This software will be funded 50% by marijuana licensing receipts and 50% by general funds to support the alcohol portion of the project.

A case management system is a critical component of a successful investigations unit; implementing an electronic database will increase the efficiency, accuracy, and speed in which AMCO investigations can be developed, monitored, and managed. The software will store case documents and digital evidence, which could include documents, video and audio recordings, and photographs. The case management system will also include reporting functionality.
