Department of Law Torts & Workers' Compensation Component Budget Summary

Component: Torts & Workers' Compensation

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Torts and Workers' Compensation Section provides legal defense and advice in a wide range of tort lawsuits filed against state agencies and state employees, including personal injury, wrongful death, professional malpractice, property damage, and civil rights claims. It also provides advice and training to state agencies and represents the state as an employer before the Alaska Workers' Compensation Board (AWCB) and the Alaska Workers' Compensation Appeals Commission.

Core Services

- Attorneys in the Torts and Workers' Compensation section defend tort claims and civil rights claims for damages under 42 USC §1983 filed in state and federal trial and appellate courts.
- Attorneys in the section represent state agencies in workers' compensation claims filed by state employees where
 the State of Alaska is the employer. They advocate on behalf of the state at hearings before the AWCB and
 represent the state as the employer in appeals from board decisions taken to the Alaska Workers' Compensation
 Appeals Commission and to the Alaska Supreme Court.
- Attorneys in the section advise the Department of Corrections on policy matters and represent it in inmate
 post-conviction relief and administrative disciplinary appeals in state court and inmate civil rights claims under 42
 USC §1983 filed in state and federal trial and appellate courts.
- Attorneys in the section provide advice and training to state agencies on risk management, workers' compensation, and liability issues and provide advice to state adjusters on workers' compensation issues.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2019

On behalf of the self-insured Division of Risk Management in the Department of Administration, the section pursues aggressive motion practice, trial, or negotiation to contain the ultimate costs of tort cases filed against the State of Alaska and its employees and of workers' compensation matters involving state employees. The section also pursues aggressive motion practice, trial or negotiation to contain costs associated with civil and administrative litigation filed by inmates against the Department of Corrections and its employees.

- Investigated and referred a workers' compensation case to the AWCB's fraud investigation unit, leading to a jury conviction of a former employee for defrauding the state out of more than \$250,000 in workers' compensation benefits and a two-year jail sentence. The fraud petition filed by the section with the AWCB is stayed pending appeal of the criminal felony fraud conviction and sentence.
- Defended the state as employer in numerous hearings before the AWCB and in appeals before the Alaska Workers' Compensation Appeals Commission, and participated in reemployment benefits hearings.
- Won an appeal in the Alaska Supreme Court affirming summary judgment and dismissal of civil rights lawsuit filed by several inmates claiming they were not receiving meals consistent with their religious beliefs.
- After years of briefing and remand from the Alaska Supreme Court, won dismissal of the third party allocation of fault claim against the state for alleged sexual assault of a minor. The case is on appeal to the Alaska Supreme Court and the parties are awaiting a decision.
- In 2016, the section won summary judgment of all claims against the state in an Alaska State Trooper excessive
 force/false arrest case in federal district court. In 2017, the Ninth Circuit affirmed dismissal of all claims except for
 the First Amendment retaliatory arrest claim. The United States Supreme Court recently granted review and
 issued a favorable decision, ruling that a First Amendment retaliatory arrest claim against arresting officers is not
 viable if the officers had probable cause to arrest.
- Won an appeal in the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals, affirming summary judgment and dismissal of a protracted construction contract dispute about the state's refusal to pay additional money for an asbestos abatement project

in 2007.

- Won summary judgment and dismissal of several medical and dental malpractice cases.
- The section briefed significant issues about the scope of discovery of confidential child protection, mental health, medical, and other records of third parties not directly involved in litigation, and protection of privacy interests.
- Prevailed on dispositive motions to dismiss or for summary judgment in a number of other cases, and obtained
 attorney fee awards as prevailing party. In addition, motions filed by the section assisted in settlement
 negotiations and in resolving cases on favorable terms. The section also succeeded in obtaining voluntary
 dismissal of numerous tort cases, in which the state paid nothing and each side assumed its own expenses.
- Provided training on civil law and liability to multiple training academies for correctional and probation officers, as
 well as to line supervisors and senior management at the Division of Juvenile Justice. The section also provided
 training for the state's independent workers' compensation adjusters.

Key Component Challenges

One key component challenge stems from the Alaska standard for summary judgment. Summary judgment is a useful tool for concluding civil litigation short of trial. However, Alaska law precludes the grant of summary judgment if there are any material issues in dispute. The court may not evaluate the overwhelming weight of the evidence in support of the motion, nor may it make credibility judgments even when the plaintiff's assertions as to material facts are unsubstantiated. The result is that where the court denies summary judgment, the section must consider the substantial cost of taking the case to trial in determining whether a settlement might be a more economical use of state resources.

Another continuing key challenge involves defending lawsuits brought by unrepresented plaintiffs. Because these cases take more time, a disproportionate amount of the section's resources is channeled to defending these lawsuits.

The section continues to deal with a high volume of matters referred for legal assistance from the Third-Party Administrator for the workers' compensation program of the Division of Risk Management. Keeping up with the workers' compensation caseload will likely remain a challenge.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2021

No significant changes are anticipated in the next fiscal year.
