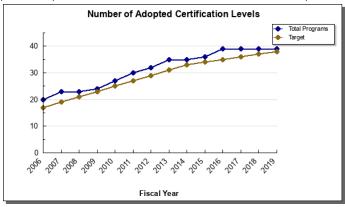

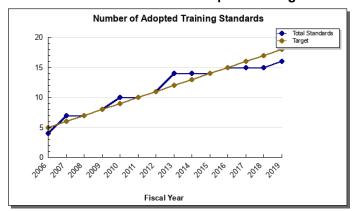

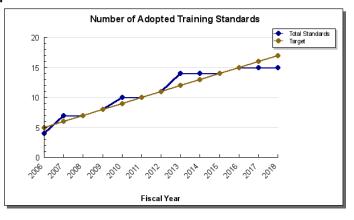

## Major Component Accomplishments in 2019

- Issued fire certification for 1,072 applicants
- Facilitated testing and certification for 144 separate examination groups.
- Tested 913 individuals for fire service professional qualification advancement
- Increased the access and functionality of statewide records management system for fire service web-based access to training, testing, and certification information.
- Maintained operational efficiencies through the expansion of paperless processing procedures.
- Supported 50 Alaska fire departments with local accreditation.
- The council held two general meetings during the fiscal year, as required under AS 18.70.340(b). (Note: These statistics are based on fiscal year data as opposed to the calendar year statistics presented in other publications.)

Utilization of a database management system enabled 100 percent processing of paperless issuance of all letters and certificates and reduced supply expenditures and administrative processing times. Other procedural developments have improved the council's ability to efficiently review and approve related standards and certification levels without the need for additional administrative personnel. The reduction of administrative costs and expansion of industry certification continues to be a core mission priority to increase professional development opportunities for fire service personnel.

## **Key Component Challenges**

Not all communities have a fire response department or volunteers; therefore, this service falls within the responsibility of the Village Public Safety Officers or Alaska State Troopers. A majority of communities outside a connected road system have limited fire response personnel, and many personnel are only able to participate in basic training activities at the local level. Many communities cannot complete training that qualifies for nationally recognized certification.

Fire departments in most Alaska communities have difficulty maintaining uniform performance standards. The public has a reasonable expectation that personnel responding to a call for emergency services are adequately trained to mitigate an emergency. Fire service responders should receive a level of training that enables them to operate in a manner that minimizes personal risk and helps to prevent fires in their communities.

State-established standards meet the needs and capability of Alaska communities, and often local fire and

emergency services personnel meet nationally recognized certification requirements. Compliance with the National Fire Protection Association professional standards is impossible in many areas of the state, especially in communities that do not have paid staff, fire hydrants or traditional fire apparatus. The Alaska Fire Standards Council (AFSC) has the authority to establish the minimum training and performance standards for certification of fire services personnel in these communities.

Ongoing challenges include maintaining compliance with the recurrent revisions to fire industry standards. Fire certification directives for Alaska fire service members require routine updates to maintain compliance with adopted fire standards. The operational workload for administrative staff exceeds its resource capability for all pending revisions and AFSC members and committee volunteers have donated countless hours to compensate for the lack of administrative support. Maintaining the professional development qualifications that are relevant to the needs of fire services personnel and their communities is a significant challenge.

The AFSC will continue to seek cost effective methods to increase fire certification opportunities that address local community needs and provide support to fire service organizations that have limited resources. The AFSC remains focused on maintaining and expanding certification programs that are current and relevant to fire service needs throughout Alaska.

## Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2021

In FY2021, the AFSC will endeavor to provide emergency responders support for core fire certification services, firefighter professional qualifications, and fire department accreditation. The AFSC will implement new electronic test process management initiatives and streamline services using a third-party high stakes test management resource. The Interagency Modular Portal for Alaska Certification and Training (IMPACT) records management system will continue to serve as a secure statewide repository for fire service personnel qualifications, fire training and fire department accreditation records that are accessible 24/7. Operational targets will reduce the complexity of the fire department accreditation process and increase efficiency between state fire training and certification testing; such as electronic course registration and/or certification application submission and a transition to online testing. Long-term outcomes are service outcomes that fulfill the mission of the AFSC, the completion of performance expectations for core delivery of services and sustaining critical professional qualification services to fire personnel throughout Alaska.

Council members will continue to collaborate with fire organizations and personnel across the state to ensure updates occur for existing programs and additional program development supports the needs of fire service staff and the communities they serve. Ongoing revision of AFSC directed policies and procedures will ensure the Bureau of Fire Accreditation, Standards and Training (BFAST) administrative functions are compliant with internationally recognized accreditation requirements, that program criteria are met, and that fire service professional development is maintained through certification program support.

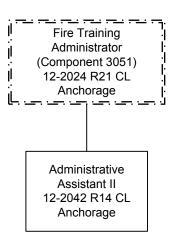
