation decisions made by the Board of Fisheries, improving forecasts, refining estimates of productivity for escapement goals, and assessing the effectiveness of management decisions. This has allowed the state to maximize harvest opportunity and economic benefits from Alaska's fishery resources, while conserving weaker stocks for future generations.

Because genetics has become an integrated tool for many aspects of management, the GCL has become one of the highest throughput fishery genetic labs on the west coast, genotyping approximately 100,000 samples per year. With this throughput, the GCL has continued to look for new opportunities to improve resolution and increase efficiencies using cutting edge technologies. The GCL recently began implementing new genotyping-by-sequencing technology and has found ways to automate laboratory steps using robotics. In addition, the lab is continuing to work with regional management and research staff to look at novel methodologies including genetic mark-recapture, using genetics to control invasive species, and pedigree analyses to estimate wild stray rates. Despite these efforts, uncertainty of external funding poses challenges for GCL in acquiring and retaining expertise for the long term and limits the department's ability to preserve capacity to address critical management issues.

Federal Groundfish Fisheries

The North Pacific Fishery Management Council (NPFMC) has several initiatives underway that affect state managed fisheries and distribution of benefits from the harvest of federally managed fishery resources of Alaska. These include transitioning from fixed halibut bycatch limits in the Bering Sea to bycatch limits linked to halibut abundance; ongoing modifications to the federal groundfish observer program, including expanded use of electronic monitoring, to improve quality and utility of observer data; consideration of a cooperative style rationalization program for Bering Sea/Aleutian Islands Pacific cod trawl catcher vessels; and modifying the federal management plan for salmon to include discrete areas currently managed by the State of Alaska. State managers and researchers must work through the NPFMC process to develop programs that provide stability for fishery participants and communities, while meeting NPFMC objectives and complying with the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act.

State/Federal Co-Management of Bering Sea – Aleutian Islands Crab Fisheries

The federal Fishery Management Plan (FMP) for the Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands king and tanner crabs establishes a state-federal cooperative management regime that defers crab management to the State of Alaska with federal oversight. Stock assessments are part of the federal process, which establishes federal overfishing thresholds, federal stock status determinations, and federal annual catch limits, but are led by department staff for many stocks. As part of this process, federal regulations stipulate management measures must be applied to federal FMP fisheries increasing demands on staff for data gathering, analysis, and reporting. In the state process, staff have responded to industry requests by leading a collaborative effort among the department, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), and industry scientists to develop and improve state harvest strategies for various stocks including Aleutian Islands golden king crab and Bering Sea tanner crab, which are used to set the annual total allowable catch for each stock.

Vessels and Aircraft Maintenance and Replacement

The division has five large research and smaller support vessels and five small aircraft, which require regular maintenance and periodic overhauls. They are integral to a variety of stock assessment programs and coupled with commercial charters provide platforms for in season management. Maintenance must be provided to protect this capital investment, ensure efficient operations, and meet safety requirements. The division must manage the maintenance on these vessels within existing funds and ensuring minimal impact to program operations. Safely operating and maintaining aircraft within existing budgets is always a challenge. Maintaining a high-quality aircraft program for salmon stream surveys also depends on the ability to recruit and retain excellent pilots with experience

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flying in rural Alaska at low altitude as well as float equipped planes. Adequate housing for pilots, as well as field staff, is also an ongoing challenge.

Data Resource Management (DRM)

The division collects a vast amount of data, including various types of biological data on fish stocks, environmental data, records of commercial harvests, and records on the buying and production activities of seafood processors. The headquarters component is responsible for development and coordination of the databases, data warehouse and applications used by the entire division. Demand for access to this data and the complexity of analysis continually increases. The division is challenged with integrating numerous independent datasets into a unified structure. The volume, scale, and requirements for new functionality continue to increase while staffing does not.

Business Intelligence and Data Warehouse (OceanAK)

This project is designed to provide a single toolset and portal for reporting and analysis of all commercial fisheries data. Resources for this project continue to be a major challenge. Teams to support an asset like this are usually comprised of a large, dedicated information technology staff; however, this project uses division information technology resources, which already support multiple projects and systems. With the Statewide Office of Information Technology Oracle consolidation, the division successfully migrated the Business Intelligence and Data Warehouse system into the new Oracle Cloud at Customer environment but has experienced multiple challenges with lack of experienced personnel to manage and assist with the new infrastructure.

eLandings

The Interagency Electronic Reporting System, eLandings, is designed to provide a single reporting system to electronically report all commercial harvest in Alaska. Resources for this project are a major challenge. The division secures funding from federal grants (e.g., cost recovery, Alaska Fisheries Information Network) and continues to use this funding for maintenance and development related to non-salmon activities and components. Salmon activities and components must be covered by limited general funds only. The division has two Analyst Programmers who maintain, implement, enhance, and test this system. Both programmers are still relatively new with one starting in February 2018 and the other in October 2018. It can take up to two years for a new Analyst Programmer to function independently in this complex system. The project is also challenged with the loss of the longtime eLandings Program Coordinator, and the current eLandings Program Coordinator having just started in May 2019.

Implementation of the Pacific Salmon Treaty

The recently renegotiated Pacific Salmon Treaty places new obligations on the state in terms of fishery monitoring and management. As part of the signatory of the Treaty, it was anticipated that the state would receive new funds to fulfill its commitments. Unfortunately, these new funds have yet to materialize, placing an unfunded mandate on the State of Alaska. The division and the department are working to fulfill the promises made at the federal level and remain optimistic that the federal government will fulfill its promises in the future as well.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2021

As budgets tighten the division is required to prioritize work and look for efficiencies. The department and the division are using a return on investment theme to ensure that the highest value fisheries to the state and to subsistence users are minimally impacted. Options to make the division less dependent upon state funds are also being explored.

Fishery Disasters

In 2016, the pink salmon runs in the Gulf of Alaska were some of the smallest on record. A request for federal disaster assistance was approved in 2017 and funding was made available in 2019. Distribution of funds has been difficult due to reporting and administrative issues. The department hopes to have funds distributed in early 2020 to impacted entities. Of the total amount granted, approximately 6 percent was set aside for research to improve forecasts and to better understand the interaction between hatchery and wild pink salmon. The research monies were distributed to each of the large regions encompassed by the Gulf of Alaska: Westward Region-Kodiak, Central Region-Prince William Sound, and Southeast Region. The research activities identified within each region were tailored to primary research needs. One example being a large-scale research project in Prince William Sound that uses genetic methods to investigate the effect that existing large-scale hatchery programs might have on local wild populations. This is a long-term project and the funding made available will accelerate the analysis allowing timely results to be available to researchers, managers, and the Board of Fisheries. The department is employing a lessons-learned strategy as it develops implementation programs for Gulf of Alaska cod and Chignik sockeye salmon

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disasters, for which the department expects to receive federal funding next year.

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Southeast Region contributes to the department's mission by 1) ensuring the conservation of natural stocks of fish, shellfish, and aquatic plants based on scientifically sound management; 2) sustaining fisheries based on the control and regulation of harvests through responsive management systems; 3) maximizing fishery harvests and opportunities of fish, shellfish, and aquatic plants using the sustained yield principle; 4) expanding fishery potential through identification of underutilized species/stocks of fish, shellfish, and aquatic plants; 5) maintaining and enhancing opportunities for public participation in the development of fishery management plans and harvest regulations; 6) developing and maintaining comprehensive databases on commercial, subsistence, and personal use harvests, and associated processing of fish, shellfish, and aquatic plants; 7) promoting public education on the conservation, production, and economic and social benefits of sustained yields from fish, shellfish, and aquatic plants; and 8) providing data, expertise, and written and oral comment in the public regulatory process through the Alaska Board of Fisheries (BOF).

Contribution to Department's Mission

The division's contribution to the department's mission is accomplished by gathering information about the status of exploited fish stocks, establishing biological guidelines to protect reproductive biomass, rehabilitating or enhancing where possible, and managing commercial, subsistence, and personal use harvests within acceptable limits. The division implements decisions of the Alaska Board of Fisheries (BOF), which allocates fishery resources between users.

Contributions include the operation of gene conservation, pathology, stock identification, and age determination laboratories. The division also provides planning, permitting, and oversight functions, as required by statute, for private non-profit salmon hatcheries and aquatic farms. These services are used by fishery managers, aquatic farmers, and salmon hatchery operators. These services protect salmon and shellfish producers from disease outbreaks as well as Alaska's wild finfish and shellfish populations. Stock identification information produced by this component is used in managing subsistence, commercial and personal use fisheries.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2019

In licensing year 2019, \$4.4 million dollars in revenue from permit and vessel license renewals was processed through the Commission's Limited Entry Online Renewal (LEON) system. A total of 10,005 fishermen renewed their licenses online in 2019, compared to 3,803 fishermen in 2018. Revenue directly attributed to online renewals increased by 110 percent. The significant increase in online processing appears to be the direct result of the continued effort by the Commission to make fishermen more aware of the online renewal options. The LEON system will continue to be updated to ensure a user-friendly renewal process for fishermen.

The Licensing Section achieved cost savings by eliminating the mass mailing of renewal forms to all 18,000 permit/vessel license holders. Instead, a postcard was sent to notify fisherman that renewals could be made online

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through LEON.

In FY2019, the Commission began a multi-year scanning project to convert all physical files to digital in order to reduce agency storage expenses. The document scanning initiative was also designed to rapidly move towards a paperless workflow, which will enable staff to perform document retrieval from their desktops.

Permit issuance is complete for 61 of 66 fisheries, bringing the Commission 92 percent of the way toward closing out applications for the existing limited entry fisheries.

The Commission published reports on the permit holdings and estimates of gross earnings in Arctic-Yukon-Kuskokwim, Bristol Bay, Chignik, and Alaska Peninsula fisheries. Additionally, the Research Section published mean and quartile gross earnings for all Alaska's limited fisheries and salmon set gillnet permits, and Department of Natural Resources shore fishery leases in Prince William Sound, Cook Inlet, Alaska Peninsula, and Bristol Bay.

The agency completed a two-year upgrade of all desktop computers, replacing towers that were seven years and older. All desktop operating systems have been upgraded to Windows 10, and production software suites such as Microsoft Office and Adobe Creative Cloud are being provided through the Statewide Office of Information Technology.

The Commission is nearing completion of a fully automated workstation that will be capable of receiving and automatically fulfilling permit renewal requests. The system will be modular and expandable to meet workload demands.

Web applications continue to be updated with new and/or enhanced features as the agency continues to find avenues for automation and efficiencies.

The Commission is investigating replacing hard vinyl, single year, embossed permit cards with a thermal card, which would include all the permit holder's permit and vessel license information and could be validated for multiple years. Thermal cards are less expensive to both produce and deliver to fishermen and the Commission will be able to make changes electronically without needing to replace the physical card, which would help permit holders avoid lost fishing time. Use of these cards will require the cooperation of several other agencies. The commercial fishing industry has expressed interest in this new technology and the Commission will continue to explore the costs and benefits of thermal cards with the relevant agencies and industry representatives.

Key Component Challenges

Adjudications Section

Overview

The Adjudications Section is responsible for processing original applications for limited entry permits in newly limited fisheries and conducting administrative hearings for those who contest Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (Commission) decisions on refunds, issuance of demerit points, transfer denials, etc. The commissioners review and affirm or modify Adjudications' hearing officers' decisions on their own motion, or upon the request of an affected party.

In the early years, when the Commission was actively limiting many new fisheries, up to five hearing officers and three paralegals were employed to evaluate, classify, and adjudicate limited entry permit applications. This was in addition to the normal workload involving hearings and decisions on permanent and emergency transfer requests, assessment of demerit points, reinstatement of forfeited permits, requests for refunds and enforcement actions. These adjudication functions are required by the Commission's enabling statutes and regulations and will continue indefinitely. The Adjudications Section has expanded and contracted according to the quantity of work before the Commission (i.e. section is expected to grow should another fishery be limited).

The Adjudications Section currently operates with one hearing officer and one paralegal. Together they handle all the adjudication duties, including licensing appeals, assessment of demerit points as a result of court order, records maintenance and storage and public information requests. A new hearing officer/Adjudications leader was hired in

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late 2018 and was trained by a predecessor with over 40 years of Commission experience.

Limiting & Closing Out Fisheries

The Commission continues to actively monitor open access fisheries to determine if they are candidates for limitation. When the record of a fishery suggests that limitation would prevent economic distress among fishermen and serve resource conservation, the Commission has a statutory duty to consider limiting entry. Once entry to a fishery is limited, numerous appeals requiring adjudication typically arise and create a significant new caseload for the Commission. In FY2019, the Commission was contacted by constituents expressing interest in new fishery limitations. While no petitions were received, the Commission continues to monitor fisheries for possible limitation, and the Commission anticipates additional discussions with industry in FY2020 and beyond. This could ultimately lead to new limited fisheries and place additional demands on Adjudications and other sections.

Over the last three years, the commissioners have made significant progress in deciding pending application cases. The commissioners and their team are actively working on each of the remaining cases. Great care must be taken when issuing Commission decisions. Final Commission decisions that result in permit denials are frequently followed by judicial appeals, which can have significant consequences for the limited entry program. A negative court ruling has the potential to impact other pending cases, or an entire fishery, and could require a review of previously decided cases.

Other Decisions

In 2018, the hearing officers and paralegals issued a total of 15 decisions, primarily involving permanent and emergency transfers that underpin the Commission's licensing and transfer decisions. The immediate right to fish is often at stake and dictates fast action. These cases are prioritized to help avoid lost fishing time for fishermen and crew. In 2019, the Adjudication Section experienced a sharp increase in transfer cases.

Research & Planning Section

Overview

The Commission's Research & Planning Section plays a vital role in Alaska fisheries management by collecting and processing information. Without the information, fisheries managers and other key stakeholders would be unable to conduct their daily operations. The research staff works diligently to ensure these services are made available without interruption to fishermen, government agencies, and the general public. In FY2019, the Research & Planning Section published eight reports and generated several specialized ad hoc reports upon request by other agencies, private research firms, industry groups, academics, and the legislature.

Fishery Reports

Research & Planning Section analysts produce specialized ad hoc reports as requested by other agencies, private research firms, industry, and academics.

Permit Values

An essential function of the Commission is estimating the value of the Commission limited entry permits. The Research & Planning Section publishes monthly reports of estimated permit values on a timely basis for use by permit holders, brokerage firms, lending institutions, and the general public.

Status of Fishery Limitations and Optimum Numbers

The Commission continues to receive questions about limiting various open access fisheries. The Research & Planning Section responds with data and information unique to each fishery. One of the Commission's mandates is to identify the optimum number of entry permits to maintain healthy fisheries and provide a reasonable average rate of economic return to fishermen in each fishery. In FY2019, the Commission began redeveloping a formal process to analyze optimum numbers through studies tailored to the dynamic nature of Alaska's fisheries.

Board of Fisheries

The Commission maintains regular communications with industry, the Board of Fisheries (BOF), and other regulatory bodies on regulations and restructuring proposals that involve any aspect of the Limited Entry Act. In FY2019, the Research & Planning Section commented on proposals pending before the BOF and responded to select fishery questions posed by BOF members and the public.

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The Commission Regulatory Authority

During FY2019, the Research & Planning Section worked with the commissioners and law specialists to identify new regulations or updates. A series of regulatory packages will be opened for public comment in the coming year. The Commission may be called on to make determinations relating to its authority under the Limited Entry Act as a result of proposals arising from the 2019/2020 BOF meeting cycle. In that event, the Commission will hold hearings and consider adopting any regulations requested by the BOF; part of that review process includes ensuring that new regulations are consistent with the Limited Entry Act.

Fleet Reduction Measures

In the early 2000's, representatives of the Southeast Alaska salmon purse seine fishery (S01A) began to pursue a permit buyback program. A series of state and federal statutes were passed in support of this initiative.

Under statutory authority granted to the Alaska Department of Fish & Game by the Alaska Legislature in AS 16.40.250 (§ 1 Chapter 134, SLA 2002), the Commissioner of Fish & Game in 2003 approved formation of the Southeast Revitalization Association (SRA) as a qualified salmon fishery association for the purpose of fleet consolidation in the Southeast Alaska salmon purse seine fishery. The Commission has provided support for the fleet reduction program developed by SRA; the program is administered by the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS).

This fleet reduction program contains several requirements that must be fulfilled by the Commission. The Commission reviewed the draft 2018 plan for consistency with those requirements and met with both the SRA representative and the NMFS program administrator. The Commission produced and delivered its required analysis of the plan to SRA and provided additional comments to NMFS, which published these comments in a Federal Register notice for public review. The program was approved, and the fleet voted to move forward with this final stage of the permit reduction program.

In FY2019, the Commission provided the required consultations on SRA's buyback program and ultimately retired 36 seine permits from the fishery.

Permit holders in other limited fisheries occasionally express interest in pursuing a buyback or implementing other fleet consolidation measures in their fisheries. When consulted, the Commission works with stakeholders to provide information and advice about the steps that might be necessary to make such programs successful.

Fishery Disaster Declarations

The 2016 Gulf of Alaska pink salmon fishery was declared a disaster under the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (MSA). Congress appropriated funds through National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration/NMFS to address the financial losses of fishermen and communities in seven Alaska management areas. The program to distribute funds was launched in FY2019 and is administered by the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission. The Commission is working to support their efforts by making information available on request to fishermen attempting to participate in the program.

Statutory Fee Ceiling

Since 2015, legislators have expressed interest in reviewing the \$3,000 ceiling on limited entry permit renewal fees (AS 16.43.160(c)). In FY2019, the Commission research analysts evaluated removal of the fee ceiling and outlined various options for consideration by lawmakers.

Licensing Section

Overview

The Commission's Licensing Section processes over 18,000 permit and vessel licenses and 2,000 permit transfers each year. Staff strive to make timely and accurate determinations regarding eligibility, transfers and renewals consistent with extensive governing fishery statutes and regulations. The Licensing Section works closely with the Commission law specialist and commissioners to ensure compliance with the Limited Entry Act, while interacting regularly with other state and federal agencies, industry related businesses, and the public.

Online Services

While online renewals are expected to reduce some demands on licensing staff, it will also allow the section to concentrate on more complex tasks, like transfers. In addition to lending support on other licensing matters, licensing

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staff provide significant assistance to many fishermen who are learning to complete online license renewal. Staff from the Data Processing Section also provide support to online users and those who require other licensing options and services.

Data Processing Section

Overview

The Commission generates and stores vital economic data on Alaska's commercial fisheries. The Commission's data are independently generated and serve as an essential resource for policy deliberations in several arenas. The Data Processing (DP) Section is responsible for making fishery data and statistics available to support the Commission staff functions, as well as consumers of Commission data.

The DP Section includes four technologists who deliver secure, reliably available, and comprehensive commercial fishing industry data, while providing technological support to the Commission's other sections and clients. DP provides data to state and federal agencies, the seafood industry, private vendors, and the general public.

Legacy Planning

The Commission must prepare for the retirement of two DP staff with more than 50 years of combined experience with the agency. A major challenge is expected in hiring and training replacement staff.

Major RDU Accomplishments in 2019

Sustaining Fishing Opportunities

The division continued to conduct many quantitative stock assessment projects (weirs, counting towers, and aerial surveys) statewide to provide objective in-season data. This data is key for informed decision making to provide fishing opportunity and to manage stocks for sustained yield. Area Managers issued a total of 105 Emergency Orders and Advisory Announcements during 2019 that either restricted or liberalized fisheries and 47 Advisory Announcements that informed the public of fishing opportunities during the season. Opportunities for sockeye salmon fishing were liberalized in the Redoubt Bay/Lake, Chilkoot River, Fish Creek, Resurrection Bay, Saltery Cove, Buskin, Wood, Nushagak-Mulchatna, Naknek, Alagnak, Togiak, Kenai, Kasilof, Russian, and Copper Rivers. The Upper Cook Inlet personal use fishery for sockeye salmon was liberalized as well, providing a four-day opening at 24 hours per day when it would have been open 6:00 am – 11:00 pm. Chilkoot River coho salmon and Valdez area pink salmon were liberalized for much of the 2019 run.

Communication and Public Service

The division continued to strive toward improving public service through the modernization of online services and improved communication. To date, the division has moved all licensing and permitting to the online store and has built web tools to allow online harvest reporting for personal use permits. The division has broadened its use of the GovDelivery email subscription service to deliver important and timely information to the angling public such as emergency orders, news releases, fishing reports, the *Reel Times* monthly newsletter, and to send email reminders to personal use permit holders to report their harvest. The division also implemented a social media strategy to increase public awareness about important conservation issues and events, to increase public engagement, and launched several social media sites to improve engagement with the public.

Delivering sport fishing regulations to the public in a manner that improves their understanding and compliance is a longer-term strategy and remains a priority. The division began to implement the angler survey report recommendations, which included rephrasing sport fishing regulation summaries in a way that remains enforceable and rewriting fishery announcements that accompany emergency orders. Additionally, following recommendations of a 'business needs analysis' conducted in 2017, the division has nearly completed building a content management system (CMS) to house geographically referenced regulatory content so it can be delivered dynamically through multiple platforms such as the website or a mobile app.

In the division's ongoing efforts to simplify complex regulations, 10 staff proposals were submitted to the Alaska Board of Fisheries, all were adopted. Division staff in Interior and Southcentral Regions operated a booth at the Great Alaska Sportsman's Show and Fairbanks Outdoor Show to answer questions on regulations, fisheries management, and fishing opportunities. Staff held meetings with various sport fishing groups in southeast Alaska to discuss conservative management actions needed to achieve Chinook salmon escapement goals in 2019.

Exhibit design, fabrication and installation of interactive displays and informational signage at Ship Creek Fisheries Center (SCFC), the William Jack Hernandez Sport Fish Hatchery in Anchorage, and the Tanana Valley Fisheries

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Center (TVFC) at the Ruth Burnett Sport Fish Hatchery were ongoing. Additionally, the SCFC hosted monthly public fishing forums that were well attended. Both the SCFC and the TVFC were staffed for public tours and visitation during times of high visitor use (May-August), with the TVFC serving 1,400 visitors and the SCFC serving over 27,500. This represents a significant increase in number of visitors from previous years.

Hatchery Production

The division's enhancement program continued support for some of Alaska's most popular and reliable fisheries by increasing opportunities for anglers while reducing fishing pressure on wild stocks. The "*Statewide Stocking Plan for Sport Fisheries, 2019*" outlined objectives that included the number and locations of the division's enhancement efforts for the next five years and received public input. In 2019, the division's hatcheries, with support from cooperating Private Non-Profit (PNP) facilities, produced and released 6.7 million Chinook and coho salmon, rainbow trout, Arctic char and Arctic grayling at 258 different locations.

Production of lake trout and catchable sized Arctic grayling were reinstated as part of the division's enhancement efforts, with the release of catchable sized Arctic grayling and the collection of lake trout eggs for release in 2020. Division Chinook salmon enhancement projects in southeast, Prince William Sound, and Cook Inlet continued to provide expanded harvest opportunities in Juneau, Petersburg, Ketchikan, Homer, Seward, Anchorage, and the Mat/Su.

Habitat Research and Restoration

The division plays a supporting role in the data collection and compilation of information used to protect and conserve habitat for fish. In 2019, nearly 400 miles of fish habitat on rivers and streams throughout the state were provided protection under state law, and four water right certificates were issued. A survey to document fish species presence occurred at 120 sites covering over 62 miles (100 km) of stream habitat in the Kobuk and Koyukuk watersheds. As a result, 41 new or extended water bodies were added to the Anadromous Waters Catalog (AWC), adding 481.4 miles (774.7 km) of anadromous fish habitat to the AWC, as well as supporting backup or additional life stage information on seven previously listed AWC water bodies. Nearly 0.4 miles of streambank was conserved and sustained, and an additional 0.45 miles was restored in heavily used/modified sections of high valued rivers in Alaska. During the process, 540 feet of material detrimental to fish was removed as well. Fish passage was restored to allow unimpeded access to nearly 57 miles of stream habitat and 27 acres of lake habitat carrying out six barrier removal projects in Kenai, Tyonek, and the Mat-Su Borough, with additional projects completed and others ongoing on Kodiak Island.

Key RDU Challenges

Sustaining Fishing Opportunities

Poor Chinook salmon production experienced statewide since 2007 continues to threaten sport fishing opportunity with personal impacts to anglers and economic impacts to businesses and communities throughout the state. Poor runs were again experienced in 2019, which required increasingly severe fishing restrictions over large areas such as Southeast Alaska and Northern Cook Inlet to achieve escapement goals and conserve stocks. Some areas, the Susitna River for example, were closed to fishing for Chinook salmon altogether. Despite these restrictions, several Chinook salmon escapement and hatchery egg take goals were not achieved. Chinook salmon runs in 2020 are likely to remain low and will continue to challenge managers with providing fishing opportunity while attaining adequate conservation goals. Preseason fishing restrictions will likely be needed to ensure that Chinook salmon escapement goals are met, and stocking levels are maintained.

While Chinook salmon returns to enhancement sites improved this past summer, low marine survival will continue to challenge the division's ability to meet brood collection and egg take goals statewide resulting in reduced release numbers in the out years.

Northern pike continue to challenge salmon production in Southcentral Region. This includes not only existing invasive populations but also populations that have re-established due to reintroductions through illegal human activity.

A reduction in king salmon stamp revenue that results from lower sales of king salmon stamps due to reduced fishing opportunities impacts the department's efforts to assess the causes of the Chinook salmon population declines. Similarly, erratic coho salmon runs and high competition among fisheries in Cook Inlet have created substantial stock

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assessment gaps for that species. In the absence of this information, available fishing opportunity in places like the Susitna and Kenai Rivers remains less certain and will be managed more conservatively.

There are no fishery independent assessments of state managed groundfish including lingcod and rockfish. These species have complex life histories that make research and stock assessment inherently difficult and presents a significant data gap. However, rockfish workshops continue to work toward prioritizing information needs and how to conduct those assessments.

Charter Logbooks

Timely reporting of charter logbook information for halibut and salmon are required to meet the state's international treaty obligations. This has become more challenging with the repeal of the saltwater charter license that provided funding for these needs. As a result, the division has had to reprioritize work to ensure that these needs are being met. The division supports reinstitution of the saltwater charter license program as a means of providing funding to meet these needs. The division is also examining means to functionally move from a paper logbook to an electronic logbook which would improve timeliness of reporting.

Hatchery Production

Bonds to pay back the capital costs associated with the construction of the William Jack Hernandez and Ruth Burnett Sport Fish Hatcheries are expected to be paid off in 2021. Funds used to pay off the debt have come from a surcharge for hatchery bond payments on all sport fishing licenses. By statute, once the bonds are paid, the surcharge sunsets. An additional use of the surcharge has been to pay for releases of hatchery Chinook and coho salmon in southeast Alaska. These stocking programs will be directly impacted by the sunset of the hatchery surcharge. In addition, operation of the two sport fish hatcheries and necessary maintenance will be a challenge with the loss of the surcharge.

Communications and Public Service

Approximately 500,000 anglers participate in Alaska's sport fisheries annually. Many are new to the activity in any given year, and many participate in some but not all years. Interests vary among anglers: some fish to put food on the table while others practice catch-and-release as a form of conservation. Some fish because they enjoy the challenge and others to spend time outdoors. Because of the vast differences in interests, species, and areas, Alaska residents and visitors alike face an inherent challenge in gaining and maintaining awareness of ever-changing fishing opportunities, and in understanding and complying with fishing regulations.

Habitat Research and Restoration

Fish passage, streambank restoration and aquatic invasive species programs will likely experience an increasing workload due to climatic events. Increasing frequency and severity of flood events and unpredictable stream flows increase public and private landowners' requests for help to conserve and rehabilitate their property. This is especially true in areas of the state that experienced a 100-year flood event, a flooding event that has 1 percent likelihood of happening in any given year, in the past decade. The occurrence of 100-year flood events is increasing. Similarly, changing hydrology is accelerating the rate of culvert replacement statewide and increasing the demand for technical and funding support for fish passage projects. Detection and cost of controlling invasive species is ever increasing as well.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2021

Sustaining Fishing Opportunities

Research projects conducted in collaboration with Division of Commercial Fisheries will inform development of management strategies for black and yelloweye rockfish in the Gulf of Alaska. In FY2020, the division continued to host internal workshops regarding management issues and stock assessment needs for groundfish species, primarily yellow and black rockfish. Given growing concerns over stock status, the division continues to engage state and federal agency staff with rockfish management expertise, reviewing, and if appropriate, modifying management strategies and collaboratively exploring stock assessment needs. It is expected that more conservative management strategies will need to be employed over the next decade to ensure for conservation of these stocks.

Communication and Public Service

Communication using methods that reach intended audiences and messages that resonate will continue to be a challenge for the division. Measuring the effectiveness of communication efforts and modifying the approach

accordingly can be challenging as well, but it is necessary to improve public service and efficiency. A consistent system of measurement and the regular reporting results should be in place by FY2021. The division will also look to have fully implemented a digital branding strategy and public outreach campaign for "wefishak", a program that is designed to connect Alaskans with sport fishing opportunities in their local areas and increase the number of residents that are purchasing a sport fishing license.

Passage of House Bill 260 (Ch 54 SLA 2018) increased awareness of the ability for anglers to carry digital copies of their license on mobile devices. However, technical challenges preclude the department from offering licenses in a valid, secure digital display format along with harvest recording functions currently required by regulation. The department continues to address these challenges and is pursuing a mobile app that will allow for the purchase and display of a digital license, along with the required harvest recording capabilities.

Modernization of the Statewide Harvest Survey

Plans to modernize the Statewide Harvest Survey have been initiated by developing web-based data collection protocols to improve response rate and angler recall of households selected for survey information. The division is currently forming a team to address new ways to solicit survey participant's input. This should improve accuracy and precision of the estimates moving forward and improve public support for the program.

Major RDU Accomplishments in 2019

Defending Against Federal Erosion of State Management Authority

The Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act (ANILCA) and Access Defense programs, and the Threatened, Endangered, and Diversity Program (TED) are cost effective approaches to federal management issues. The ANILCA Program asserts and defends the authority of the department for management of fish and wildlife on all lands in Alaska and maintains public access and use of federal public lands. The TED program works to conserve wildlife species before they become threatened or endangered, to recover species already imperiled, and to keep common species common. The program administers the State's response to the Endangered Species Act (ESA) by providing resources, expertise, and coordination among agencies (e.g., Department of Law and Department of Natural Resources) with the goal of conserving wildlife and avoiding unwarranted regulations. Last year's major successes by these programs include:

- Worked with Department of Law on briefs supporting the plaintiff in Sturgeon v Frost. The Supreme Court ruled unanimously in favor of Mr. Sturgeon, thereby ensuring that the state will continue to manage state-owned navigable waterways within federal lands in Alaska.
- Worked with Department of Law, North Slope Borough, and others to petition the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to remove ringed seals from the ESA list.
- Worked with departments of Natural Resources and Law to ensure the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service had the information necessary to appropriately determine that listing yellow-cedar under the ESA was not warranted.

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Food for Alaskans

It is estimated that Alaskans have harvested approximately 7,000 moose and over 21,000 caribou in each of the last few years. Residents account for about 90% of the moose harvest and 97% of caribou harvest in Alaska annually. This yields roughly 4 million pounds of moose and 3.5 million pounds of caribou for Alaskan tables.

Continued Heightened Disease Surveillance

The Wildlife Health and Disease Surveillance program continued its elevated disease surveillance for all pathogens including the bacteria *Mycoplasma ovipneumoniae* in Alaska's wildlife. This has enabled better understanding of the distribution of this pathogen, which was not previously known to occur in Alaska's wildlife. In the lower 48, the pathogen has been associated with large population declines in some bighorn sheep populations. The division involved hunters in active surveillance that resulted in nearly 700 additional hunter-harvested Dall's sheep, mountain goats, moose and caribou sampled via nasal swabs for screening.

Hunter Access Program

The division continued to develop and fund hunter access projects across the state. Projects are cooperative efforts with state, local, and private organization partners. Project ideas and grant applications may now be submitted online via a new portal (www.hunteraccess.adfg.alaska.gov). This provides members of the public, conservation organizations, and other user groups an opportunity to identify access needs and to submit applications for projects with matching funds. The program will improve opportunities for hunting, trapping, and other wildlife recreation by developing or improving public access across the State; maximize efficient use of federal funds through public and private partnerships for meeting program match requirements; and improve outreach with public and private hunting, trapping, and other wildlife recreation organizations.

Key RDU Challenges

New Techniques for Conducting Moose Surveys

Moose population monitoring (including measures of abundance, composition, and trend) in Alaska has routinely involved aerial surveys flown in the fall and early winter, prior to antler drop, when sexes can be distinguished. These surveys rely on complete snow cover to optimize moose visibility. Over the past decade, delayed onset of snowfall has crippled biologists' ability to monitor moose populations using existing protocols, especially in coastal regions. Division biologists have begun to work on improving current techniques and developing new techniques to estimate moose abundance. This includes assessment of the feasibility of using unmanned aircraft to conduct surveys.

Increasing Threat from Diseases and Parasites

Among other causes, changes in climate are bringing diseases and parasites, previously known largely in lower latitudes, closer to Alaska. The division must increase its surveillance and monitoring capabilities to handle these increasing threats to wildlife.

Larger Burden on Limited State Funds for Increasing Expenses

Under the federal indirect cost allocation plan, indirect expenses, for items such as building rent, telecommunications, computer services, risk management, etc., must now be paid for using division license dollars, and it has become increasingly difficult to cover increasing expenses with limited state funds. In addition to using Fish and Game funds for activities previously paid for using federal indirect dollars, the division needs to use these funds for expenses that cannot be funded by federal Pittman-Robertson dollars—such as enforcement of game and fish laws and regulations; establishment, publication, and dissemination of regulations; stocking of game animals; wildlife damage management activities; and printing/distribution/issuance of licenses and permits.

Intensive Management Program

By statute, the Board of Game is required to identify moose, caribou, and deer populations that are critical food sources to Alaskans and ensure that those populations remain large enough to allow for adequate and sustained harvest. The division's intensive management program is conducted under policies adopted by the board to ensure effectiveness and scientific basis (AS 16.05.255(f)). If a population dips below what the board has determined to be necessary to meet the needs of Alaskans, it will direct the department to begin intensive management of that population. The division first investigates the causes of the decreased population numbers, including forage quality and availability, weather, predation and other factors. Steps are then taken to increase the numbers which can include hunting and bag limit restrictions, habitat improvement efforts, and predation control. In 2017, license buyers began paying an additional license surcharge, accounted for separately, that was established by the legislature to

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fund intensive management efforts. This surcharge is due to sunset in December of 2022. If the surcharge is not renewed, the division will struggle to perform research and management actions necessary to fulfill its statutory obligations under AS 16.05.255(f).

Defending Against Federal Erosion of State Management Authority

Various federal actions related to the Endangered Species Act and the Marine Mammal Protection Act are challenging state authority to manage and are impacting the state's ability to develop its resources. These include polar bear incidental take authorization, designations of vast expanses of critical habitat for humpback whales, killer whales, and ice seals, and petitions to list a wide range of species. The division will continue its efforts to provide information, challenge unwarranted actions, and conduct needed research.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2021

The division is monitoring its federal Pittman-Robertson obligations closely to be sure that no dollars are reverted. A sufficient safety margin was established that will ensure that unspent FY2020 funds will be available for appropriation in FY2021. Funds will not be reverted into federal coffers.

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Office of the Commissioner is responsible for fulfilling the department's mission, guiding principles, core services and goals. This is accomplished by providing policy direction, budgetary oversight, and oversight of the department's divisions and programs.

Core Services

- The Commissioner's Office provides departmental leadership and directs policy development for the agency. It coordinates budgeting and planning and has primary responsibility for the department's mission of managing Alaska's fish and wildlife resources. The commissioner is an ex-officio member of the Alaska Board of Fisheries and the Alaska Board of Game.
- The Commissioner's Office participates in the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Trustee Council, the Pacific Salmon Commission, the North Pacific Fishery Management Council, the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission, and the North Pacific Research Board.
- The Commissioner's Office also represents Alaskan interests in various international fisheries negotiations. The office coordinates Alaska's participation in and advocates Alaska's interest in federal and/or interjurisdictional forums including regional and international sustainable fish initiatives, federal litigation, congressional fish and wildlife legislation, Pacific Northwest endangered salmon issues, and U.S. Forest Service management issues.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2019

The Commissioner's Office was instrumental in assisting divisions in the accomplishments detailed in each narrative. The Commissioner's Office was also instrumental in implementing the Governor's policies through department and division programs.

Key Component Challenges

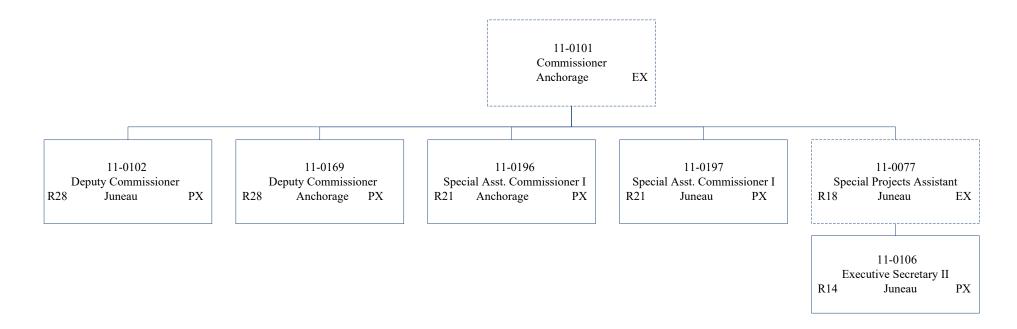

Component: Administrative Services

Contribution to Department's Mission

Administrative Services provides efficient, cost-effective and customer-oriented administrative services and support to department programs.

Core Services

- Centralized administrative support services to the full range of programs and projects conducted by the Department of Fish and Game, inclusive of accounting, fiscal management, procurement, property control, contract administration, budget services, information technology services, human resource management, capital construction, facility maintenance and repair, and office space planning.
- Administration of the fish and game licensing program.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2019

Facilities Maintenance

During FY2019, Administrative Services addressed deferred facility maintenance issues around the state and provided emergency response assistance as needed including the Anchorage Regional Compound earthquake. Projects included: major reconstruction and renovation of the Dutch Harbor and Yakutat bunkhouses, electrical renovations to the King Salmon compound, repair and maintenance of the Stikine cabin. Multiple projects in the Fairbanks Regional Office which include replacing a dated phone system, digital heating system controls, head bolt heaters, and security upgrades were all completed. Additionally, the Taku river cabin was repaired and the solar generation system was replaced.

Information Technology

The department continues to transition license vendors to the eVendor system, which enables license vendors to sell licenses, tags, and permits electronically, reducing the use of paper licenses. New tools and workflow aimed at increasing adoption of the eVendor tool with existing paper-based vendor base will continue to be investigated. The department has also added several new products to the Online Store and eVendor including an array of fishing permits. Harvest reporting for these fishing permits has also been integrated. These reports are often required, and customers are now alerted when their reports are overdue. Draw Hunt applicants can now view and change their Draw applications—a new feature in 2019. The team also implemented a process for e-signing licenses that can then be legally presented to enforcement officials in the field. This feature will be available in 2020.

Licensing

Most license vendors have transitioned from paper formatted license sales to utilizing the department's electronic vendor sales system, eVendor. eVendor provides hunting and fishing licenses in an efficient and cost-effective manner. This transition has significantly decreased manual data entry and allows the department to capture accurate data immediately, which is of considerable benefit to resource management and wildlife enforcement. It is a simple and user-friendly application that produces a license. eVendor has the capacity to provide/produce a wide variety of Fish and Game products for hunters and anglers. Existing paper products are continuously being added to the eVendor catalog.

In FY2019, license and tag revenues increased by \$1.9 million from FY2018. Approximately 730,000 licenses, stamps and tags were issued to hunters and anglers, of which 61 percent were issued electronically. The department anticipates the percentage of electronic sales to increase to roughly 80 percent in FY2021, considering that non-electronic sales will continue to occur in remote areas and other instances of poor to no internet connectivity.

Key Component Challenges

The state's accounting and payroll system (IRIS) is and will continue to be a major challenge for staff.

Maintaining acceptable levels of service is becoming difficult due to employee retention and recruitment challenges.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2021

Licensing will soon be introducing an electronic signature feature for hunters and anglers who would like to carry and display their licenses on an electronic device. The process for this feature is currently being enhanced to allow licensees to legally attest to their licenses online. Licensing is currently working with Information Technology to improve the simplicity of this process and the display of licenses on electronic devices.

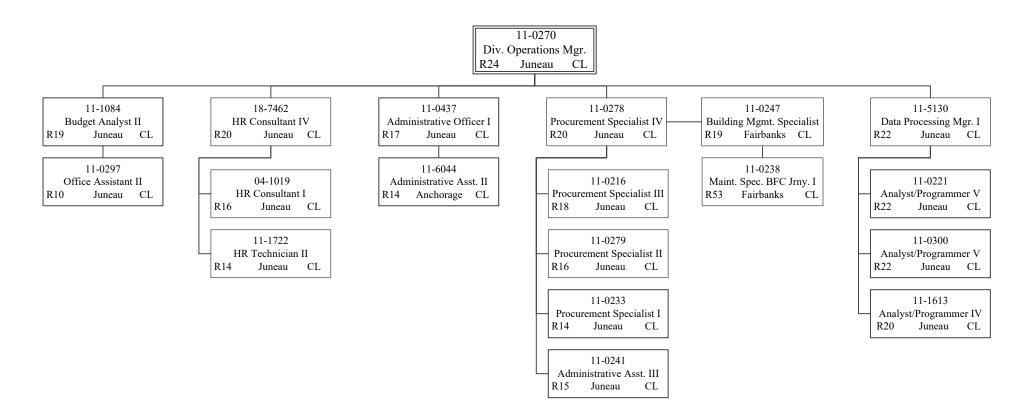

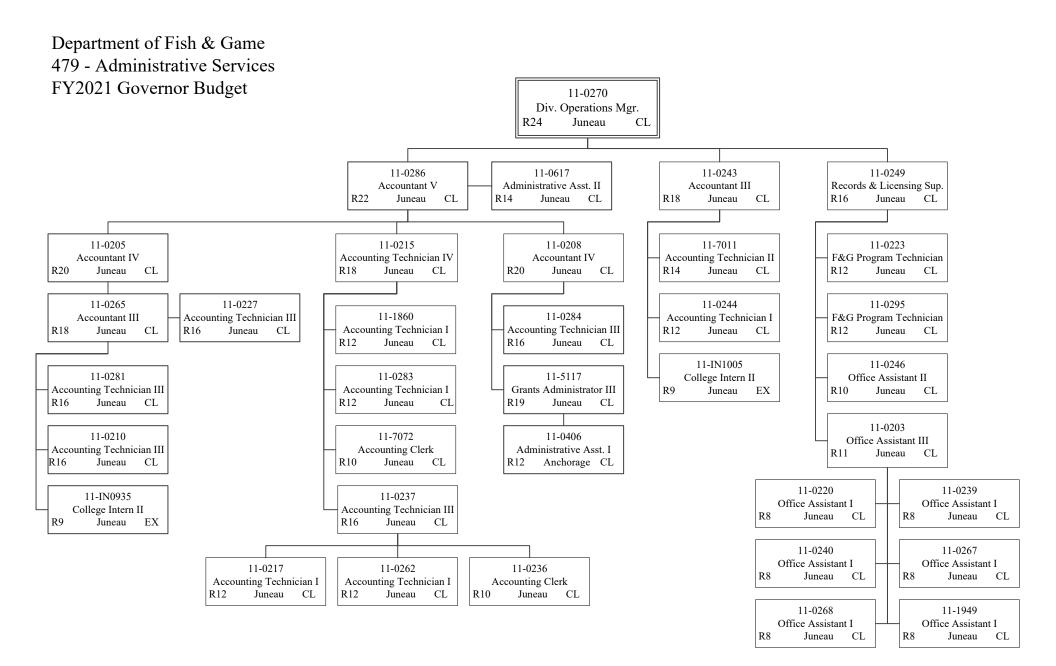

Component: Boards of Fisheries and Game

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Boards Support Section facilitates an effective board and public process for the state's fish and wildlife regulatory system.

Core Services

- Ensure citizens participating in the fish and game regulatory process have clear and helpful information in advance to engage effectively.
- Provide and support an environment for board members to make effective decisions.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2019

The Board of Fisheries held regulatory meetings in 2018/2019 for finfish regulations in Bristol Bay, Alaska Peninsula, Chignik, Aleutian Islands, and Arctic/Yukon/Kuskokwim areas; Pacific cod in Bering Sea-Aleutian Islands, Chignik, and Alaska Peninsula; and statewide finfish regulations. In addition to the regularly scheduled meetings, the Board of Fisheries held a two-day work session, three committee meetings and one emergency meeting to consider six petitions. Board of Fisheries members met for 24 days and addressed over 180 regulatory proposals.

The Board of Game held two regulatory meetings in the 2018/2019 cycle, addressing over 150 proposals concerning changes to hunting and trapping regulations for the southeast and southcentral regions. The board held a one-day work session in conjunction with its first regulatory meeting, and one non-regulatory teleconference meeting to consider agenda change requests. There were no other meetings this cycle to address petitions or other business, or to hold committee meetings.

The Joint Board of Fisheries and Game (Joint Board) held a three-day meeting to review regulations for local fish and game advisory committees and the boards' process for adopting regulations. The Joint Board adopted 22 of 40 proposals, making improvements and clarifications to these regulations. The Joint Board also agreed Joint Board regulatory meetings should occur approximately every five years to consider the above-mentioned regulations, and every ten years to address regulations concerning subsistence uses. In addition to the regulatory meeting, the Joint Board met via teleconference in January 2019 for the commissioner nomination process in accordance with the responsibilities under AS 44.39.030.

Key Component Challenges

Alaska's Boards of Fisheries and Game and Advisory Committees are established to ensure the public has a voice in the utilization and management of Alaska's fish and game resources. The structure utilizes local Advisory Committees, there are 84 across the state, to meet and discuss proposals submitted to the Boards and facilitating their presence at board meetings to communicate their opinions. The meetings are public meetings that allow Alaskans the opportunity to voice their opinions, concerns and suggestions. However, this structure does have a financial cost. The department's ability to bring citizens to the table, in order to guarantee their ability to be heard, can be a challenge as budgets are reduced. This said, ensuring Alaskans continue to have a voice at the table remains to be a department priority.

During the 2019/2020 board meeting cycle, the Boards of Fisheries and Game will hold nine meetings for a total of 45 days. The number of proposals to be addressed by both boards is over 400.

Board of Fisheries members will consider over 275 regulatory proposals during this meeting cycle, which include fisheries in Kodiak, Upper and Lower Cook Inlet areas, and statewide king and tanner crab (excluding southeast/Yakutat). The board will hold four regulatory meetings along with its annual work session. Meeting locations are Anchorage, Seward, and Kodiak.

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Component — Boards of Fisheries and Game

Major challenges for the Board of Fisheries include issues related to the Upper Cook Inlet finfish meeting. The region is home to several mixed stock fisheries that impact Alaska's largest population base, creating many of the most contentious allocation battles in the state. The 14-day meeting generates several major reports and hundreds of public comments related to over 170 proposals. The Kodiak finfish meeting is expected to reignite controversy over past management measures designed to minimize Kodiak fleet interception of Cook Inlet bound sockeye salmon. The board also faces challenges related to changing ocean conditions and its impact on fishery stock abundance.

The Board of Game will hold a one-day work session and two regulatory meetings this fiscal year to review over 160 regulatory proposals concerning changes to hunting and trapping regulations for the western, Arctic, and interior regions of Alaska. The board will also meet via teleconference to address annual out of cycle requests. Locations for the board meetings are Nome and Fairbanks.

Ongoing challenges the board faces include addressing concerns related to overcrowding and user conflicts, permit allocation for residents and nonresidents, and actions by the Federal Subsistence Board such as closing areas to nonqualified hunters and enacting regulations that do not align state regulations. Both the board and department are challenged with addressing the introduction and spread of disease by non-native species to indigenous species, especially Alaska's wild sheep and goats. The Board of Game also anticipates the completion of a Legislative Audit that was requested in April of 2015. The audit evaluated whether the board followed the established procedures and whether the board complied with state laws.

The boards' ability to travel and meet in person for committee and other meetings, which help inform board members of issues that arise, continues to be a key component challenge given cost constraints.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2021

In the 2020/2021 meeting cycle, the Board of Fisheries will address finfish and shellfish fisheries in Prince William Sound, southeast, and Yakutat, along with all other shellfish statewide. The total number of projected meeting days is 28. The number of proposals is determined after the proposal deadline in April 2020.

The Board of Game will hold two regulatory meetings in 2020/2021 to address hunting and trapping regulations for the central/southwest region and statewide provisions. The board will hold a one-day work session in conjunction with the first regulatory meeting and will meet in the fall via teleconference to consider agenda change requests. The total number of meeting days is expected to be 18. The number of proposals will be determined after the May 1, 2020 proposal deadline.

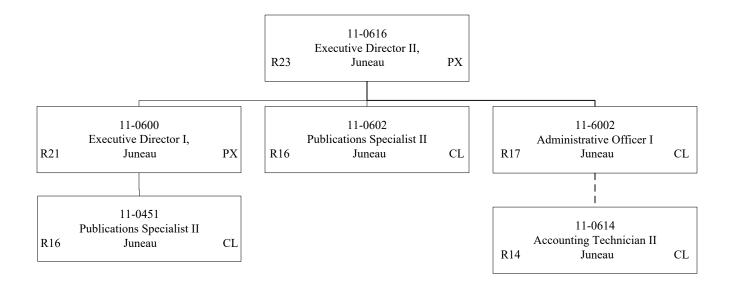

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Boards Support Section facilitates an effective board and public process for the state's fish and wildlife regulatory system.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2019

During the 2018/2019 cycle, 70 of 84 Advisory Committees (ACs) held 190 committee meetings. All multi-community ACs that chose to meet were provided funding for an in-person meeting. Full AC participation at board meetings was funded for those wishing to comment on issues before the boards. Four ACs from the Southeast Region that had not met in the past several years reactivated in 2019: Ketchikan, East Prince of Wales, Pelican, and Kake.

The Boards Support Section continues to provide information to the public and the AC members on the webpages for each committee including rosters, term limits, minutes, and agendas. The AC member database provides access for regional staff to make roster updates, which are automatically reflected on the website for public viewing. Boards Support is in its sixth year of the AC recognition program, acknowledging committee members for their dedication and voluntary service to the fish and game regulatory process. Boards Support has all regional coordinator positions filled for the 2019/2020 meeting cycle.

In March 2019, the Joint Board of Fisheries and Game met to review the advisory committee and regulatory system. The joint board made several clarifications to the AC rules of operation that should assist program management.

Key Component Challenges

Alaska's Boards of Fisheries and Game and Advisory Committees (AC) are established to ensure the public has a voice in the utilization and management of Alaska's fish and game resources. The structure utilizes local Advisory Committees, there are 84 across the state, to meet and discuss proposals submitted to the Boards and facilitating their presence at Board meetings to communicate their opinions. The meetings are public meetings that allow Alaskans the opportunity to voice their opinions, concerns, and suggestions. However, this structure does have a financial cost. The department's ability to bring citizens to the table, in order to guarantee their ability to be heard, can be a challenge as budgets are reduced. This said, ensuring Alaskans continue to have a voice at the table remains to be a department priority.

Under the FY2020 budget, Boards Support Section's goal has been to provide funding for one face-to-face meeting for those multi-community ACs having travel costs associated with the meetings, and possibly additional meetings on a case-by-case basis depending on the complexity of meeting topics. Travel will be closely monitored and if needed, limited. The use of capital grant funds from the Division of Wildlife Conservation related to hunting regulations will help ACs meet to review game related proposals. Minimizing the number of days in attendance at board meetings will be encouraged when appropriate and both boards will provide opportunities for AC testimony via teleconference during meetings as a cost savings measure and an opportunity for rural AC members who are not able to travel to the meeting.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2021

If FY2021 allocations remain stable, there are no significant changes to be delivered.

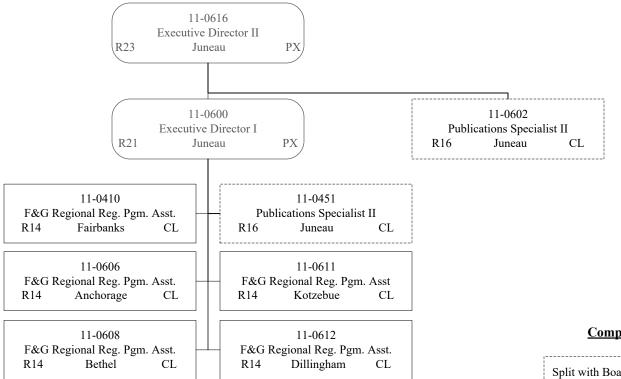

Component: EVOS Trustee Council

Contribution to Department's Mission

The mission of the *Exxon Valdez* Oil Spill Trustee Council (the Council) is to work toward restoring and enhancing the environment injured by the *Exxon Valdez* oil spill (EVOS) to a healthy and productive ecosystem through the use of the EVOS settlement.

Core Services

- The program is funded through the invested earnings of the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Investment Joint Trust Fund. These funds are considered joint-trust funds and guidelines for the use of these funds was designated by the U.S. District Court in 1991, and subject to any other applicable court orders, state and federal law.
- The Council was formed to jointly use the 1991 civil settlement to restore, replace, enhance, or acquire the equivalent of natural resources injured as a result of the oil spill and reduced or lost services provided by such resources. The Council consists of three State of Alaska trustees and three Federal trustees.
- The Council provides an annual program that focuses restoration activities on supporting the resources affected by EVOS, scientific research regarding natural recovery and monitoring; habitat enhancement and protection; public participation; project evaluation; and efficient administration.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2019

The Council continued to implement two coordinated, integrated programs focused on long-term monitoring and herring research and monitoring. In addition, the Council continued to work with and fund several multi-agency projects focusing on habitat and fish ecosystem enhancement through culvert removal and replacement. The Council also funds third-party stewardship projects for debris removal on the Kenai River.

Council staff developed electronic files and increased the documents available on the Council's website, as well as spearheading a comprehensive website and database update. Council staff continue to respond to numerous media and public information requests regarding EVOS and the Council, as interest increased after Deepwater Horizon and other recent spills.

In commemoration of the 30th anniversary of the *Exxon Valdez* oil spill, the Council through the Department of Natural Resources, Division of State Parks and Outdoor Recreation, developed traveling display educational panels, an 18-minute film, "Listening to the Sound", a film poster and social media clip to increase awareness of the spill and the work of the Council. These have been distributed widely to school districts, libraries, museums, visitor centers, and gatherings, as well as to the Alaska Marine Highway System ferries within Alaska, with special focus on distribution to the communities in the spill area.

The Council provides founder support to the Alaska Resources Library & Information Services (ARLIS), home of the Council's comprehensive collection of materials and records.

FY2019 ARLIS accomplishments through 3rd quarter (October 2018-June 2019):

- Welcomed 32,956 visitors;
- Answered 1,871 requests for information and materials, including 167 for EVOS information;
- Provided online access to 2,500 digitized EVOS photographs and received 235,842 hits on this collection (1,625,799 hits since its launch in October 2010);
- Provided digital copies of EVOS video footage upon request;
- Continued ongoing digitization project scanning 102 boxes of files pertaining to the EVOS Trustee Council Official Record;
- Began additional digitization project work scanning 46 boxes of the Council's Natural Resource Damage Assessment (NRDA) files;

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- Began digitization of EVOS related video and audiotapes for preservation of this information;
- Created an EVOS Special Collection at ARLIS, based on the work of the Council; and
- Assisted users nationwide and internationally with information pertaining to EVOS and Alaska's natural and cultural resources.

Key Component Challenges

The mission of the Council's restoration program is to work toward the recovery of resources affected by EVOS. Restoration actions are focused on supporting healthy, productive ecosystems that maintain naturally occurring biodiversity. The Council provides guidance and direction to the program for successful long-term research, monitoring and protection of habitats. This includes producing information that can serve restoration through resource management actions and scientific research. The program emphasizes credible science through the active participation and review of technical and scientific experts, and the meaningful participation of the public.

Through the hundreds of studies conducted since the spill, the Council has come to recognize that ecosystem restoration is not easily addressed due to a changing environment and the difficulty in being able to distinguish the effects of oil from other factors impacting injured resources and services. In addition, the joint trust funds continue to diminish. Thus, the challenge for the Council is to use the remaining trust funds efficiently to serve restoration goals, including producing information that can serve restoration through resource management actions and scientific research. The Trustees are working with Council staff to develop a strategy to spend down remaining funds with a goal towards reducing administrative program oversight.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2021

In FY2021, the Council will continue to monitor and guide the funding of the long-term monitoring and research focus areas developed through the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process in FY2011 and implemented with five-year invitations in FY2012 and FY2016. This implementation includes working closely with the funded entities in many areas, including scientific oversight, funding flow, and data management. The Council also continues to work within its established habitat program to support recovery of resources affected by EVOS. The Council is also continuing to work with habitat enhancement proposals that support watersheds such as the Kenai and Kasilof River with riverbank restoration, including light penetrating walkways, public access stairs and interpretive panels with information about recreational and/or wildlife use of the area and the Council.

The Council office also works with the identified programmatic focus areas and efficient project completion. Council staff continues to update and organize, index, and digitize the numerous physical and electronic documents that have accumulated over thirty years of Council restoration work.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2019

• Completed the annual regulatory update of the *Catalog of Waters Important for the Spawning, Rearing, or Migration of Anadromous Fishes* (anadromous means fish that live in saltwater but spawn in freshwater).

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This catalog identifies and provides information to applicants regarding streams subject to statutory provisions and the need for an AS 16.05.871 permit to conduct work in those listed waterbodies.

- Drafted the Alaska Department of Fish & Game (ADF&G) section of the Department of Natural Resources Commissioner's Analysis for the Donlin Gold proposed gas pipeline State right-of-way application and participated in several public hearings held in various communities potentially affected by the gas pipeline.
- Worked with the public and industry to review and issue Fish Habitat and Special Area permits in a timely manner. Each permit decision was guided by site specific factors and best available science to both properly protect fish habitat while still allowing responsible development. The average time to complete a Fish Habitat Permit was 7.0 days recognizing that some permits are issued quickly while some may be in the review process for over a year before a final application is completed.
- Performed ongoing aquatic biomonitoring at several large mine projects, including: Fort Knox, Kensington, Red Dog, Greens Creek, and Lemon Creek.
- Performed baseline aquatic biomonitoring at mine prospects: Constantine Palmer, Arctic Bornite, and Anarraaq-Aktigiruq.
- Worked on ongoing permitting and environmental reviews for North Slope oil and gas projects, Trans Alaska Pipeline System, Alaska Liquid Natural Gas (LNG) Pipeline, and Alaska Stand Alone Pipeline.
- Worked on permitting and environmental reviews for Donlin, Pebble, Anarraaq-Aktigiruq, and Constantine Palmer hard-rock prospects.
- Worked on permitting and environmental reviews for Ambler Industrial Road, Haines Highway upgrade, and Katlian Bay Road.
- Conducted preliminary field work for the Kake to Petersburg Access Road.
- Permit issuance will continue for in-river hydro on Kvichak River.
- Provided expertise on fish passage issues to the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities on various highway projects (Dalton, Haines, and others).
- Participated in the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities Wildlife Working Group.
- Represented the ADF&G in the Federal Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) process for large projects such as the proposed Pebble Prospect, Arctic National Wildlife Refuge 1002 oil and gas, Willow, Ambler Industrial Road, and Alaska LNG.
- Completed numerous trip reports documenting pre-project and post-project field inspections.
- Updated and closed out, where possible, compliance actions.
- Conducted applied field research to support permitting, monitoring/compliance, and rehabilitation.
- Completed technical reports pertaining to Red Dog, Fort Knox, Greens Creek, and Kensington mines, Constantine Palmer and Arctic-Bornite prospects, and surveys of anadromous waterbodies.
- Under the Forest Resource Practices Act (FRPA) reviewed timber harvest plans, conducted field inspections, and worked cooperatively with timber operators.
- Continued work on Special Area Plans including Kachemak Bay and Fox River Flats and Willow Mountain.
- Participated in multiple oil spill drills and provided comments on Oil Spill Contingency Plans.

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• Participated in the state's transboundary mines effort.

Key Component Challenges

Habitat's key component challenge is to ensure that at current staffing levels, the section continues to provide meaningful conservation of important fish and wildlife resources and habitats and issue permits for responsible resource development in a timely manner. Maintaining staff expertise continues to be a challenge. This will continue for the foreseeable future and has the potential to adversely affect review of major development projects.

Habitat relies on statutorily designated program receipts to fund staff time for most of the major development projects. This has worked but is entirely dependent upon industries' continued interest in funding the work.

No significant changes.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2019

Change to a Section

The State Subsistence Research Component successfully transitioned from a Division to a Section this past year with no loss of function. The oversight responsibilities of the Director were assumed by the Commissioner.

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Value of Subsistence Harvest to Alaska's Residents

Subsistence uses of fish and wildlife are given a priority over commercial fishing and recreational and personal use fishing and hunting in state and federal law. This means that when the harvestable portion of a fish stock or game population is not sufficient for all public uses, subsistence uses are restricted last by regulation. Access by non-federally qualified individuals to some fisheries and hunts has been restricted when harvestable surpluses have declined; but, by and large, fishers and hunters living in nonsubsistence areas have not experienced major changes in harvest opportunities due to the subsistence priority. General hunting and sport fishing regulations continue to provide opportunities for all Alaska residents and nonresidents. Personal use net fisheries provide for established food fisheries of urban residents in areas closed to subsistence fishing. State subsistence fisheries and hunts are open to all Alaskans regardless of residence.

The subsistence food harvest by Alaska residents (about 33.6 million pounds in 2017, excluding wild plants) represents about 0.9 percent of the fish and game harvested annually in Alaska. This total includes all noncommercial harvests by residents of rural areas plus harvests taken under subsistence fishing and hunting regulations by residents of nonsubsistence areas. Personal use fishing, and hunting under general regulations by Alaskans produce an additional 0.2 percent of all harvests. Sport fishing and hunting (sport fishing by Alaskans and nonresidents and all nonresident hunting) take 0.3 percent. Commercial fisheries account for the balance about 98.6 percent of the statewide harvest. Though relatively small in the statewide picture, subsistence fishing, hunting, and gathering provide a major part of the food supply of rural Alaska. The section's best estimate is about 34.0 million pounds (usable weight) of wild foods are harvested annually by residents of rural areas of the state, and 11.4 million pounds by urban residents in all noncommercial fisheries and hunts. On a per person basis, the annual wild food harvest is about 276 pounds per person per year for residents of rural areas (about 0.75 pounds a day per person), and 19 pounds per person per year for urban areas.

Subsistence fishing and hunting are a principal characteristic of the rural Alaska economy. Attaching a dollar value to wild food harvest is difficult, because subsistence products do not circulate in markets. However, if families did not have subsistence foods, substitutes would have to be purchased. If one assumes a replacement expense of \$5.00-\$10.00 per pound, the simple "replacement value" of the wild food harvests of communities outside nonsubsistence areas may be estimated at \$170-\$340 million annually, and at \$227-\$454 million for all Alaska communities. Outside Alaska's nonsubsistence areas, subsistence is part of an economic system called a "mixed, subsistence-market" economy. Families invest money into small-scale, efficient technologies to harvest wild foods, such as fish wheels, gillnets, motorized skiffs, and snowmachines. Subsistence food production is directed toward meeting the self-limited needs of families and small communities, and not toward market sale or accumulated profit as in commercial market production. Families follow a prudent economic strategy of using a portion of the household monetary earnings to capitalize in subsistence technologies for producing food. This combination of money from paid employment and subsistence food production is what characterizes the mixed, subsistence-market economies outside nonsubsistence areas. Successful families in these areas combine jobs with subsistence activities and share wild food harvests with cash-poor households who cannot fish or hunt, such as elders, the disabled, and single parents with small children.

Reports and Data Completed

In FY2019 (the latest year for which information is available), section staff completed 14 technical papers and special reports. In addition, staff completed updates from 13 communities to the statewide subsistence harvest information system.

The section's research program continues to be a key component of the department's efforts to understand declining Chinook and sockeye salmon runs and the implications to subsistence users and uses of this resource.

Fish and Game Boards Support

The Board of Fisheries, Board of Game, and Joint Board of Fisheries and Game continued to consider information provided by the section as they deliberated on proposals for changes in hunting and fishing regulations. The section reviewed 335 proposals, emergency and subsistence petitions, and agenda change requests; and provided information to the boards on customary and traditional uses, and for making determinations of amounts of fish and wildlife reasonably necessary for subsistence uses in several areas of the state. The Board of Fisheries acted on subsistence proposals primarily for the Arctic, Yukon, Kuskokwim, Alaska Peninsula, Aleutian Islands, and Chignik management areas, as well as statewide Dungeness crab, shrimp, and miscellaneous shellfish. The Board of Game addressed subsistence harvests and uses Tier II hunts in the Southeast and Southcentral management areas. The

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Joint Board considered proposals for advisory committees and processes for adopting fish and game regulations, including the subsistence proposal policy.

Special Assignments

The section provided information and analysis of subsistence information as follows:

- 1. To the Federal Subsistence Board in providing the State of Alaska analysis and recommendations for proposals affecting subsistence uses of fish and wildlife on federal public lands.
- 2. To the North Pacific Fishery Management Council and the International Pacific Halibut Commission on uses of halibut for subsistence as part of their review and consideration of changes to subsistence halibut fishing regulations.
- 3. To the Alaska Migratory Bird Co-Management Council on subsistence bird hunting and harvest estimation as part of their consideration of hunting regulations and harvest monitoring programs in different regions of the state. The U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service transferred the coordination of the council's harvest assessment program to the section on the Steering Committee and the Scientific Technical Committee.
- 4. To the Kuskokwim Salmon Management Working Group, the Kuskokwim Inter-Tribal Fish Commission, and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service.
- 5. To the Yukon River Panel. The Northern Region Program Manager serves as alternate co-chair of the U.S.-Canada Yukon River Panel, which is charged with implementing provisions and obligations of the Pacific Salmon Treaty with Canada. Other division staff participate as members of the scientific Joint Technical Committee of the Yukon Panel. The division also has a lead role with the Arctic-Yukon-Kuskokwim Sustainable Salmon Initiative.

Key Component Challenges

Two of the section's goals are to continue collecting information representative of communities and regions of the state, and to provide the public with updated information and analysis of subsistence harvests and uses. Higher costs and reduced grant funds make these challenging goals to achieve, due to managing obligations from grant funding sources other than state general funds.

Acquisition of Customary and Traditional Harvest and Use Information

To the extent that funds are available, the section will continue annual harvest monitoring for state subsistence salmon fisheries for key areas where harvest information is essential for management and regulatory decisions. Harvest data are maintained in separate databases by several divisions; subsistence harvest and use data are not compiled and analyzed in a comprehensive fashion to present to regulatory boards, policymakers, and the public.

The section will prioritize funds to ensure that essential scientific information is provided to the public, the Board of Fisheries, Board of Game, fish and game managers, local fish and game advisory committees, Federal Subsistence Board, and inter-tribal commissions for regulation and management of fish and wildlife for subsistence uses, consistent with state law and the sustained yield principle.

The section will continue to serve the public from the Bethel field office through seasonal relocation, as well as in Douglas, Anchorage, and Fairbanks, in order to obtain local ecological knowledge and traditional knowledge.

Information Management, Analysis, and Dissemination

The division will continue analyzing customary and traditional harvest and use information as it is acquired. Given fiscal constraints, on-demand analyses and presentations of comprehensive subsistence harvest information are not part of annual operations and require reprogramming of staff and funding from other core services to address issues as requested by boards and policymaking bodies. Constraints in meeting these short notice requests are occurring.

Contingent on available funding, the section will continue to analyze the impacts of, and provide information for, subsistence resource issues that may require regulatory actions due to shifting climates and food security. This includes continuing to coordinate efforts with other departments and agencies to assist in potential regulatory responses in their arenas as necessary.

The section continues to assist the Board of Game and Board of Fisheries as they further refine customary and

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traditional subsistence uses of Alaska's fish and wildlife, which includes updates to amounts reasonably necessary for subsistence (ANS) findings, especially for species with management concerns or allocation issues.

The section continues to contribute to the department's review and analysis of legal challenges, state and federal court cases, legislation, Endangered Species Act (ESA) listings, and Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) filings affecting customary and traditional uses of fish and wildlife resources by all Alaskans. This is an essential service, and the section has reprogrammed staff and funding from core services in order to provide a rapid response to data requests.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2021

The section anticipates the delivery of significant updates to research results on subsistence uses of Alaska's fish and wildlife, such as the Western Arctic Caribou Herd, from partnering with other divisions as well as partnership projects with other state and federal agencies.
